


Ladies and Gentlemen

The Management Committee has pleasure in submitting for your consideration the 119th Annual Report and Financial Statement.

The Club entered teams in the five Sydney Cricket Association Fosters Light Ice grade competitions as well as the Fosters Light Ice Limited Overs competition, Poidevin Gray and Green Shield competitions.

Many of our younger players are showing great promise and we look forward to their emergence at higher levels next season. It is our challenge to provide the opportunities for these young players to blossom and to contribute to the Club's performance at the highest possible levels.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The immediate past season was by no means an easy one. Two major issues managed to make it, I believe, the most difficult season the Club has encountered in recent years.

A major issue was the quality of the Club's two major grounds. The turf wickets at both Manly Oval and Graham Reserve were for the majority of the season not up to standard. In fact, both grounds were rated the worst in Sydney for the season by the Umpire's ratings. It is in fact a credit to the Club that we managed to perform as well as we did, given the conditions and the facilities at these grounds. There is no single issue which is of more concern to the Committee.

On a brighter note, I am able to advise that a new curator has been appointed by the Manly Oval Trust to Manly Oval, with this individual having outstanding references in relation to the preparation of turf wickets, both in Sydney and Brisbane. I am also able to advise that Manly Council will shortly be seeking expressions of interest for the preparation of the turf wicket at Graham Reserve, and we are confident of obtaining a person of similar qualifications to ensure this facility is also of suitable playing standards. As I have stated previously, the committee regards this as the single most important issue to get right, as without proper facilities the Club can simply not succeed.

The other major issue which affected the season was a level of divisiveness and conflict amongst senior players. Simply put, for our Club to be successful, these personal attitudes must be put to one side, with individuals accepting decisions made.

Notwithstanding the above, there were a number of highlights in the current season. On the playing side, the performance of Second Grade in reaching the final was an outstanding effort, with contributions made throughout the season by all members of the side. The team during the season was excellently led on the field by Anthony Dignan. In many ways, the final was not a proper reflection of the team's capabilities as luck certainly deserted them in this game.

Given the age of our Green Shield team, its performance during the season was also outstanding. The team was well coached and managed by Steven Herzberg and Graham Beesley with Louis MacMillan doing a great job as captain. It was noticeable that there was a strong spirit with this team and the Club looks to these junior players to come through its ranks in the forthcoming seasons.

The Club's performance in the Club Championship, as well as the fact that four out of five grades improved their position on the table from the previous season, was a terrific effort given as I have stated earlier the poor condition of our home grounds. This performance is in no small measure due to the efforts of our Club Coach, David Patterson, who in his first season made an outstanding contribution.

Off the field, the committee, in the most difficult season, I believe showed strong leadership and was totally unified in relation to all major decisions. The Club is extremely fortunate to have an executive including Bob Brenner, the Club Secretary, Peter Martin, the Deputy President and Tony Scanlon, the Club Treasurer. The Club was also well served by other committee members including Graham Beesley, Richard Fry, Col Kelaart, John Warn and Ray Dignan who resigned midway through the season.

On the financial side, the Club is once again indebted to a range of sponsors who are named throughout this report. As I have stated previously, it is simply impossible to run a successful Club without a high level of sponsorship and these sponsors deserve our support.

To the Captains and Selectors, I thank them for their contribution throughout the season for doing a job which does require a great deal of commitment and carries with it a high level of responsibility. Thanks also go to Don Sellin, our Practice Captain, for his untiring efforts not only at practice, but also in managing our Third Grade side and in scoring the Green Shield and Poidevin Gray teams.

I would like to thank all the parents and supporters throughout the season who assisted with afternoon teas on match days etc. Your support and assistance throughout the season is much appreciated.

In conclusion, I look forward to a season in 1997/98 where the Club has first class facilities and is unified in achieving our goals.

- To follow the fortunes of 2nd Grade as they deservedly won the minor premiership and reached the final;
- and to watch 1st Grade convincingly defeat eventual premiers, St George;

were all sights that warmed my heart as a coach as to the great potential that exists within our Club.



1ST GRADE REPORT

Players, supporters and friends of Manly-Warringah District Cricket Club,

The final ball has been bowled and brought to an end what can only be described as an indifferent season for both 1st Grade and the Club as a whole. It was a season not without difficulty and whilst it is important to acknowledge the negatives, it is always of better value to draw on the positives as we look to the future.

Our final position on the competition table improved on last season, however I'm sure that given the talent we had at our disposal, each of the players would be disappointed with our placing.

We began the season in fine style disposing of Campbelltown, UNSW and Wests to perch ourselves amongst the leaders. What followed was nothing short of a disaster. We were unable to secure another victory until Round 12 against the eventual Premiers, St George.

