

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

In a departure from the usual script, this report will deal briefly with last season's performance and then focus on a number of current issues facing grade cricket in general and the direction our Club proposes to take in an effort to address those issues.

The overall performance in the 1994/95 season was encouraging and a vast improvement on the previous season. Bob Brenner, the honorary secretary, as well as various captains have outlined in their reports the highlights of each team's season with the statistic and match summaries also detailing the achievements of individual players. To each of the teams and their players go my personal congratulations on their performances.

In looking at the performances, it would be remiss of me not to make specific mention of some individual contributions. Rowley Alexander in his initial season as First Grade Captain was an outstanding success and clearly contributed to the team's overall improved performance. In inheriting what can only be described as a "difficult" job, Rowley immediately gained the confidence and respect of his team which resulted in him teceiving 100% player support.

A further key factor in the improvement of the Club's performance was the contribution of the Club Coach, Steve Whitfield. Immediate on his appointment, Steve set about imposing a set of standards as well as having players establish individual goals for their performance. Steve devoted most of his time to the development of junior players with this no doubt reaping rewards in the years to come. It is pleasing to see that Steve has accepted reappointment for the 1995/96 season, being able to continue on with the groundwork laid last year.

Well what are the major issues facing our Club and how do we intend to deal with them.

1. Grounds & Facilities

At present, the cost of preparing two fields for cricket during the season and of providing practice facilities is in the order of \$75,000.00. 90% of this cost is met by council.

To an increasing extent, aldermen and administrators are questioning why cricket should be subsidised to this extent by the local community.

At the present time, the New South Wales Cricket Association provides clubs limited assistance in dealing with local government.

The Club's administration is acutely aware that in order to succeed and to develop the potential of our players, first rate match and practice facilities must be provided. As a Club we have approached this issue as follows:-

• As a member of Manly Oval Trust Inc. we have taken over direct responsibility for the administration of Manly Oval. To this end, RTS Pty Ltd have been contracted to provide first rate facilities at Manly Oval.

- We as a Club have taken over responsibility for the provision of our own practice facilities with RTS Pty Ltd being contracted to provide these at Manly Oval from the 1995/96 season.
- We have arranged for RTS Pty Ltd to contract directly with Manly Council for the preparation and maintenance of the wicket square at Grahams Reserve.
- We are actively pursuing the availability of a third ground. This currently involves the possibility of a new turf facility at Weldon Reserve.

With these arrangements in place, the Club's administration is confident that both practice and match facilities will be as good as any in the Sydney metropolitan area. All members of the Club however, need to be aware that the provision of these facilities comes at a significant cost with local government being less and less willing to contribute.

2. Financial Viability

Four years ago, the Club's annual budget was in the order of \$25,000.00. Next year, the Club's budget will be approaching \$100,000.00.

Not only is the cost of providing suitable grounds and facilities increasing, but other costs involved in simply putting teams on the paddock each week in the Sydney Grade Competition are also increasing.

The First Grade cricket scene in Sydney is increasingly becoming semi-professional with a number of Clubs offering key players substantial amounts with financial incentives being available to not only first graders, but to all club players.

Whilst player subscriptions assist in helping to meet a portion of these costs, this portion is becoming increasingly smaller and smaller. Coupled with the issue of player payments, it is becoming almost impossible to run a grade cricket club without a significant level of financial support from sponsors.

As a Club in recent years we have had some success in this area, however, in order to be competitive the current level of sponsorship needs to increase markedly. All members of the Club should need no encouragement to support the Club's sponsors, these sponsors being clearly identified throughout this report. Members are also encouraged to come forward with any suggestions for sponsorship as it is vital to the Club's survival.

Once again the New South Wales Cricket Association apart from some grants, provides little assistance to clubs in this area. Clearly one way of assisting would be to at least provide the grade competition with some profile in the media, so that sponsors may feel as though they have something to gain from being involved with a particular team.

