## Annual Report and Financial Statement

To be submitted for adoption at the Annual Meeting to be held at Manly on Thursday,

15th July, 1926, at 8 p.m.

GENTLEMEN-

Your Committee presents for your adoption the 48th Annual Report and Financial Statement.

The Season under review was not as successful as it was anticipated. The Club finished 14th in the Club Championship being only followed by Mosman and Balmain Clubs.

While this is not an encouraging position, it has to be remembered that your teams and especially the 3rd Grade team included a number of junior players who were not used to turf and and grade conditions and consequently were unable to do themselves justice.

It is hoped however, that the experience gained will be of material benefit to these young players, and your Committee are looking forward with every confidence to the forthcoming season.

**The First Team** played 12 matches, winning 4, losing 5, drawing 3, and occupied 12th position in the Competition. The runs scored by the team were 3,262, at an average of 21.05 as against 2,660 at an avg. of 26.08 by opponents. The batting avg. was won by L. W. Gwynne, whose aggregate for 16 complete innings was 615 runs, average 38.43. B. F. Andrews was runner up with 14 complete innings for 416 runs average 29.71. Other notable performers were S. Trumper, average 24.88 and E. W. Newman average 24.61. L. W. Gwynne secured the aggregate with a total of 615 runs, while the only century scored was 124 n.o. by S. Trumper against Randwick. Scores of 50 and over were made by L. W. Gwynne 83.71, 65 n.o. and 52. E. W. Newman 78.64 53 and 50. B. Andrews 68.55 and 53. S. Trumper 64. J. Searle 93. G. Rogers 70 n.o. R. Bubb 61. C. Harris 65. G. Dunlop 55 n.o.

Though G. Dunlop shows in the averages as having an average of 126.00, he does not appear in the list on account of not having had 5 innings. The performances of C. Harris, a junior from the Manly District Junior Association deserves special mention. He kept wickets very well, and had 3 innings for 97 runs, average 32.3, and took part in a fine last wicket stand with G. Dunlop against North Sydney when 105 runs were added of which Harris contributed 65.

The bowling average goes to G. Rogers, who took 22 wickets at a cost of 18.5 per wicket. He was followed by R. Bubb and B. Andrews with 19 wickets each, with averages of 23.42 and 25.47 respectively.

It is noted that B. Andrews of your first team scored a century (119) in the first Interstate Public Services match against Victoria.

The Second Eleven played 12 matches, winning 5, losing 4, and drawing 2, and occupied 8th position in the Competition. The runs scored were 3,296, average 22.27 against 3,337, average 24.36 by opponents. The batting average was won by H. Wheatley who scored 427 runs, average 53.37. He was followed by A. Kildea 38.00, N. Cohen 36.1, G. Dunlop 35.45. The principal scorers were : N. Cohen 114, H. Wheatley 106 n.o. and 103, S. Wallace 104 n.o, G. Dunlop 102 n.o., K. Walton 80, A. Kildea 80 Leo., N. Plomley 71 n.o. The bowling average was won by C. B. Cochrane who took 6 wickets at a cost of 12.3, followed by F. McMahon 10 wickets at 17.40, and J. Betts 19 wickets at 21.84.

The Third Eleven played 12 matches, winning 2, losing 10, and occupied last position in the Competition. The runs scored were 2,836, average 12.66 as against 3,078, average 19.12 by opponents. The batting average was won by J. Betts, who scored 152 runs, average 30.4 followed by C. B. Cochrane 22.2, F. Virgoe 19.3 and F. MicMahon 17.57.

The bowling average was won by A. Little, with 13 wickets at a cost of 5.85, followed by J. Raymond 12.80, and F. McMahon 14.5.

The Club congratulates Western Suburbs on winning the Club Championship, Paddington 1st Grade Premiers, Gordon 2nd Grade, and Petersham 3rd Grade, also the North Manly Cricket Club on winning the Manly District Junior Association Competition.

Junior and School Cricket— Your Club continues to encourage cricket in the district by placing at the service of the Junior Association and the Schools its wickets and practice nets, and it is noted with pleasure that the players avail themselves of the advantages provided.

**Delegates**—Your delegates, Messrs R. A. Oxlade and C. B. Cochrane were regular in their attendances, and it is worthy of mention that these Gentlemen were again elected Chairmen of their respective Committees.

**Finance**—Owing to careful management your Club has been able to meet all its obligations, and carry forward the sum of  $\pounds 70/13/8$  to next Season.

**Committee**—Your Committee held 8 meetings and the aitendances were :—G. Dunlop 8, R. Freeman 7, C. B. Cochrane 7, H. Everitt 7, J. Randell 6, N. Plomley 6, C. Searle 5, K. Walton 6, R.A. Oxlade 4, R. A. Bubb 5, A. Little 4, and B. Andrews and S. Trumper, who were elected in place of E. W. Newman 2, and F. Brand 1, in March, 3 each.

Thanks—The thanks of the Club are due to Manly Council, "Manly Daily," Manly "Life," Hon. Auditors, Caretaker, the Scorers (Messrs Bonamy, R. Cohen and R. Fitzhardinge), Mrs. Bubb, and ladies who looked after afternoon tea.

Material—As usual all teams were furnished with the best of material, and the experience goes to show that material of good quality besides giving general satisfaction is the most economical. New nets are now available and will be in use on the new practice wickets during the coming season. Morning practice was encouraged and was participated in by many members of all Grades and Juniors.

Selection Committee—Yourt Committee think that the present method of selecting the Grade teams is not in the best interest of the Club and recommends for your consideration and adoption an alteration of the Rules in this connection.

The N.S.W. Cricket Association made available the sum of  $\pounds 250$  to the Club for improvements to the Oval and this amount was handed by your Club to the Manly Council.

**Obituary**—It is with regret that your Committee notes the deaths of Messrs E. P. Woolcott and J. Freeman. Mr. Woolcott was for many years actively connected with the Club, both as a player and administrator and was a great worker for cricket generally. Mr. J. Freeman for many years was a grade player, and always took an active interest in the Club's doings. To the relatives the Club extends its deepest sympathy.
