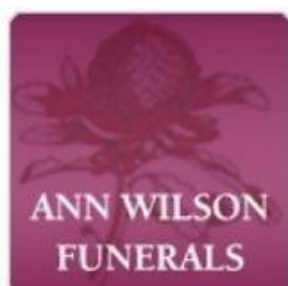

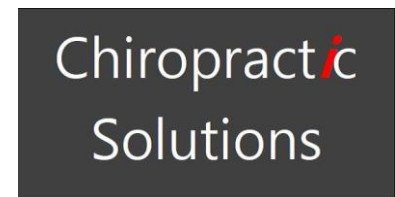

Presidents Report

At the annual presentation dinner, Jamien Zimmerman, CEO of our major sponsor Travelsim, said.... “It is very important for you all to take some time to reflect on your incredible success of 2014/15, so as to fully appreciate your achievements and how you got there.”

So after the euphoria of our success and celebrations, I heeded his advice and did take some time out to reflect. Jamien was right!

It took me back 37 years and made me realise how far we have come since I joined the club as a 14 year old, in a period when Manly were really struggling. I realised our success has created history and is the result of a collective effort from some great people on and off the field – and the culmination of many years of hard work!

So I’d like to share some of my thoughts on this incredible journey so far.

I was fortunate to make my grade debut for Manly in 4th grade, way back in 1978. It was a real tough time for the club over the next decade, until we finally broke a 13 year premiership drought, going through undefeated to win the 3rd grade comp, captained by Gary Flowers in 1988. I will never forget the feeling of winning that grand-final at Manly Oval, playing with some guys who have turned out to be lifelong friends, including Gary and David Gainsford.

This premiership success, instilled a newfound belief in everyone at the club. It began what we referred to at the time as the “golden era” of the club. The following season in 1988/89, we won the Club Championship and Greg Bush led 1st grade to a premiership - we won 2nd grade the next season and the club also went on two overseas tours, to Asia and the UK.

The club was on a roll – but things then changed! Who would have thought that we would have to wait 26 years, to win another 1st grade title?

A Green Shield title in 1992 (of which the late great Bobby Lind was Coach!) was to be our only other success

during the 90s and we would have to wait 15 long years to win another grade premiership. This was courtesy of John Warn’s 3rd grade team in 2005. It was like history repeating itself again. Just like in 1988 when 3rd grade broke the drought, there was a winning belief at the club, when Warny’s team won.

And thus begun Manly’s winning culture of the past decade.

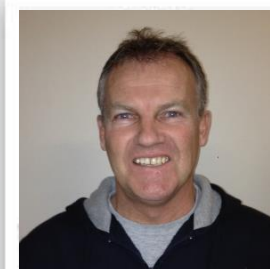
The golden era of the late 80s, has now finally been surpassed and season 2014/15 has now seen us re-write the history books at MWDCC!

In fact, during my reflection, I realised the club has won ten (10) of its 41 titles, in the past ten years – that’s almost 25% of all our trophies in the last decade, namely:

- Club Championship x 3: 2005/06, 2011/12, 2014/15
- 1st Grade x 3: 2005/06 (L/O), 2009/10 (T-20), 2014/15
- 3rd Grade x 3: 2004/05, 2010/11, 2014/15
- 5th Grade x1: 2010/11

And as you can see from the stats above, results like this just don’t happen. It has taken years of planning, implementing and hard work, from many, many wonderful people associated with our great club, throughout this period.

This is now undoubtedly the most successful period in our Club’s 137 year history and you are now all part of the club’s new ‘golden era.’



We have been threatening for many years to have a season like 2014/15, but due to a variety of factors and a lack of luck, it has never happened – until now!

We made the finals of all 9 of the SCA's competitions, where we have set a new benchmark – take a look at these performances:

- Club Champions (winning by a record 212 points!)
- 1st Grade Minor Premiers
- 1st Grade Premiers
- 1st Grade Limited Overs Grand Finalists
- 1st Grade T-20 Quarter Finalists
- 2nd Grade Grand Finalists
- 3rd Grade Premiers
- 4th Grade Minor Premiers, Semi Finalists
- 5th Grade Grand Finalists
- Poidevin Gray (Under 21) Quarter Finalists
- Green Shield (Under 16) Semi Finalists

So a massive congratulations to everyone in the playing group – you have all just been incredible this season and deserve all this success and your Club Champs baggy caps.