3. Player Payments, Development & Recruitment

First grade cricket in Sydney is increasingly becoming semi-professional. More and more clubs are approaching key players with financial incentives, as well as introducing player incentives for all first grade team members. Our Club is not immune from this with all our first

grade players having been approached in recent seasons to leave our Club and play for alternate clubs.

We have always prided ourselves as a Club which has a high percentage of local players throughout our grades. The suggestion is that recruitment of players be undertaken by the Club after consultation with the cricket manager, first grade captain and club coach.

As a Club our approach in the past has been to openly state that all players in first grade are rewarded on the same incentive basis. As a policy this needs to be reviewed, as clearly we will not be in a position to recruit profile players, unless suitable financial packages can be offered.

As a Club we are blessed with a large junior catchment area and with the establishment of the Northern Beaches Cricket Council under the leadership of Tony Scanlon, we are in a very sound position to effectively develop and promote junior talent. As the senior club in the district, this is seen as a very important function and integral to the Club's future.

In summary, the Club's approach to these issues is as follows:-

- Key players will be recruited to enhance first grade performance where necessary, with individual financial packages being offered. This done in consultation with first grade captain and cricket manager.
- As far as financially possible, player financial incentives to be provided.
- Club to devote significant resources and energies to promote and develop junior cricket within the area.

The foregoing has been an attempt to identify key issues facing the Club and appraise players, supporters and members of these issues in an endeavour to firstly, promote awareness and discussion. Certainly in order to succeed as a Club, each of these issues needs to be addressed.

Finally I would like to thank each of the Committee members for their efforts and support throughout the season. Also special thanks to all those people who assisted throughout the season in helping the Club function. This support while often unnoticed is appreciated, and is essential to the Club's well being.

117TH ANNUAL REPORT

To the members of the Manly Warringah District Cricket Club Inc.

The Management Committee has pleasure in submitting for your consideration and adoption of the 117th Annual Report and Financial Statement.

The Club entered teams in the five Sydney Cricket Association grade competitions as well as the Reschs Limited Overs, Poidevin-Gray and Green Shield competitions.

Competition Results: Club Championship - 10th, Firsts - 7th, Seconds - 4th, Thirds - 16th, Fourths - 7th, Fifths - 13th, Reschs Limited Over Cup - 16th, Poidevin-Gray Shield - 8th in Northern Division and Green Shield - 3rd in Northern Division.

In the SCA Club Championship, we were placed in the middle ranking but there were numerous remarkable performances by all the teams throughout the season. I draw your attention to the captains' reports and will not attempt to detail the many successes and highlights. Thanks to those captains for their excellent leadership and efforts throughout the year: Rowley Alexander, Greg Hill, Frank Turner, Tony Pitcher and John Borzi. Additional thanks go to John Borzi for his role as Club Captain and to Frank for his role as Chairman of Selectors. Tim Blank and Anthony Dignan must be recognised for their able direction of the seconds following Greg Hill's unfortunate back injury. Craig Glassock, Brian Clemow and Simon Couch shared the captaincy of the Poidevin-Gray team, while Mark Turner provided strong captaincy for the Green Shield team. First grade's potential was high but they were unfortunate in having the most number of drawn games, five in the competition. demonstrated their true quality in defeating two of the semi finalists including premiers, Bankstown. The Club was delighted that our Life Member Greg Hill came out of retirement and captained the seconds in an inspirational manner. He guided the mix of experience and youth playing strength to the semi finals after a series of exciting matches that saw some extraordinary fightbacks from threatening defeats. The team exhibited the true competitive spirit that has sustained the Club over our 117 years of competition. Fourths and the Green Shield teams performed strongly throughout the competition and narrowly missed their semi finals.

Steve Whitfield has provided exemplary service and dedication during his first season as Club Coach. Steve's analytical approach, his encouraging manner and his insistence on excellence in preparation has shown dividends for the club now and promises well for the future. Scott Davis provided effective pre-season conditioning.