The eight game losing streak (although we beat Norths on 1st innings before losing outright Round 11) was a result of many factors. We failed in the most part to play with much consistency and at times appeared incapable or unwilling to work to a plan in any facet of our performance. In fairness to the players however, the luck rarely seemed to fall in our favour.

Against Bankstown in Round 5, we were 6 for 300 before rain washed out play. We had Parramatta (Round 6) 7 for 42 in their 2nd innings before a storm of Noah proportions drowned our chances. In Round 9 against Mosman, we tore through their batting to have them 7 for 27 and a few cruel decisions and some complacency ruined us there. Had we snatched one of these games, the season may have been very different. As a result we are left to rue the "what ifs?". However, if you want to be a successful side you have to significantly outplay your opponent and not be reliant on luck. Not too many winning sides rely on luck to get them home.

Perhaps the most statistically disappointing feature of 1st Grade's performance this year was the batting. No batsman was able to average more than 30 or top the 500 run mark. In fact, I find it hard to envisage any of the batsmen reproducing such a disappointing result in the future.

It is fair to say that there were some irresponsible and rash pieces of batsmanship as will always happen in cricket. However, the condition of the practice facilities and the wickets we played on had a dramatic effect on all batsmen's seasons. In fact it seemed wherever we travelled, the wickets were either wet or green or both.

The effect the wickets had on the batsmen throughout the Club cannot be underestimated. When a player is continually faced with inconsistent bounce and pace both at practice and in the game, it makes it near impossible to build any real confidence or rhythm. Good players should adapt to all situations, however, the wickets on the whole were impossible to adapt to. Thankfully the Club's committee have acted extremely positively in this regard and it's great to see them so committed to producing outstanding facilities for the coming season. I know they are doing all that they can in this regard and I'm confident the players will reap the rewards next season.

Our bowlers' performances were perhaps slightly inflated as I'm sure they would freely admit. However, to a man their efforts in the latter half of the season were outstanding and a captain could hardly ask for more than what was produced.

Individually there were some terrific, individual efforts and every player had their day in the sun. Matthew Phelps was a great acquisition to the Club this season. His contribution to the team as a whole cannot be underestimated and as he becomes increasingly familiar with his new team mates he is developing into a terrific team man. His aggressive approach on the field combined with his fielding makes him a joy to play with. He is astute and always thinking about the game. Matthew's batting was affected by the conditions yet at times he showed the application of someone who is more than just a grade cricketer. His innings of 54 against Randwick, was in my mind, the innings of the year. 54 is not a big score so it had to be seen to be appreciated.

Ross Trewartha opened the innings at times toward the end of the season. He showed what he is capable of with some beautifully fluent strokeplay. He makes it look so easy and is a joy to watch in full flight. He snuck up on "Dickie" to snatch the batting award. Rosco is ahead of his time with his diet and training regime. It could be the way of the future. In case he doesn't back up next season, I'm thankful I had the opportunity to play with a terrific bloke and a good first grader.

We were yet again well served by our "veteran", Richard Fry. He notched up his 5000 1st Grade runs this season, a terrific effort. His presence is invaluable. Although at times it is concealed, no player in the Club is more competitive or has a greater love of winning. His catching was first class and his batting was as consistent as could be expected this season. Anyone who doubts Richard Fry should have seen the way he played Anthony Stuart, never intimidated and giving more than he got. I wouldn't swap him.

Shawn Bradstreet had a disappointing season by his own impeccable standards. Yet he showed in many games just how good he can be. He will prove in the future how good a player he is. Whether it be catching, bowling, or batting "Winga" can win games. I find it hard to think of another player who could make batsmen look stupid after not bowling for three years. He's still learning the art of batting (who's not?) and needs to believe he's as good as anyone. He can be.

It was a difficult season for Rowley Alexander. It was no doubt difficult for him to adapt to a new role in the team. His batting to begin the season was brilliant. He showed what he is capable of. His fluent classical shotmaking was in evidence against UNSW and Wests before he began to lose his way. It was as disheartening to others as it was to Rowley to see him consistently dismissed in the same fashion and if he can overcome this fault, he can show his true worth as a player. His infielding as always was outstanding.

Steve Herzberg was a revelation for 1st Grade. His experience and love for the game are a great asset to our side. He showed why he has first class experience. Like all spinners, he has his theories and they often proved correct, as his 35 wickets at 18.22 suggest. He played some dogged innings, yet I feel his best batting has not been seen. I look forward to many victories alongside the "Fur" next season.

It took a while for Warren Evans to get going but when he did he was superb. When he's in form, there is no better outswing bowler in Sydney. In the second half of the year, he showed why he is so highly regarded by all opposition. Wazza played some invaluable innings as well. I believe he will prove to the "doubters" that he can handle a bat at 1st Grade level and one day Wazza you might get that 1st Grade century you talk about.