It is important to state, that our success this season has been built on a program of developing our local juniors - and the stats don't lie on this one:

- Of the 58 players who played in the finals, 50 of them were local juniors
- Every player in our 3rd grade premiership team was a local junior!
- The average age of the playing group was just 22.9
- Of the 88 matches that were contested towards Club Champs points, we only lost 13 of these – I'm advised our 1575 points is the most Club champ pts ever accumulated!

Cast your mind back 10 years when Mick Pawley and Doug McGrath put the first steps of our Junior Development program in place, where 12 year olds were invited to play against grown men

in the park competition. It certainly raised some eyebrows and had its fair share of critics, but the Club fully embraced Mick's initiative and so began the 'pathway' journey.

Five years later, Greg Boyer and David Gainsford continued developing the evolution of this initiative. They were instrumental in nurturing the successful "Manly-Warringah Pathway Program," that now sees us the envy of all other associations, as our relationships with our partners at MWCA, MWJCA and Warringah Shires continue to get stronger each year.

Greg has now stepped down from the committee and passed the baton to Ross Denny. Greg has put his heart & soul into the Pathway over the past 5 years and he should feel very proud that he has played such an integral role and is part of this amazing legacy that continues to grow. Thanks Butch!

Reflection over, now to some thank you's!

Even through your own battles and the sad loss of your beautiful mum Jill, you continued to pour so much time into the club, in particular the juniors. The Green Shield boys are very fortunate to have your wisdom. And I am very fortunate to have you as Deputy President and close friend!

A newcomer to the committee this year was Adam Gummer. His contribution in his debut year has just been outstanding and despite being a redhead, he's definitely a future leader of this Club!

Thanks also to Bossy, Langdon and NSW Chairman John Warn for your respective contributions. John is doing an epic job in his role with NSW.

Secretary's Report

To the wider cricket community involved with Manly Warringah District Cricket Club, the Committee has the pleasure in submitting the 137th Annual Report, including the financial statements, covering the 2014/15 cricket season.

The club entered teams in the five Sydney Grade competitions, along with the First Grade Limited Overs and T-20 competitions, the Poidevin-Gray and AW Green Shield competitions.

This is the same opening as last year's report. But the synopsis of the two years is quite different.

In 2014/15 the MWDCC celebrated a marvelous performance on the park by winning the coveted Club Championship, the Belvidere Cup for the 1st grade competition and the Mitchell Cup for the 3rd grade competition.

As Andrew has detailed in his President's report every team we put on the park participated in the final series, competing in 5 Grand Finals – including the narrow loss in the 1st grade limited over competition.

The playing group and the coaches have etched their names into MWDCC history.

We had a number of champagne performances in the 2014/15 season:

- 19 Centuries (in 2013/14 : 24 centuries , 2012/13 - 9 centuries)
- 18 Five wicket hauls (in 2013/14 : 23 times , 2012/13 – 11 times)
- Ahillen Beadle won the O'Reilly Medal
- Jack Ritchie won the Benaud medal
- Nick McLachlan was the leading wicket taker in First Grade
- Adam Crosthwaite broke the club record for the most runs in a season.
- Ahillen Beadle (c), Adam Crosthwaite and Nick McLachlan were named in the SCA team of the year.

- Aiden Bariol was named in the combined Green Shield team of the year.
- Shawn Bradstreet won the SCA coach of the year.
- Peter Garlick the SCA scorer of the year.
- And to top it all off Steve O'Keefe was awarded the highest honour of representing Australia.

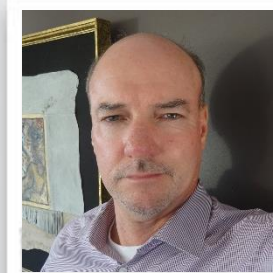

Captaining a Grade Cricket team takes more than is seen from the outside. The club had a gifted and very talented group of leaders. These guys need to manage weekly selections, coordinate off field support, arrange catering, be role models, be key contributors on the field and walk the fine line of disciplinarian, motivator and at times emotional guardian. It was a pleasure to work with every one of the captains. In easy words, you all delivered in truckloads!