Club member and NSWCA Development Officer, David Patterson retired from playing but has given excellent service through his direction of clinics for talented young players and as executive officer of our Northern Beaches Cricket Council. Tony Scanlon has liaised closely, with David in carrying out the Club's development officer role and is putting in place a development scheme for young players during the winter. Tony richly deserves his Clubman of the Year award for his extensive contribution across a range of Club activities. Anthony Dignan and Nick Derbyshire gave excellent service as coaches of our Green Shield squad.

I highlight the importance of our generous sponsors and the need to support them whenever possible. I refer you to the special sponsors page for specific acknowledgement.

The Club has been very fortunate to have a dedicated and hardworking Committee to ensure that competitive teams compete each week. President, Gary Flowers, devotes extraordinary time and energy to the Club enterprise. Vice President, Andrew Fraser, continues to devote immense effort to the welfare of the Club, including the editorship of this document. Andrew, Tony Scanlon and John Borzi were the social organisers including our superlative tribute night for Bev and Robbo after their selection in the Australian team to tour Pakistan. Treasurer, Geoff Rogers, has given excellent service across a range of necessary duties. Col Kelaart has contributed strongly in his role as the Club's Cricket Manager. Thanks also to Peter Procopis and Matt Ridley for their efforts throughout the year. Special thanks go to Assistant Secretary, Gordon Currie for his excellent contribution. The Committee is optimistic that the continued effort to enhance the quality of wickets and grounds will be rewarded in the coming season to bring them up from the ordinary ratings achieved this year. Negotiations are also being held to secure a third wicket for fifth grade competitions.

- The Club's matches against Peter Philpott's touring Rossall School, Lancashire and the County touring side Gloucestershire.


In conclusion, I must emphasise that the Club's future is promising. Our list of representative players is one we present with great pride:-





1ST GRADE REPORT 1994/95 SEASON

Season 94/95 was always destined to be an interesting one. The side had fallen from being the competitive force of previous seasons and it was time for the players to rise and face the test of will. The loss of the opening batting combination, two fast bowlers and a spinner from the previous season, gave other players the chance to flourish: players emerged (and re-emerged) - showing the depth within the Club - with a focus (and experience) which proved invaluable to the spirit within the team.

We were already, without a ball being bowled, regarded as long shots for the semi-final battles and taunted with romancing in past glories. This seemed to impassion the players to play each match with a fierce determination and resolve which resulted in a deservedly successful season with a string of excellent team and individual performances against quality opposition.

Our side possessed the talent to achieve ultimate success but as we all know talent alone is not enough to move from a dreary season to one of promise. And so it was that with the season unfolding players leaped from varying shadows with the belief that they could win and our self confidence grew immeasurably with each game both as individuals and as a team - our enjoyment being at a premium.

The first contest, against the neighbouring peninsula Mosman, saw the Clemow's and Trewartha's begin the season with half centuries providing a glimpse of things yet to come, the Ford's and Bradstreet's re-newing 'red ink' acquaintances and setting the tone of partnerships for future matches and the Hoffman's leading the charge to a first up win, claiming the first of many fine bowling performances with a five wicket haul.

An early season trip to Penrith saw the team clasped in a tight tussle for victory, Manly chasing 345 falling just 3 runs short in the last flurry with the game ending in a draw. All this after magnificent performances from Paul Hoffmann, troubling all with his control; Mark Taylor, a deceptive 32 over spell; a scintillating 3rd wicket partnership of 187 between Richard Fry (113) and Ross Trewartha (98) - their efforts falling just 10 runs short of the Club's 1st grade 3rd wicket partnership, established back in season 1913/14; and a last minute assault on the attack by Anthony Dignan (43).

A washed out game against North Sydney and an outright loss to Waverley saw the side at the end of round 4 edging towards another season in the wilderness mashed with missed opportunities and 'ifs' and 'maybes' a prospect. But it was important for the team to lift and raise ourselves off the canvas after the defeat of Waverley and harness the pre-season spirit to walk forward to the next challenge.

