133rd ANNUAL REPORT

To the Members and friends of Manly Warringah District Cricket Club Inc:

The Management Committee has pleasure in submitting for your consideration the 133rd Annual Report and Financial Statement.

The Club entered teams in the five Sydney Cricket Association Grade competitions: the First Grade Limited Over & Twenty20 Competitions, Poidevin Gray and AW Green Shield Competitions.

WOW!

Season 2010-2011 will be recorded as a 'watershed' year in the long annals of our great Club both on and off the cricket field; a year of new beginnings and of history being created; a year to be celebrated by all.

I cannot over-emphasise the rarity of achieving premiership success in Sydney grade cricket. Prior to last season, it is a fact that Manly-Warringah District Cricket Club teams had won a mere 18 titles across all grades during its entire 132 year history. A truly remarkable day, Sunday April 4th 2011 saw Dave Farrell's team capture our first ever 5th Grade Premiership and, combined with Craig Little's 3rd Grade side's triumph, the very first occasion that two Manly teams had secured premierships in the one season – phenomenal!

The celebrations that followed will live long in everyone's memory. Congratulations to both teams, particularly so to skippers 'Bumper' Farrell and 'Jeannie' Little, both local juniors and both passionate supporters of the Club and cricket in general. Testament to their outstanding leadership qualities, both also received 'Captain of the Year' awards for their respective competitions at the annual Sydney Cricket Association awards presentation dinner.

'Super Sunday' was notable for several other reasons. Firstly, it was particularly pleasing to witness the elation and satisfaction on the faces of so many loyal members of the Manly Cricket 'family' present, many of whom that have made huge contributions to the Club, some over a very long period. These premierships belong to, and mean as much to these people as anyone, and just reward for their energy and sacrifice. No need for names, but a need to recognise you all - and say thank you.

Secondly, the day appropriately marked the end to the playing days of two great Club stalwarts, Matt Cranney and Adam Parkinson. It was befitting that their contributions over the past 20 &

19 years respectively, finished on such a high note. It would be remiss of me not to also acknowledge the retirement of another long term servant of the Club, Jamie Sullivan, who with wife Jude, and new baby moved to the Central Coast during the season. The Club wishes all three best wishes for the future – you are now officially legends.

Two others to be suitably rewarded were Club coaches Shawn Bradstreet and David Patterson, whose excellent work with players across all grades certainly helped lay the platform for these victories. Also moving on next year, the Club greatly appreciates the guidance provided by these two passionate Manly boys over the past few seasons.

A major contributing factor to the 5th Grade premiership was the realisation of the countless hours of work put in by the likes of Mike Pawley and Doug McGrath, and more recently by David Gainsford, into successfully developing the talents of our District's junior cricketers by providing a clear pathway from Saturday morning cricket to Junior Reps, then from synthetic to turf cricket, and eventually on to Grade cricket.

With great thanks to Warringah Cricket Club, the 'missing link' between junior cricket and Grade cricket was addressed at the beginning of the 2010-11 season with the inclusion of a Warringah team in the Sydney-wide Tim Creer Cup, as well as a side in the local MWCA Saturday afternoon competition. This permitted many juniors the opportunity to further their skills playing in men's competitions, whilst in the case of the Tim Creer players, gaining experience playing on turf pitches. Many such players gained promotion to Warringah lower grade sides during the season, joining other junior rep players, in turn, pushing for selection in 5th Grade at Manly.

The influx of junior players at Warringah CC went a long way towards providing their best results for several years, with all lower grades playing semi-final cricket, a Frank Gray Shield (U/21) premiership victory, and a significant leap up the Club Championship table. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Warringah President, Rory Wightley, and his committee for their support, as well as MWJCA President, Rob McKenna and Junior Rep Chairman, Ross Trewartha. We also thank Mike Pawley and Doug McGrath for their vision and continued support, and many others who have helped along the way – Simon Lyon, David Gardiner, Bruce Wickham, Greg Boyer to name but a few.