The same applies to our Club Captains Joel Mason and Jarrod Walter, ensuring the club was a great place to be around.

Chris Hynes, as Chairman of Selectors plays a key role with captains and coaches ensuring we have the best teams on the park week in, week out. Often left with the tough discussion on player selection Chris handles these professionally, and is a great asset to the playing group.

Winning a Club Championship requires the players, captains, coaches and chairman of selectors unified and driving towards the success of the whole group for the whole season.

Our future looks bright. The AW Green Shield and Poidevin-Gray sides showed solid improvement in 2014/15 and the Manly Warringah area has a remarkable array of junior talent. The following is an extract from the DCA (Rep Teams) report:

From an overall Manly perspective with our 12 rep teams:

- 6 minor premierships (2 DCA, 4 Pres Cup)
- 6 home grand final appearances (2 DCA, 4 Pres Cup)
- 4 Manly premierships (1 DCA, 3 Pres Cup)

In addition to the above, Manly was confirmed as overall winners of the Presidents Cup for 2014/15. This is essentially the "Club Championship".

Manly's U/15 side were undefeated in winning the Weblin Shield.

The Manly Warringah area boasts no fewer than 8 players representing NSW in age group teams, including Saskia Horley selected in the Breakers (Womens) sides.

Off the field the club also measured up in 2014/15.

As I mentioned in the report last year it is pleasure to be part of the MWDCC committee. The challenge to the committee in 2015/16 will be to ensure a framework and mindset is in place to stay ahead of the pack. There is a great opportunity to keep building.

In 2014/15 we built a new training facility at L M Graham Reserve. This could only be achieved with the financial support of the State Government, Manly Council and Cricket NSW. The new facility is first class and will be central in improving our performance in future seasons. Our Club patrons have been instrumental in delivering this facility and many thanks go to our Premier and local MP Mike Baird and Mayor Jean Hay.

Even with the capital expenditure of the new training facility the club's 2014/15 financial position is extremely sound, and in no small way due to the work of Scott McLachlan. Even the most onerous of tasks are handled efficiently and effectively.

The committee boasted 3 active players in 2014/15 with Adam Gummer (Events Manager) and Corrie Boss (Community Manager) joining our Commercial and Communications Manager extraordinaire Joel Mason. This is the lifeblood of the club and it was wonderful seeing the hard work these guys contributed along with much needed younger ideas and a 'player perspective'.

We look forward to expanding this group in the future.

To the whole committee, many thanks for all the hard work.

The committee is but a small number of the volunteers needed to run a senior sporting club. We have an incredible group of individuals who put their hand up week in, week out to ensure the club is functional.

And finally all bases covered when you add Todd Darvall, our throwing coach to the group. Todd was awesome and the enthusiasm the players showed was clear resulting in the throwing techniques improving markedly.

Again the training sessions were well attended by the players throughout the season evidenced by our on field performances.

We'd like to pay special tribute to all of our captains for their efforts during the season. Strong leadership is without doubt the cornerstone of success and we were blessed to have such a quality group of leaders.

The final results speak for themselves;

- 5 Grand Final appearances (1st Grade, 1st Grade Limited Overs, 2nd Grade, 3rd Grade and 5th Grade)
- 2 Semi Final appearances (4th Grade and Green Shield)
- 2 Quarter Final appearance (1st Grade T20, Poidevin Gray)

We are obviously extremely pleased with these results however we are particularly proud of the players and how hard they worked all season to achieve these results, well done boys!!

1st Grade replicated the previous season of reaching the play offs in all three forms. This time though they walked away with the biggest prize of all, the Belvidere Cup! They also finished as Minor Premiers in the two day competition, runners-up in the One Day Competition plus Quarter Finalists in the T20 Competition. What a season!!

2nd Grade turned things around massively and were clearly our most improved grade. Firstly, congratulations to Sydney University who won the 2nd Grade competition for the 4th year in a row.

Secondly, honey I think we need to check my blood pressure!

