## Annual Report and Financial Statement

To be submitted for Adoption at the Eighteenth Annual Meeting to be held at Manly on Thursday, 13th July, 1922, at 8 p.m.

To the Members of the Manly District Cricket Club.

Gentlemen,—

The Committee has much pleasure in presenting for your consideration the Eighteenth Annual Report since its admission to the Association as a First Grade Club. The Club was originally formed in about the year 1878, and was known as the Manly Cricket Club until 1903, when it became the Middle Harbour District Cricket Club, and last year the name was again altered to Manly District Cricket Club.

Four teams were placed in the field during the past season, the fourth team competing in the Manly Junior Association. Keen interest in the game was taken by all players, and it is hoped that the enthusiasm will extend to the next season.

Your Committee extend (Second Grade), Western Sut (Second Grade), Western Sut (Second Grade), upon winning the respective Premierships.

Your First Team played 13 matches, winning 1, and losing 12, and occupied the last position in the competition table, scoring only 13 points out of a possible 52.

The batting average was headed by E. W. Newman with 27.5, the next in order being R. A. Bubb 26.7, and D. A. Gee 23.3. The only three figure score, viz., 108, was made by Mr. Gee, at Chatswood, and it was described by the onlookers as being a particularly fine performance, the runs being obtained in a very short space of time.

The bowling average was won by Arthur Mailey with 11 wickets for 116 runs, average 10.5. He was only available during the latter end of the season. The greatest number of wickets was obtained by J. Randell, viz., 49 for 917, average 18.7.

**Second Eleven.**—This team played 13 matches, winning 7, drawing 4, and losing 2. During the previous season our second eleven occupied the lowest position in the competition, and we are pleased to record that last year they were runners-up in the competition. We offer our congratulations to the team, as it was a decided improvement on previous efforts, and we hope for still further advancement next year.

The batting average was won by J. Ross with 34, followed by G. Dunlop 31.5, Eric Mitchell 26. 6, P. Lowe 23.7, J. Moore 23, N. Cohen 21.13, and C. Searle 19.8. The only three figure score was made by Eric Mitchell, viz., 129, although G. Dunlop was unfortunate not to reach the century, he scored 93 in his first match.

The bowling average was headed by A. Little, 20 wickets for 296, average 14.8, the next in order being J. Ross 34 for 517, av. 15.2, and C. B. Cochrane 17 for 265, av. 15.5.

Third Eleven.—After commencing the season very satisfactorily this team finished 11th in the competition, obtaining 22 points out of a possible 52.

The batting average was won by F. Brand, with 25.4, followed by A. Flower 19.2, S. Bros 16.12, W. Pettit 13.5, and W. D. Johnston 13. The bowling was won by F. McMahon 39 wickets for 319, av. 8.1, and then followed R. Smith 16 for 144, av. 9.0, D. Long 17 for 167, av. 9.8.

Junior Cricket.—Your Club entered a team in the Manly District Junior Competition, but was compelled to withdraw before the close of the season owing to some of the members being chosen to play with the higher grades, and for this reason they had not sufficient players available for the fourth team. This was brought about by one of the rules of the Association, which provided for the registration of all players, and those not registered could not be selected.

Representative Honors.—Mr. Arthur Mailey was again selected to represent New South Walcs in the Interstate metches and Mr. R. A. who was selected to play the second team during the visit to Melbourne.

**School Cricket.**—As in former seasons, your Club placed its wickets and nets at the disposal of all local schools free of charge.

General Remarks.—Before the commencement of the last season, the local Council decided to try and improve the playing area of the Oval. The whole of the ground was ploughed, and for this reason your Club was unable to have the use of it until late in the cricket season. On this account practice wickets were not available, and members were deprvied of that important feature of the game.

We congratulate the Manly Council upon their efforts to improve the Oval, and we feel sure that the work which they have carried out will be thoroughly appreciated by all cricketers, and will undoubtedly be the means of materially improving the standard of local cricket.

**Delegates.**—Messrs. R. A. Oxlade and C. B. Cochrane, your Delegates to the N.S.W. Cricket Association, were regular in their attendances. Mr. Oxlade was elected Chairman of the Executive of the Association, as well as to the Board of Control. Mr. Cochrane was again re-elected Chairman of the Grade Committee.

**Finance.**—The Club finished the season with a credit balance of £3/19/6, which is considered very satisfactory in face of the continued high cost of material and other expenses.

Office Bearers.—Owing to the rule of the Club whereby office bearers are elected being altered at the last Annual Meeting, nominations will be received on the night of the meeting for all office bearers, and for this reason a full attendance at the meeting is requested.

**Thanks.**—The thanks of the Committee are due to the Mayor and Aldermen of Manly for the courtesy extended to the Club officials at all times, the Vice-Presidents, scorers, and officials of the Club for their support, and to the Proprietor of "The Manly Daily" for his reports of the Club during the season.