A win against Balmain and an excellent fighting performance against Petersham showed the side was developing character and commitment. In the Petersham affair, the side scrambled to 157 after a fighting 7th wicket partnership of 41 by David Ford and Geoff Tucker and an addition of 28 for the last wicket (David Ford and Paul Hoffmann). The game was then in the balance overnight with Petersham precariously placed at 5 for 88. Geoff Tucker and Paul Hoffmann led the charge the next morning to grab a well deserved win - bowling the visitors

out 30 odd runs shy of the target (Ross Trewartha's 108 and Brian Clemow's 50 in the second innings set the scene for the possibility of an outright result only to be again thwarted by rain).

Then our second (and to be our last) loss of the season against Fairfield and a win against Sutherland saw our side just outside the semi-final race at the Christmas break. Then with games against Gordon and St George washed out, our season was beginning to be dictated by the weather and not by our own performances.

Strong performances against two tougher sides in the competition, Randwick at home and Bankstown away, proved to the players that they were just as good a side as any other in the competition. Randwick set us a target of 245 for victory and a fantastic display of batting by Craig Glassock with a knock of 84 n.o. enabled us to go into the game against Bankstown brimming with confidence to beat the current champions. After posting 312 from some great batting partnerships the side managed to dismiss the Bankstown boys for 232. This was definitely one of the season highlights; a fantastic all round team performance; exceptional will and belief to win.

Another washed out game against Northern Districts and end of season victories against Sydney University and Parramatta saw the team finish on 48 points and equal 7th on the ladder. All this from a season of 8 wins, 2 losses and 5 draws (4 of those due to washed out games).

In the batting department, it was fantastic to see Richard Fry back to his best and scoring over 500 runs for the season. Richard batted with patience and purpose throughout the season and was an integral part in the team's overall success. His hundred against Penrith was crafted beautifully and his innings of 82 against Balmain on a green strip showed his courage and fighting qualities to set up victory. His opening batting partner in Brian Clemow also showed what a fine talent he is. In his first full season in top grade, Brian accumulated 4 half centuries and finished the season as one of Australia's finest in the U19's Test series against India. I'm sure with further experience, the runs for Brian will continue to flourish.

Craig Glassock returned from the cricket academy and showed in the latter part of the season, freed from the shackles of expectation and lessons learnt from each game, he is maturing into a wonderful class player. His innings of 84 n.o. against Randwick was one of the most mature and disciplined of the season, displaying his many array of shots, combined with an unshakeable application and patience that deserved the just rewards of a team victory with applaudits from many. Craig's excellent running between wickets was also a big feature of his performances throughout.

The side this year welcomed a new player in Ross Trewartha whose stability in the middle order proved invaluable to the team's batting strength throughout the season. Ross' versatility and composure also provided the team with much needed balance in the batting order and his aggregate of 528, the highest of the season, was well deserved. His calmness was a reassuring quality in the heat of the battle and his sparkling 98 against Penrith and a majestic 108 against Sutherland were two of the season's more memorable innings.

Shawn Bradstreet's focus throughout the season was magnificent and his half centuries against Balmain, Bankstown and Northern Districts were all filled with a determination second to none. Shawn's fielding also helped to create some great pressure situations against our

opponents. Shawn has worked extremely hard on his game and should be a better player next season with the experience gained from his efforts this season. His batting partnerships with David Ford provided the team with many opportunities to foster victories from seemingly unenviable positions. David's efforts this season enhanced his ever growing reputation as a fighter. He figured in the highest partnerships for all of the last five wickets and his innings' against Petersham and Bankstown were filled with confidence, plenty of character and heaps of grit. Playing shots on both sides of the wicket and at times with a composed lustiness supposedly beyond his range, David's efforts enabled the side to post many competitive (winning) opportunities.

Success has a way of galvanising friendships which was evident with the bowling trio of Paul Hoffmann, Nick Derbyshire and Geoff Tucker. Paul was unlucky not to receive higher honours this season other than his appearance for the State 2nd XI side after capturing 39 wickets for the season including two five wicket hauls (5/43 v Mosman and 5/68 v North Sydney). Paul is a great character, modest and self-effacing, the happiest of fast bowlers on the outside, the steeliest underneath who was our premier bowler of the season. He was one player who put up his hand to lead the charge for many of the team's victories this season. Paul was also able to add an extra dimension to the team's enthusiasm with his weekly chronicles in a local newspaper, as well as his pre-match warm-up of hand slapping the steering wheel to the deafening tunes of "Pantera".