Surely signing up to captain this year's 2nd grade couldn't be all that time consuming. After all my work commitments had ramped down this year (hadn't they?). I promised Wing I'd be at training once a week, a seemingly tall order right from the start. In any case I assured Wing that come whatever may, it was my duty to get the great team to the Grand Finals this year and push some of the younger men up into 1st grade battle.

Above all I felt a strong urge to give back to the younger generation coming through a help navigate through the painstakingly difficult challenges that grade cricket present before you.

With the ground sodden, our hopes and dreams of runs and wickets aplenty were soggy until the following day when the sky's opened up to reveal a ground requiring a lot of work. But to Uni's credit we got on around 10.30am on Sunday (having lost Saturday and still to play Monday). We lost the toss and were sent to the field. Things were going to plan at 1-3, 2-51, 3-51 at lunch, then 4-90, 5-112, 6-147, 7-188 and then 8-201. It was on reflection however that this was the turning point in the game. We needed to rocket the students out for less than 220 to give ourselves plenty of time to dig in and beat the rain due Monday afternoon. Sydney Uni however put on 123 for the 9th wicket which killed us. We fought on gallantly, but they batted brilliantly. It's great to have such a supportive network around me and one that you can constantly bounce ideas off.

Steve Beatty, Chris Hynes and the other committee members, thanks too for your support. Your work is tireless but substantial and without peer. Frase it is a credit to yourself that you beat the monster you were grappling with last year. It is amazing to me that you can stand up after this as a leader and find your strongest year ever. Wow, what an inspiration you are to so many!

To Timmy and First Grade, congrats on a fine season, you came back from disappointment last year and went the extra distance this year. Good on you guys

for sticking it to the comp, and showing how good we really are!

Wazza, fourth grade Captain of which I've played so many games with over the years, congrats to you also mate on winning your first GF after four thousand years of grade cricket. You deserve to gloat finally. And to the other captains, JP and Waddo a shame we missed out boys but bloody hell we made the other guys look good didn't we?

I can honestly say there is no better run cricket club that I have seen or been involved with. We should all be proud to be a part of something so special.

To my wife Caroline (Billy Darcy is under the impression she watches re-runs of my cover drive in slow mo in her spare time) and family whom support my dreams and ambitions. Without your support I don't get to play cricket the way I do. Thank you for allowing me the chance to forge some pretty special relationships with those that played 2nd grade this year, I am richer because of it.

One final thought to leave you with. It's easy to take the credit as captain for turning around 2nd grade this year when the results are so tangible but really the season was driven by a collective team effort. It is our challenge in 2nd grade next year to adopt and play a tough brand of cricket. A brand of cricket that Sydney University showed us how to play which is the next level up. 2014/15 Mitchell Cup Premiers

3rd grade won their third premiership in the past 11 seasons following an unforgettable year for the whole club. After finishing in third place despite losing just two games all season we finished the year in triumph, having relatively comfortable wins throughout the finals series.

We started the year with our worst cricket but gradually built it up and by the season's end there was no way we were finishing anywhere other than first. Rd 1 v Syd Uni saw us amass a formidable 4 dec 301 on the back of Rawlings' huge 169no but at tea, day two, Syd Uni were 1/150 and cruising. A well timed blow up from coach Bradstreet saw us lift our game and we knocked them off for a close win. In Rd 2 v Blacktown we managed just a draw and when we lost to Eastern Suburbs in rd 4 I thought we needed a big lift to figure at year end.

From the Rd 6 v Western Suburbs game onward we continued to improve, remaining unbeaten for all one day games and losing just one close game v Sutherland in an understrength side.

Our strength this year was the same as the four other grades – we had very good cricketers for the grade they were playing in. More on individuals soon but any 3rd grade team that has the likes of Jarrod Rawlings, Adam Gummer, Jordan Daly, Luke Grant and Ryan Farrell in it is not going to lose many games. Others had breakthrough seasons as well with Jake Carden, Aiden Bariol and Tom Kaye all providing massive all round strength.