With moves afoot to further strengthen the ties for next season and beyond, it is important that we acknowledge the main catalyst behind the success of the 'pathway' – David Gainsford. For somebody who decided "to take a break from cricket" last season (poor Gina), a phenomenal effort 'Jughead'! You should feel very proud of your achievements, and again, the two premierships are as much yours as anyone else's.

The Club is served by an eclectic group of hardworking, loyal and passionate supporters – thus named 'the Committee'. Each and every member makes an outstanding effort, each and every year, in ensuring that the Manly-Warringah District Cricket Club not only maintains, but exceeds, its mantle as one of the leading clubs in Sydney Grade cricket. This year was no exception, with several individuals going far beyond any expectations.

Firstly, to Fiona Lyon, who rightfully was rewarded for her toil and enthusiasm over a number of years, in accepting the Keith Marks 'Clubman of the Year' award. Congratulations Fi!

Secondly, Joel Mason has quite simply been outstanding. His workload, as committee man, sponsorship manager, Gold Member manager, website manager.....somehow he also found time to be our 4th Grade skipper. Go figure. Thanks mate.

Thirdly, Ben King's initiative in creating what will become (I am sure) a long term relationship with Stewart House, proved to be a fantastic opportunity for our senior players to put something back into the wider community. We greatly look forward to furthering our support of this wonderful institution in coming seasons.

The Club is very mindful of the place we hold in the wider community. This season saw yet another successful T20 fundraising event hosted by the Club at Manly Oval, this time in conjunction with the Manly Warringah Sea Eagles, in support of the Queensland Flood Appeal. This evening came together in record time thanks to the wonderful efforts of Peter Peters and his staff, and our events guru Sean Rout.

2010-11 MWDCC PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This is my 7th Annual President's Report and it is a pleasure penning it on the 2010-11 season. It always seems easier to write when you taste success!

However, I have to admit, after the final day of the preliminary rounds of the SCA Competition, I felt very disappointed and very flat. The 1s had just lost against lowly Wests and missed the finals. I then witnessed 2s cruelly lose on the last ball in a heartbreaking end to the season at Manly Oval, just missing the finals by 1 point. Then we dropped to 8th in the Club Championship standings, just 120 points from a top 3 finish. Many of us were gutted as it was a season that had promised so much.

The positives were that 3s and 5s had made the finals with 3s finishing as minor premiers and the Fifth grade squad finishing an incredible 2nd with a very young side. We then just hoped and prayed that one of these teams could find a way to win a premiership.

Quarter-finals time and a wet weekend prevented a ball from being bowled in either match. So both teams were through to the semi finals as the highest placed sides.

In the semi finals, 3s won a very tight match v Sutherland at Manly Oval and 5s batted out of their skin to score over 300 v Gordon, then rolled them cheaply. All of a sudden, two weeks later, and we had two teams in grand finals and a genuine shot at history.

I was no longer disappointed. I was no longer flat. I was pumped, but also trying to conceal my excitement at the thought of doing something our Club had never achieved in our history – we had never won a 5th grade premiership and incredibly, we had NEVER won two grade premierships in the same season. We came so close in 2002 when 2s and 4s lost very close grand finals. I was skipper of the 4s that year and I can tell you it was a horrible feeling of disappointment back at the Club, after we lost both grand finals. We were then unfairly labelled as 'finals chokers' by some clubs. I couldn't bear the thought of experiencing that feeling again.

So if you wondered why the 'Prez' was so edgy during Grand Final weekend, now you know why!

Then it happened – Sunday 3 April is a day many of us will never forget. First it was the mighty 3s who took the title at Manly Oval after batting for a monumental 133 overs after being sent in on a wet deck.

Jeannie Little was finally rewarded for 3 years of hard toil. It was also a fitting farewell for "Parko" and "Loose" Cranney – both great mates, great Clubmen and both now MWDCC Premiership players. That victory by the 3s seemed easy, but it wasn't. They showed massive courage to firstly win their semi final, then the application shown by all the batsmen in the GF was just incredible. The statistical contributions in this match by Ryan Bonner, Scotty Patterson, 'Billy' Lindsay and Javed Badyari won't look like much on paper – but they were massive. A slow outfield, a wet deck and a very lively St George attack were what they had to overcome and they did so with aplomb. It was a well-deserved premiership for them. And didn't they love singing the victory song!