Nick Derbyshire came into the side after round 4 and injected his own determination and commitment to the side as well as adding some aggression into our attack. Not exactly tearaway but decidedly slippery, Nick went about his task with excited enthusiasm with an infectious nature that helped to project some new found momentum and versatility into the bowling department - and being rewarded with his season tally of 25 wickets.

Geoff Tucker developed superbly throughout the season and revelled in the workload that was thrown his way. He was durable and kept ploughing away over after over, match after match to return with 28 wickets for the season, a fine first season performance which promises to improve in the seasons ahead. Geoff also provided excellent resilience with the bat and with further work certainly has the ability to develop into a capable allrounder.

Gavin Robertson played 4 games for us this season and showed the full mastery of his craft in those appearances, capturing 19 wickets with 7 for 84 against Fairfield being the season's best. Gavin was an integral part of the team's successes this season and was a trump card the team enjoyed in it's repertoire. Gavin's professionalism and tough approach to the game was evident with each venture and helped the team to foster it's competitive spirit and maintain the motivation against all sides.

Manly were blessed with depth in the top grades this season which was evident by 2nd Grade's great performance in reaching the finals. Four other players which were an integral part of the 1st Grade lineup this season included: Anthony Dignan, an exceptional wicket-keeper with loads of ability, his innings against Penrith full of conviction; Tim Blank, who always gave 100% - his fielding and catching brilliant, his medium pacers tricky and shrewd; Mark Taylor, who has a fierce determination to succeed and with hard work and commitment can be a regular member of 1st eleven; and Glen Evans, who added an extra dimension to our attack with his left arm tweekers and provided his own unique blend of enthusiasm.

Seeing all the players perform so well, both individually and as a team, and coupled with their tremendous enjoyment was for me an extremely satisfying part of the season. Many of the season's performances were inspirational and helped to unite a side aimed at achieving success for themselves and for the Club. Our fielding and catching was one of our strengths, our batting partnerships become more consistent, our bowling purposeful. With the framework developed, the hours of toil will need to continue more aggressively next season, absorbing past experiences and harvesting new ones if the side is to remain competitive and to be a part of the end of season fireworks.

Thanks to all the members of the team who supported me throughout the season and gave me tremendous confidence with each game going forward. Also thanks sincerely to John Skiller - our historian scorer, Geoff Rogers and Bobby Lind - tireless and ever supportive workers, Steve Whitfield and Col Kelaart - for your continuous encouragement to the army of helpers with the afternoon teas and to the family of supporters who travelled a country mile to be with us each game.



3RD GRADE REPORT 1994-95 SEASON

A strong start to the season saw 3rd Grade sharing equal first position after 6 rounds. Many factors then contributed to the downslide that followed in which we did not record another point for the remainder of the season.

Before elaborating on the negatives which caused this downslide, it is more pleasant to highlight some of the season's successes as the team was comprised of mainly young players in their early years of grade cricket who have the potential to progress to higher grades in the future.

Gaeten Juul, with two brilliant displays of strokeplay and concentration in the first two games with scores of 95 and 74, showed he was ready for 2nd Grade and was promoted, where he immediately succeeded.

Craig Fittler scored 57 and 119 in two of his three innings before returning to Shires. We hope Craig returns next season to further his career with similar performances with the bat and also with more opportunities for his bowling.

Shane Skinner joined us late in the season and played some well chosen, thunderous, lofted drives to put us in winning situations with scores of 68* and 60.

Graham Turner opened most innings and compiled three scores in excess of 50. Other openers in Warren Evans and Tim Ryan also scored heavily on occasions.

Barnaby Wilson and Jason Martin were the two allrounders of the team who performed well with the bat, normally under pressure, and were amongst our best performed bowlers.