As this is my first two day premiership for the club in 28 years of trying (there have been at least 5 sides that should have won in this period) I reckon the key points to winning were:-

- Having good all-rounders (3 true ones - Kaye, Carden, Farrell and with a bit of work on his batting, Grant).
- Batting deep (8/112 to 190 for a bonus point win v Fairfield, 7/104 to 221 v UNSW, 7/170 to 289 in Semi).
- Taking the chances in the slips (Daly and Farrell hardly dropped a thing).
- Bowling deep (having choice from 5 quicks plus 2 spinners gives plenty of combinations).
- Enthusiasm at training – the coaches did a huge job here.

This team was full of intelligent cricketers that made my job a lot easier. At times there would be crossed wires, different viewpoints and this led to some tension but as discussed with one of the boys during the season, this is good for creativity. Not that we needed to be creative this year as we comfortably won the majority of our games doing the basics well. And what else can you do?

We had youth on our side as well. Aiden Bariol came into our side as a 14 year old and did a remarkable job behind the stumps. His batting shows enormous promise as well. Jake Carden is another young guy who has had two seasons with MWDC for two Grand Finals. Hopefully this success is ingrained into the young blokes and they want to repeat it year after year and in turn pass it on over the years to the next batch of youngsters.

Before I go on and talk about the players I think the coaches deserve top billing for the way they went about things. Shawn and Phil did a remarkable job this year. Last season they managed to get four teams into the finals but no premierships. Not a bad start. It was obvious they knew their stuff – they recognised our weaknesses from last year to ensure we



addressed them adequately to turn it into at least a club championship. We lapped the field in this quest. Next was to prepare teams for winning in the finals. Some could say with pretty good empirical support that MWDCC did not save their best for the finals over the years. A different story this year with two premierships the result.

The organisation at training, the options presented to every player, every week, and the guidance available ensured everyone was enthusiastic at the trainings and working on things that needed it. Gone are the days of a 10 min bat followed by a chat and out of there. Instead we all put in for a couple of hours twice a week and this is what gave us the results.

On top of this organisational aspect Shawn and Phil also provided appropriate measures of discipline, motivation, strategy and tactics to ensure they got the best out of everyone. I will go as far to say these blokes are the best in the world at what they do.

Our team, in Grand Final batting order followed by the blokes who were unlucky to not get selected in this side but made contributions during the season is:-

Jarrold Rawlings

Over 650 grade runs, 267 of them at 67 in thirds. Ralph started the year in 3rds scoring 169no and finished the year in 3s for not quite so many. He had a taste of 1st grade and can consider himself very unlucky to be dropped back to 3s. He dominated the early season in 3rds and it was always a surprise whenever he got out as he looked so comfortable. A breakthrough season scoring two centuries and many more should follow.

Adam Gummer

A very consistent performer who loved to think about the game and provide great ideas. An average of 30 in 3rds on an often bowler friendly deck at Grahame's is a solid season. Should look to score more half centuries as he often got a start but did not stay in for a huge one except for his 115no v Nth Sydney. Scored invaluable runs on a filthy pitch v Penrith and chipped in with the ball on a couple of occasions with his more than useful finger spinners.

Tom Kaye

Another consistent performer scoring over 500 runs for the season. Like Adam he often got going but got out just as he was about to look impregnable. A range of full tosses and half trackers often brought him undone after doing the hard work. He enjoyed the opening position and should look to confirm this over the next year or two. Tom came with a new approach this year and this showed in his game. Always full of energy and ideas in the field he finally got a bowl in Rd 5 and proved to be a very consistent out swing bowler who managed a fantastic strike rate of a wicket every 25 balls.

Ryan Farrell

Started grade cricket as leggie, transformed into a solid bat and has thankfully made his way now into genuine all-rounder class. Firstly, his leggies were fantastic. Enjoying a long bowl in rd 1 where he won the game for us Ryan bowled beautifully whenever given the opportunity in 3rd grade. This wasn't that often as the meds cleaned up most teams. Having him ready to go was a massive bonus. The longer his spells go, the better he bowls. His batting was excellent. Unlucky not to score three centuries this year he was probably wondering what on earth was happening with some of his selections. Played as correctly as anyone, keeps the ball on the deck and he should be a huge run scorer for years to



come. Possesses probably the strongest throwing arm in the club and did slips very well.

