The Committee beg to present their report for the Season 1902-03.

The A Team secured 5th place in Second Grade Competition. They played 11 matches, won 6, and lost 5.

The B Team are to be congratulated on having won the Third Grade Competition. Their success was largely due to the able captaincy of O. W. Rawson, who, it will be interesting to note, is the oldest member of the Club. The B Team's record was: Played 11 matches, won 8, lost 1, and drawn 2.

The Veteran Team played a full programme of matches, with satisfactory results;

A number of games were also arranged for the "Colts," and the Oval was fully engaged on Wednesdays, etc.

Centuries were obtained by E. H. Stoney (138), for the A Team, and O. W. Rawson (143 and 105), P. M. Lowe (101, not out), for the B Team.

H. Whiddon and J. Randell distinguished themselves as bowlers for the A and B Teams respectively; the former, on one occasion, performing the "hat trick."

The Committee regret to report that the Financial Statement shows a debit balance of £20 7s. 3d. but as this amount is more than represented by debts still owing to the Club, the year may be regarded as a fairly satisfactory one.

Various improvements have been made to the Oval, with the result that the ground generally is now in first-class condition.