Without question, one of the highlights of the year was Matt Suttling's performance in his debut year. His 24 wickets at 15.08 was a dream start and exceeded his own expectations, I'm sure. The secret to "Sutts" success lay in his determination and his willingness to listen and learn. He showed great patience in his bowling and consequently built pressure. This either resulted in wickets for himself or for his bowling partner. His agricultural batting was both entertaining and heartbreaking. In fact I don't think "Sutts" gives his batting ability enough credit. If he displays the same traits he has thus far, he will continue to be a great asset to the side. He should most definitely wear the same whites as last season for half his wickets came whilst the batsman was laughing during his approach to the wicket.

Jamie Heath is a captain's dream. He's as fast at ball one as he is in the 80th over and he always wants to bowl. He was given more bowling than was fair at times, yet he never shirked responsibility. His ticker is his most valuable asset. There were times when we could tell he was hurting, yet he never complained because he knew ten guys were willing him on. His ability to get good sharp lift was as impressive as his consistent line and length. Aside from his outstanding 44 wickets at 14.70, he showed is more than capable of being a useful middle/lower order batsman. Jamie will be a tremendous player for Manly and higher honours beckon if he wants them.

There were a number of other players who made significant contributions to 1st Grade this season.

David Gainsford and Geoff Tucker both showed glimpses of their talent before they ably guided second grade to their success. Glen "Trunk" Evans bowled well on occasion too. "Trunk" needs to back himself more when he makes the step up and spin the ball hard. He's always great fun to play with and his success in 2nd Grade was great to see. Rob Parkinson had a good debut before he was cut down by injury. Paul Brenner and Peter Procopis both showed they've the potential to play at this level. The injection of enthusiasm they brought to the side was a major factor in our outright success over Randwick. Paul had an outstanding season considering the wickets and hasn't received the accolades he deserves. He will prove a 1st Grade success if he irons out one or two things and works hard at his game.

Luke Martin was given an opportunity and showed why he is considered such an outstanding prospect. He bowled well in both his matches in 1st Grade and for one so young did not appear overawed which is great to see. He will continue to succeed if he maintains the discipline he has displayed thus far in his career.

Morgan Youell understandably was more than willing to accept the 1st Grade spot that was presented to him and considering he'd never played 2nd's, he didn't let himself or his team down with his display in the final round.

So as is evidenced, each member of the side performed with credit at some stage this season. However, the overall consistency of these performances was one reason we failed to play to our potential.

Most every player in 1st Grade as with the whole Club, need to take more responsibility as an individual. It must become a belief that your job is never done. If you've scored 70 or even 130 you can always score more. It's when players feel that their contribution is adequate that a side can be let down. Every individual needs to always be thinking "how can I contribute to my team?". This can range from a pat on the back at the end of an over, to giving the bowler's hat to the umpire or encouraging batsmen at the crease. Things such as this go a long way to building success and enhance the enjoyment of playing the game. All players must become aware of the contribution they can make without bat or ball in your hand.

I'd also like to take this opportunity to offer my apologies for my contribution as Club Captain during the latter half of the season. The 1st Grade captaincy, as well as my rep commitments, meant I was unable to give my all to the position. The role of Club Captain is to assist the players in anyway they can. He should also do whatever he can to develop club spirit and he needs to encourage socialisation amongst the club members.

Finally, there are many people who deserve thanks for their contribution to 1st Grade this season.

David Patterson was excellent in his debut season as Club Coach. "Patto's" love for both the game and Manly are obvious and we as players will continue to benefit by feeding off his knowledge.

To our loyal servants, Geoff Rogers and Bobby Lind. Your devotion to the team is greatly appreciated. I can certainly say that they are an important cog in our machine and all the players value their involvement and friendship.

Don Sellin yet again contributed in many number of ways. It wouldn't be Manly without "Dollars" around. Your contribution to the Club is irreplaceable, "Dollars".

To the committee and in particular, Gary Flowers and Bob Brenner, for their support and assistance. There are many who aren't aware nor appreciative of the hours the two men put into the Club. They do it not for themselves, but for the benefit of the Club and the players and we are indebted to them.

On a personal note, I could not finish without thanking both my parents and brothers for their support throughout the season. More so, I cannot thank my team mates enough and in particular, my "loyal" friends for the unconditional support throughout the season. It was a difficult season for numerous reasons and I will always remember those who supported me through some tough times.

So to next season, I am unwavering in my belief that the Club will be a success and an enjoyable place to be in the future.



 coming seasons.



Thanks to everyone who has made my time enjoyable over the many years at Manly.