Jordan Daly

Hard to believe Jordan played most of the year in 3rd grade. This is a real indicator to the clubs depth. A very consistent performer in 3rd grade punching out reliable runs, especially when it mattered. Scored a match winning 40 in the low scoring GF and also ensured comfortable wins v Gordon and Wests when it briefly could have gone either way. Took 16 catches in 3rds, all at 1st slip. Practiced this aspect of his game well and was always a voice behind the stumps keeping things ticking over when a bit of silence crept into our play. He will be a bit disappointed he didn't smash a few centuries but he will make up for this next season.

Ed Burgess

Another bloke who was up and down the grades, possible wondering what was going on. Doing it too easily in 4th grade he deserved to come up earlier but we were ensuring semi-final options for all grades. Flicked to 2nd grade for a game, scores a 60, back to 4s, scores a century. Finally finds his place in 3rds finals team and scores a match winning 65 in a low scoring game v Hawkesbury in the QF. Full of energy, loves to have a chat to the opposition's best player to see what needs to be done to disturb them and all up invaluable to our success this season.

Jake Carden

After having success in 5ths last year Jake was ready to move through the grades. Took a little while to find his feet in 3rds but we were always looking to get him in the side because you could just tell he was going to deliver for us sometime soon. Scored valuable runs v Penrith on a sticky wicket then took a cheap bag of wickets against them and this gave him confidence. Hits the pitch on a terrific length and attacked the stumps.

Finally got the big reward in the semi-final, demolishing Syd Uni on a flat track taking 6/20. Did not score the runs he is capable of and actually looked his best in the GF v Easts before retiring hurt. Once the runs flow for him next season he will be a potent all-rounder up the grades.

Aiden Bariol

Entered the team as a 14yo when James Boyer went back to 5ths to work on his batting. Was this going to be a weakness in 3rd grades armour? No way! Took 4 catches and a stumping in his first game and looked the goods behind the stumps each game. His batting was at times inconsistent but that will be the case with someone so young. Batted superbly for us in the semi-final delivering a valuable 80 run partnership with Ryan Farrell and then backed this up again in the Grand Final coming in at effectively 6 /70 still needing 43 to win and he batted beautifully to ensure a comfortable win. I'd like to think Aiden will work his way up the order next season, allowing him to develop into a heavy run scorer.

Luke Grant

Luke was another bloke who performed consistently in 2nd grade before being dropped. He did not let this get in the way of his enthusiasm and effort. Loved to be involved, his fielding was magnificent (must have been those Thursday sessions) and he did a great job with the ball, taking 30 wickets for the season. Moves the ball around and a very clever bowler. We all know LG is a top class bat but lost his way mid-season before getting back some form with a fine half century when in trouble v UNSW and valuable runs in the SF and hit the winning runs in the GF. I love having Luke in my sides as I know I will always get 100% effort from someone who is better than 3rd grade.

Warren Evans

This is the first time I have written anything about myself. Hey, just won my first comp in 28 years so thought, why not? Tried not to get too involved as I knew there were blokes 25 years younger than me willing to do the job. When I did, I bowled a consistent line and length with a bit of nibble, blew up about 3 times and really appreciated the great ideas coming from just about everybody in the team. My batting was a little inconsistent, strangely enough got my two top scores in the two games we lost. Good for 25 wickets at 15 and 150 runs at 15 next year.

Nick McCallum-Toomey

The first three quarters of the season was consistent from Nick, taking regular, new ball wickets, handling 2nd grade in his couple of appearances and doing what we wanted. Really found another gear as the finals approached. Went through Penrith's top order then took 17 wickets during the finals series. Worked up good pace in the Semi on a flat track at North Syd #2 and this augurs well for next year. Gets good away swing which, in the one dayers, sometimes meant he was a bit scrappy in the opening overs so maybe a first change bowler in this format next year? Two dayers, he is fit, moves it and as shown occasionally genuinely quick. I wonder how this can be harnessed regularly? Forgot how to bat throughout the year but we know Nick can bat well when determined and I look forward to some later order runs next year.

The following blokes missed out on a Grand Final spot but as can be seen played valuable roles for 3rd grade.