Then we all eagerly awaited the news, to see if 5s could hold on for our first ever premiership – I was getting ball by ball text messages as we counted down the tense final 10 overs of their grand final at Sydney Uni #1 v Easts. And they did it, largely courtesy of a breakthrough innings from Louis Anderson who batted for 90 minutes under the most intense pressure imaginable. They recorded history & Dave Farrell's boys won our first ever 5th grade comp and remarkably, with only one player aged over 19!

Wow, that win was just so significant in so many ways for 5ths. In 2006, for the second time in 6 seasons, we came dead last in 20th place in 5th grade. The reason for this? Simple, no home ground & no real focus on a junior development program. We had to address this. And we did!

Despite battling for 25 years to secure a home oval for 5s, the Club then pulled out all stops to ensure we expedited the construction of a home ground at Curl Curl – 2 years later, Mike Pawley Oval was opened. Then enter Dougy McGrath & Mick Pawley with the inception of the Manly Warringah Junior Academy. Its legacy has been continued by a wonderful team of people supporting Dougy and Mick since its inception.

So five years after we finished last, we win a premiership with many of the players in the 5ths a product of the Academy. Woo hoo!.....Manly had finally destroyed the choker's tag – I believe this season was a turning point in our Club's history.

Needless to say, the celebrations back at the Club were sensational.

The experienced boys in 3s were in fine form. As we all know, the shy boys in 5s don't have a habit of utilising the "showers" after a hot day in the field. But when it came to honouring the Manly

tradition of a nude premierships lap of Manly Oval, I'm pleased to say that all of a sudden, they were not so shy & joined in the history. Even the Pommy 'Prowsey' joined in the action from the scoreboard end!

So from feeling very deflated after the last round of the season, I write this as one extremely proud President of a Club that has just created a part of history that many of us thought we may never get to see – thanks to the mighty wins by 3s and 5s!

As I said on the night of the GF – these premierships are a just reward for not only the players – but for everyone involved with the Club. The success has been a collective effort from the coaches, captains, players, managers, supporters, wives, girlfriends, parents and our administrators.

I would like to thank my Committee which has just been outstanding this season, namely Deputy President and Chairman of Selectors Simon 'Cliffy' Lyon, Treasurer Fiona Lyon, Hon Secretary Ross Wiblin, Dave Gainsford, Allan Wright, Dave Gardner, Ben King, Joel Mason, Doug McGrath, Bruce Wickham, Langdon Gould. A wonderful group of volunteers!

Ross and Kingy are stepping down, so I thank them for their toil over the past few years. Ross' contribution as the Club's Secretary over the past three years has been extraordinary and we will miss his input.

Speaking of great volunteers, our scorers Geoff Rogers, Gordon Currie & Donny Dollars, your efforts week in week out, year after year are amazing. Thanks guys!

I also want to make special mention of Tim Blank & Katinga Schroeder for their brilliant work on the inaugural MWDC Business Lunch which raised over \$24k for our Club – what a mighty effort & I recommend everyone get there on Nov 11 for Luncheon # 2 – it will be bigger & better!

To our coaches Shawn Bradstreet & David Patterson – I felt the two lower grade premierships was a fitting reward for your great toil over the past 3 years – we will miss you guys, but please feel satisfied with your incredible contribution to MWDC. Patto is off to Canada to live, so we wish him and his family well over there.

We welcome on board Dean Gilchrist as our new Club Coach. Dean is a Level 3 coach, brother of Adam, and will be a tremendous new asset for us next season. His Assistant is Brett Penprase who we also welcome on board.

To Jason Avedissian of the Manly Daily who has moved on. We thank 'Dizzy' for all his coverage

over recent years and best wishes in your new role at News Ltd. Experienced journalist Jon Geddes is his replacement at the Daily.

To each of the Captains, thanks for the time you all allocated to your respective roles: Adam Crosthwaite (1s), Ben King/Mitch Cleary (2s), Joel Mason/Rowley Alexander (4s) & of course our Premiership Captains Craig 'Jeannie' Little (3s) & Dave Farrell (5s).

