ANNUAL REPORT AND BALANCE SHEET

To be submitted for adoption at the Seventh Annual Meeting to be held at the Pier Hotel Manly, on Friday evening, 14th July, 1911.

To the Members of the Middle Harbour District Cricket Club-

Gentlemen,-

The Committee have much pleasure in presenting for your consideration the seventh Annual Report.

The First Eleven were not so successful as last year, their record being 10 matches played -3 won and 7 lost-although it is pleasing to note that the colts of the team performed ably. J. Hodgkinson once again captained the side throughout the season.

To G. Lowe belongs the pride of position in the batting list. This young player scored 442 runs for 12 completed innings, averaging 36.83. He also compiled the only century for the first eleven, namely 131 not out against the University. His consistent form gained for him a position in the Metropolitan Team against the Combined Country.

W. W. Chapman made a creditable reappearance in First Grade, and performed well;

D. A. Gee was, as usual, of great assistance to the side.

The bowling success of H. P. Woolcott, another colt, who secured 18 wickets at a cost of the 17.72 runs apiece is worthy of special mention. F. S. Middleton, 25 wickets at 21.36 runs each, and J. Randell, 23 wickets at 24.13 runs each, were the most effective of the other bowlers

The Second Eleven, under the captaincy of C. B - Cochrane, played 13 matches, winning

4, losing 8, drawing 1.

E. P. Woolcott, with 524 runs, easily secured the aggregate, and also won the batting average with 40.3 He scored two centuries, namely, 134 against Mosman and 102 against Sydney

The highest individual score for the whole club was made by J. Hodgson, with 181 not

out, against Randwick.

C. B-Cochrane (28.2), H. P. Woolcott (25.0), and H. G. W. Hawken (23.5) were the only other batsmen to secure averages of over 20. The consistency of H. G. W. Hawken deserves special mention, for he played 14 double figure innings out of a total of 17.

The bowling honours went to H. P. Woolcott, who secured 19 wickets at a cost of 15.2

runs each. K. Walton (22 at 17.6) and J. Ollivier (22 at 18.6) also bowled well.
C. B-Cochrane and H. P. Woolcott were selected with the Representative Second Grade side to play against O'Hara's Country Team, and the former was appointed Captain by the New South Wales Cricket Association.

The Inird Eleven, owing to the constant changes made in the higher teams, did not

have a very successful season.

The most consistent batsmen were G. Dunlop, averaging 23.36, L. M. Triggs (20.20), and A. W. Lough (19.20). Mr. Lough also scored the only century for the side, namely, 101 against Burwood.

The brunt of the bowling fell on D. Vernon and A. W. Lough. The former obtained 32 wickets at the fine average of 11.12 runs each, and the latter 30 wickets at 16 runs apiece.

The thanks of the Committee are due to D. Vernon and R. Baker for the capable manner

in which they worked in the interests of this team.