Barnaby's seven wicket haul in the last game was always threatening to happen and when it did was well deserved. Barnaby always bowled well to his field and was unlucky not to consistently take more wickets. In many cases, because of his accuracy, he was treated with too much respect by opposing batsmen who would not take risks against him.

Jason always bowled tight and his spell of 15 overs 3-39 against Bankstown was one of the best of the season. Jason gets into a rhythm the longer he bowls and only needs to be able to bowl as well in his early overs to make himself a much more effective wicket taker.

Cameron Lawes and Rudi Burratini normally shared the new ball and were the perfect example of the tearaway colt at one end and the experienced trundler into the wind at the other.

Cameron found an extra yard or two of pace by the end of the season and put in two exceptionally quick, accurate spells against Bankstown and Sydney Uni. Cameron also overcame his no ball problem which, when added to his maturity as a bowler, enabled him to keep the pressure on opposing batsmen by the end of the season. Cameron also enjoyed the friendships he made particularly the nice friends he made on the boundary against Fairfield.

Rudi often took a wicket with the offcutter when needed and showed the younger bowlers how to take a wicket as soon as the captain said "See how you go this over, I might bring someone else on". Rudi, with 18 wickets and only six runs for the season, made great inroads to surpassing the feat of Brian Kinsey, my old team mate of former years and the Club's second highest wicket taker, to take more wickets than runs for the Club.

Jamie Turmanis started the season well behind the stumps and kept exceptionally well to Barnaby's spinners before losing some of the gloss off his tidiness later in the season, as well as losing his way to every away game.

Cameo performances were provided by Pat Kelly, David 'New Born' Price and Greg Boyer, who showed us how higher graders perform with the bat, ball, gloves and mouths. Pat will no doubt always cherish the friendship him and myself made with the cranky old, balding offspinner from Waverley.

Now to the reasons why we fell from 1st to our final position of 16th.

The rain was no doubt a factor as seven games were washed out or rain affected. From the last game before Christmas to the end of the season, we only walked onto the field on five separate days. The lack of preparation of wickets contributed to this in some cases.

The condition of the wicket at Grahams Reserve was an insult to the players, and similarly, the practice wickets gave no help to any batsman wishing to walk out of the nets with any confidence.

However, this is no excuse for some of our poor performances with the bat. Our batting was an embarrassment of talent with the first nine or ten batsmen in most games all capable of batting high in the order. Yet it was the batting which failed to perform consistently to take advantage of opportunities to win games.

Our bowling in some games was found to be lacking the firepower and consistency to quickly dismiss the opposition. However, through tight bowling spells and strong pressure from the field, we mostly managed to dismiss the opposition or hold them to a gettable target.

The fielding for the majority of the season was excellent with good support given to the bowlers. However, it was as always, the odd misfield, dropped catch or missed runout that let the pressure off when we should have been concentrating harder to take advantage of previous good cricket. We should all follow Shane Skinner's example to improve our fielding next season.

In the six games that were lost, we performed like a winning team for approximately 80% of the game but due to a batting collapse, or a poor bowling or fielding spell, we managed to put ourselves into a losing situation. The games against Sutherland and Bankstown were the best examples of this. Against Sutherland we let their last wicket put on 80, and against Bankstown after dismissing them cheaply before their 60 overs, we then crashed to be 7 for 47.

From a personal point of view, I immensely enjoyed the season captaining the team despite my own poor performances with the bat when often a Captain's knock was necessary. I thank the

team for making me feel many years younger and it was great to be on the field again for one of the best clubs in Sydney.

A special thank you to my wife, Jenny for putting up with my mid-life crisis and for always helping with afternoon teas at home games. Also thank you to Judy Turner and Richard and Margaret Lawes for their help with afternoon teas.

Thank you also to Don Sellin (alias Donny Dollars, The Oxford Scholar and The Master of Misinformation) for his managerial and scoring skills. It was a pity Don's health was not 100% and we did not see him as much as we would have liked.


