64th Annual Report and Financial Statement

To the Members.

GENTLEMEN,

Your Committee submits for consideration and adoption, the 64th Annual Report and Financial Statement.

This is the third successive year the Committee has submitted a war-time report, and on this occasion it has recorded bare facts, with a view to reducing manpower effort, paper and printing.

It is doubtful if in the history of District Cricket that clubs have experienced such difficulties. Further water restrictions were enforced, and on some grounds wickets could not be prepared. Your Shire XI. suffered on this account, receiving forfeits in the early part of the season, and it eventually could not muster sufficient strength to carry on, forcing a withdrawal from the Competition. In addition, Brookvale Park, the club's second ground, was taken over by the Government. Nevertheless, the season was completed and much good cricket was shown by all teams. Gate takings at Manly increased by 40 per cent. on last year's figures, and the Club continued to maintain public support in the district.

Your Club improved its position on the Competition Table as follows: 1st XI., 12th position; 2nd Team, 6th; 3rd Team, 9th; A. W. Green Shield Team, Premiers; Shires, 61 points at the time of withdrawal from the Competition; Club Championship, 9th place.
