Greetings from Cambodia to everyone who is in some way involved with the Happy Days education program in the Trach Commune Rural Village area of North West Cambodia.

I would like to briefly update you on some wonderful initiatives taken by 29 Manly visitors to the HAPPY DAYS CAMBODIAN VILLAGE SCHOOL CHARITY in November/December 2017.

Students visit Cambodia from St Pauls College & St Augustines College

A group of 18 year old students from St Paul's College & St Augustine's College, Manly Warringah, spent "schoolies week" doing noble work working with rice farming peasant families living in poverty.



Comfortable well ventilated 1 room rural village living for a family of 6. No electricity. No running water. Third world living at its best.

The boys learned to help with the rice harvest from sponsored student Srey Neang.



The boys assisted students at Srevibolker School. Youngest girl in picture is 6. Oldest boy is 15.



The group agreed their week-long visit to Vibolker was the greatest experience of their life.

Happy Days

Rural village families in Cambodia are as poor as they come. Yet the rice farming area supported by the Happy Days charity has some of the happiest faces on the planet. Thank you for their new school uniforms.



No fluoride here...

This 54 year old toothless grandmother was happy to see us visiting her district for 23rd time. There is no fluoride here. Or running water. Or tooth brushes. The farmers just chew beetle nut all day. I don't think it works.



Truckloads of rice

Happy Days provides 1,230 primary school children attending the Propel Primary School a before school breakfast program averaging approx. \$1,000 per month. Rice costs \$35 US for a 50 kg bag or A\$1/kg.



Sponsored teacher

Mr Mao is a sponsored school music teacher. Happy Days pays his salary of \$10 per week plus educational scholarship for his daughter Pisey, the number 1 student at Hun Sen High School (year 12).





Passport out of poverty

Penniless mum of 4 expressing gratitude for her daughter, Pach Tong, a Year 12 sponsored student receiving education in Siem Reap. She made Mike a hand woven bed mat to sleep on. The clothes on her back the only clothes she owns. We gave her 4 sarongs and Tong Pach a passport out of poverty.