Jeannie and Dave fittingly won SCA Captain of the Year awards, so congratulations to them.

To Crossy, congrats to the 1st grade boys who were T-20 quarter finalists and 1st grade One Day grand finalists & with a little luck could have won that. Although I am sure the boys will be the first to admit that they probably 'under-achieved' this season. By now, everyone will be aware that Crossy has decided to pursue an opportunity in South Australia and he will be a big loss. But I'd like to thank him for his input as skipper over the past 2 years. TREASURER'S REPORT

YEAR ENDED 30th APRIL 2011

I have pleasure in presenting the Special Purpose Financial Report for the Manly Warringah District Cricket Club ("the Club").

Several key factors have enabled the Club to remain in a positive financial position this year, including the following:

- The continued support of all our sponsors;
- The support of all of our individual player sponsors – this year, 5 players across the grades were sponsored;
- The growth of the Gold Member scheme for non-playing members;
- The various grants provided to grade clubs by Cricket Australia and Cricket NSW;
- Last, but not least, the highly successful Ashes lunch at Cockle Bay Wharf in the city in November 2010 was our major fundraiser for the year. No doubt this has been mentioned elsewhere in the Annual Report but it was a huge boost to the Club's finances.

The Club has also continued to invest in the Club's players through the provision of quality coaching staff led by Shawn Bradstreet & David Patterson. The calibre of their coaching was evident in the 3rd & 5th grade premierships wins. I am certain their outstanding work will continue under the guidance of our new coaching team of Dean Gilchrist & Brett Penprase.

Each year, the balance of the cash at bank grows healthier. We now have significant funds in an interest-bearing account for the first time in the past few years (thanks to the Ashes lunch).

Net assets are also continuing to increase. All year-end creditors have been paid as at today's date; however, there are still outstanding debtors of \$19,290, of which \$16,500 relates to the Cricket Australia General Grant and \$300 in outstanding player fees.

Looking forward to the 2011/12 season, it would be of great benefit to the Club's financial position if everyone associated with the Club – sponsors, players, supporters, etc – continue to support the various fundraising initiatives held throughout the year. In particular, we would welcome your support at this year's lunch in the city in November 2011.

Many thanks to my Assistant Treasurer, Bruce – it was his first year in the role and I really appreciated his assistance & support throughout the year. I would also like to thank all of my helpers in the canteen – I could not do this other role without your help in collecting rolls from the bakery, chopping watermelons, dissecting roast chickens, driving me to pick up supplies (or to take me to away games) or looking after the canteen when I am getting fresh stuff for lunch or tea or simply having a weekend away! Also, many thanks to those of you who kept me informed regularly via sms for the four days of the last two games of the season when I was not at Manly Oval.

Finally, I just wanted to take this opportunity to thank you all again for bestowing the Club's greatest honour on me at the presentation night in April. The Keith Marks Memorial Trophy is such a prestigious award and, as I said in my email to you all the following day (having been rendered speechless on the night!), it is the biggest honour I have received in my life.

(a) Basis of Accounting

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW). The committee has determined that the Club is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the following Australian Accounting Standards:

No other Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report is also prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(b) Clubhouse equipment

Clubhouse equipment is primarily made up of covers, nets, bowling machines, together with improvements to the RATT at Manly Oval which are included at cost. They are depreciated at a rate estimated to write off the cost of those assets over their estimated useful life. Items of equipment such as balls are expensed in the year of purchase.

(c) Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Inventories are primarily made up of shirts, caps and other miscellaneous items.

(d) Leasehold improvements

There were no further costs incurred this year by Manly Warringah District Cricket Club and Warringah Cricket Club on the upgrade of the facilities at Mike Pawley Oval.

Where do I start to review the season, Manly 5th Grade 2010/11?

The fact is, the team became the first from Manly to capture the "David Sherwood" Trophy in our proud history, something the District and club should be very proud of.

That sunny early April day when 11 cricketer's from the Northern Beaches hung on for a famous victory, will remain etched in the players memories for the rest of their lives and recorded in history, as the day that boys became men and overcame all the odds.