Matt Cole

Played the whole season in 3rd grade only to be dropped at finals time. Started the season strongly and was very consistent during the middle part of the season, regularly scoring runs only to find ways to get out every week. Rarely did the bowlers get him out. Lost his way somewhat towards the end of the season, hence 4th grade for the finals. Matt tried hard in the field and he obviously improved this from last year and his easy going way makes playing with him a pleasure. I hope he parks this tolerance for easy dismissals next year and grasps the opportunities to plunder large scores.

Sam Gainsford

The selection panel were very unsure what to do with Sam if he had been around for the Grand Final. An overseas trip prevented him for taking part but if he was available his hard hitting can be match winning in any situation. Started the season well but did not go on to score anything substantial. Scored a great 44 v Penrith in difficult circumstances and threatened to turn the game v UNSW on its' ear when he blasted 27 in no time after being 4/19. But in Sam's way he often went a bit too hard at balls a bit too early and not convert starts into scores. It's as though, as soon as he middles a ball, he is set to go helter skelter at everything. Other blokes to come through 3rds this year included Will Outred, Lance Stewart, Zac Trewartha, Javed Badyari and Sam Alexander and all of these blokes got on with it and fit in nicely. Following a successful season there is always a stack of people who need thanking.

This year was Peter Garlic's first full season with the club and his contributions were enormous as 3rd grade scorer. He was the deserving winner of the Malcolm Gorham award for best overall Sydney grade scorer and anyone that saw what he did would not be surprised. Peter kept an immaculate book, a running sheet and electronic versions all up to date every ball and at the same time managed to answer all of our idiotic questions and engage other scorers in good conversation. All information would be loaded in to the SCA website immediately following a game and he helped out in numerous other ways. I enjoyed his weekly email preview of the games and whoever gets Peter next year has a big advantage. Many thanks Peter for your help this year.

Alan Wright is another bloke who needs singling out. Wrighty was Graham Reserve game day manager and he made life so much easier for Josh and myself. Little things like ensuring teas are ready, drinks are available, cones are out, keeping things clean & tidy along with the myriad of other things that crop up, Wrighty was on top of it. Add this to his management of nets during the week then you have an invaluable helper.

Chris Hynes as chairman of selectors – Hynesie always had solutions to the vast range of issues