It's very important to start the season in winning ways, to give yourselves a chance of Semi Final cricket later on. 5th Grade did just that, managing 6 wins from the first 7 games, to sit 2nd on the ladder. Steff James came to the club from 'Blighty' via Manly Hospital where he was working. The "Doctor" was all class at the crease, scoring 49, 57no and 45, before he was picked up by 4th Grade. Steff's elegance on the cricket field was matched by his friendly nature off it. Top cricketer, top bloke, and welcome back anytime.

Vinnie Rehaan came down from 4's an angry man. He took his frustration out on the UNSW bowling in Round 7. Opening the batting in a one dayer, Vinnie compiled a stylish, sometimes brutal, 73. Work commitments would hamper Vinnie's cricket towards the end of the season.

Adam Gummer played the first 5 rounds in 5th Grade, becoming a leader in the team and captaining his last game against Randy Petes (which we won). Gumm's stats could not be ignored and he was lost to higher grades, becoming a Premier in Genies 3rd Grade team. Runs were shared between **Matt Butcher (96)**, **Tom Kaye (45)** & **Louis Anderson (32)**, with only 4 bowlers used (all grabbing wickets), we now found ourselves in the Final with a great chance to win the Premiership.

- Losing early wickets to be 6 for 55, still with lots of overs to bat. Could this be happening

Pre-season discussions of this team emphasised the future rather than the present. All players were available again in 2011-12 whilst half the team had another four seasons at this level. The emphasis on potential alone soon changed after some early performances where the boys turned in some outstanding fielding exhibitions and batted very well.

By the end of the season, however, thoughts had returned to the future and potential as several on-going weaknesses were revealed. Primarily, we lacked the necessary depth in batting and needed another two reliable batsmen in the line-up. Secondly, we coped badly with the 20/20 format and though it is absurd to combine both 50/50 and 20/20 in the same competition at this level, this is an area that needs a great deal of thought.

The greatest strength of the team was its attack. Matt Mee, Matt Alexander and Nick McLachlan proved a handful for most oppositions, particularly in the 50/50 format. They were well supported on occasions by Michael Visser, Reece Hodge and Ashdeep Viridi.

Generally, the fielding was very, very good – always the sign of a good team as opposed to a collection of good players. Catching was at times brilliant, always sound; energy, enthusiasm and mobility always exciting; whilst some of the throwing was outstanding. The boys worked hard to achieve these standards and were always led and inspired by the efficient work of Sam Webber behind the stumps and Javed Badyari in the in-field.

Logan Weston played some outstanding innings, though I am still not fully convinced by his preference to open the batting. Adam Gummer supported him and put pressure on the opposition. Jarrod Walter had great responsibility placed upon him and scored useful runs. Ian Prowse played a

brilliant innings and Javed Badyari usually did his job well. Javed is such a vibrant and important all-round team member, and, if his batting and/or bowling can consistently reach his magnificent fielding standards, he will become a really outstanding cricketer.

Following Badyari came the bowlers. Matt Alexander can become a fine batsman in his own right; Matt Mee also shows signs of batting ability though few runs; Nick McLachlan always showed enthusiasm and aggression; Reece Hodge has potential with the bat; Dylan Marshall has ability, yet has to come to terms with what batting is all about. Sam Webber was the best of the non-specialist batsmen and was probably under-utilised which will not happen again next season. All of these players contributed at times, but we asked too much of the tail.

Other batsmen used on occasions were Mitchell Pugh and Louie Anderson but had limited opportunity.

Jarrod Walter did an excellent job as captain. It is easy to identify errors in field placement and bowling changes on occasions, but, considering the lack of experience amongst boys of this age, he did well. His team was generally a happy and unified one which gave its all, recognised when it had not played to its optimum, and was quite rightly hurt and disappointed by less than its best.

But, in retrospect, it was another vital phase in the cricket education of these young men. They should have learnt a great deal and they should be looking forward to next Poidevin-Gray season.

Finally, despite the disappointments, time and distance involved, Mike Pawley and I enjoyed our association with the Poidevin-Gray boys, though, unless you have done it, few begin to realise the pressures involved.