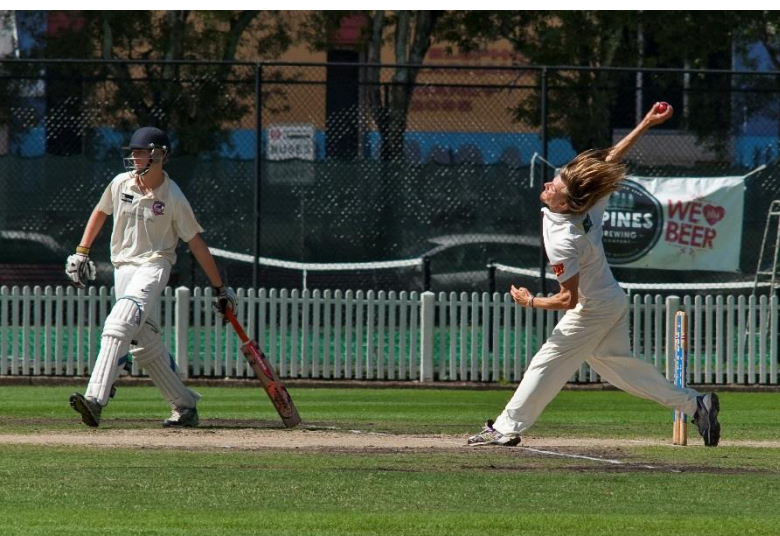

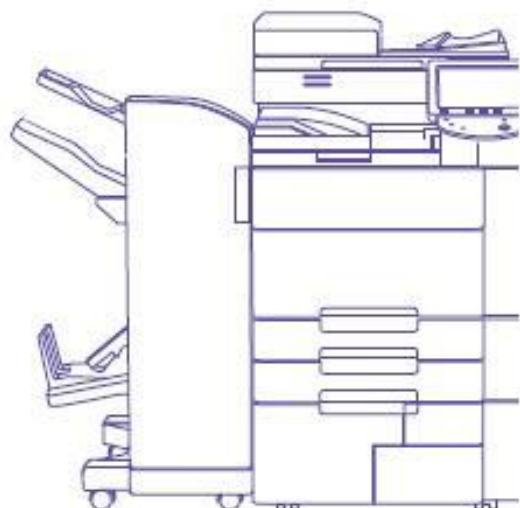

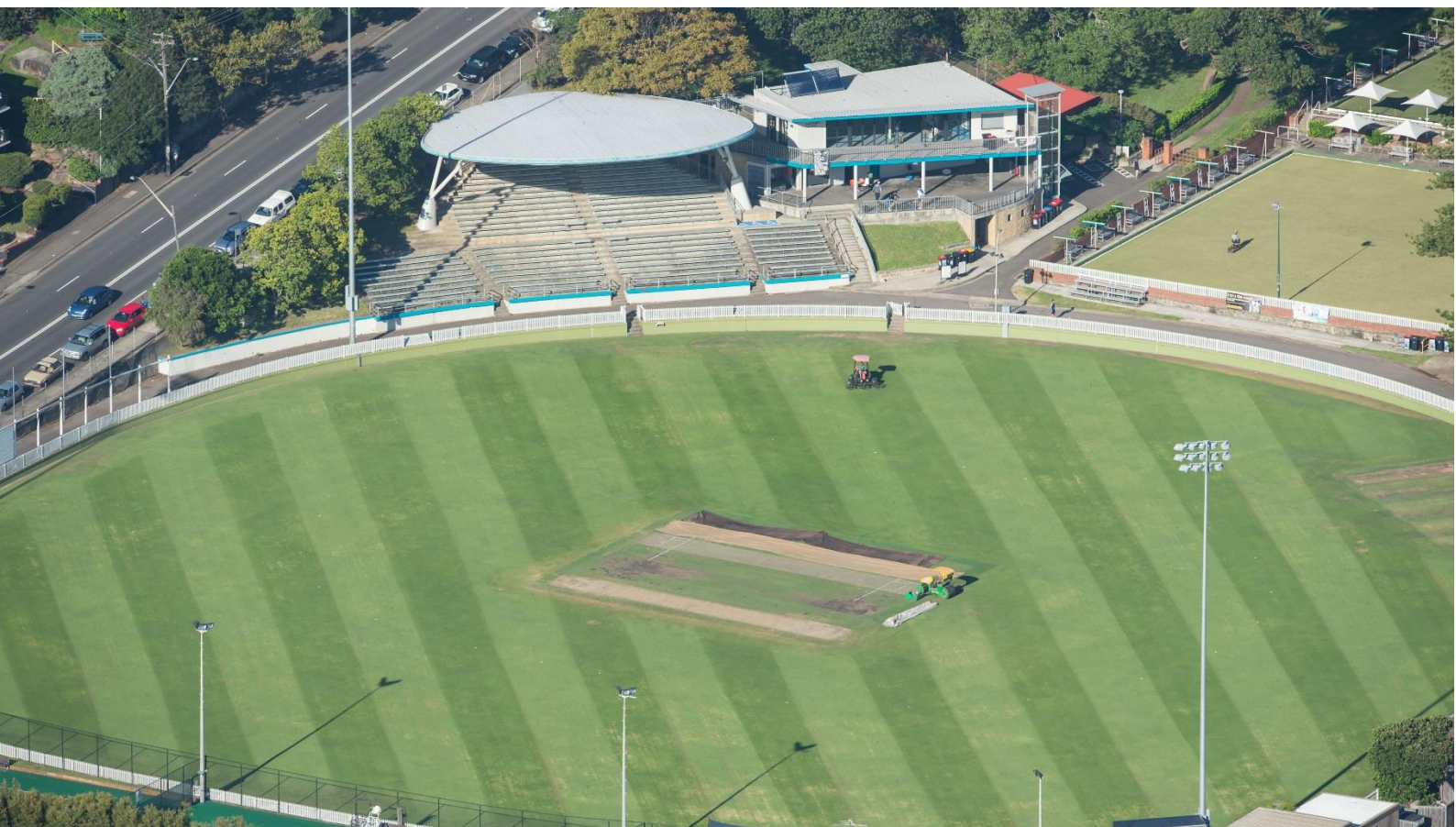
