

# 118TH ANNUAL REPORT

To the members of the Manly Warringah District Cricket Club Inc.

The Management Committee has pleasure in submitting for your consideration and adoption of the 118<sup>th</sup> Annual Report and Financial Statement.

The Club entered teams in the five Sydney Cricket Association grade competitions as well as the Diamond Draft Limited Over Cup, Poidevin Gray and Green Shield competitions. Competition Results: Club Championship - 6<sup>th</sup>, Firsts - 10<sup>th</sup>, Seconds - 8<sup>th</sup>, Thirds - 6<sup>th</sup>, Fourths - 10<sup>th</sup>, Fifths - 3<sup>rd</sup>, Diamond Draft Limited Over Cup - 13<sup>th</sup>, Poidevin Gray Shield - 5<sup>th</sup> in Northern Division, Green Shield - 10<sup>th</sup> in Northern Division.

Despite some excellent efforts from all grades and the promise of early season dominance - after round 8, the Club was looking really good sitting first in the Club Championship, first in first and fifth grades, second in second and fourth grades and third in second place - there was a loss of the early focus and determination that must be maintained to achieve the ultimate success.

Our first grade captain, Rowley Alexander led the way with his application of intense club spirit. His leadership was acknowledged by the SCA with the Captain of the Year Award. Congratulations to Rowley and all those other players who contributed so enthusiastically throughout the season. Rowley ensured that first grade played enterprising cricket and we were runners up in the Roy Turner Trophy award for the fastest over rate in first grade cricket for the season. Our performance in soundly defeating the first and second grade premiers, Sutherland, in both these grades illustrated on-field qualities that continue to stamp Manly as one of the truly prestigious Clubs.

I draw attention to the President's Report and Captains' Reports for detailed information, analysis and comment on team and individual performances. Sincere thanks to our grade captains, Rowley Alexander, Greg Hill, Andrew Fraser, Tony Pitcher and John Borzi for excellent stewardship throughout the season. Thanks also to Anthony Dignan, David Ford, David Gainsford, Paul Brenner, John Warn and Tony Scanlon for their able leadership when the regular captains were unavailable.

Additional thanks go to Shawn Bradstreet for his role as Club Captain. Shawn had an excellent season culminating in the award of NSWCA Cathay Pacific/Swire Travel UK Scholarship for the city and country cricketer of the year. Shawn resumed his place in the NSW squad playing soundly for the NSW 2<sup>nd</sup> XI. With marriage to Katherine Marks and the off season in the UK, it has been a memorable year for Shawn.

Brian Clemow captained the Poidevin Gray until the accident left him with severe injuries. Brian is making a courageous recovery, working hard to overcome the medical problems, with the overwhelming support of his family. Brian was poised to attain great heights during the year following his selection as NSW Colts captain and having been the most outstanding player at the Australian Under 19 Championship with a pending period at the AIS. We wish Brian a successful recovery that will fulfil all his hopes and dreams. Shawn's recovery from

his debilitating back injury and the fortunate recovery of David Gainsford and Craig Currie from their major medical problems hopefully provides some inspiration for Brian as he recovers from his injuries. Paul Brenner took over the PG captaincy in a very competent manner while Scott Ward gave strong captaincy to the Green Shield side, despite their fragmented season.

Club Coach, Steve Whitfield's dedicated approach continued to pay dividends in the development of many players. We have been very fortunate to enjoy Steve's professional approach to training and benefit from his immense experience and knowledge of the game. We recognise Anthony Dignan's valued service as assistance coach and coach of the Green Shield team. Congratulations to David Patterson on his appointment to one of the three NSWCA senior coaching positions. David gave excellent service as our NSWCA development officer for the Northern Beaches Cricket Council area prior to his major promotion. Welcome to Matthew Phelps who has taken David's role. Tony Scanlon continued to chair the NBC Council and worked very hard to assist the development of cricketing youngsters in our area.

A former Club stalwart, Keith Fitzpatrick returned to the Club fold and has given dedicated service as Chairman of Selectors. Keith's support for the players and his careful analysis of situations, resulting in positive outcomes have been appreciated.

Each year we highlight the importance of our sponsors and the corresponding need to support them. I refer you to the special sponsor's page for specific acknowledgment. We are especially thankful to our loyal sponsors. In addition, we have to note with disappointment and disillusionment of the shabby record of our designated principal sponsor that has left us financially adrift.

contribution, we would be unable to provide the facilities necessary to run a successful Grade Cricket Club.



# TREASURER'S REPORT - 1995/96

Members,

By examining the Financial Report, you will note that the Club has made a remarkable recovery from the losses incurred in the 1994/95 season and recorded a surplus of \$2,497.00. You will also note the tremendous increase in the turnover of the Club to \$94,837.00, which overshadows the previous years by 70% and that capital purchases of the Gabba netting system for Manly Oval of \$8,266.00 were made. Not evident is the spending of \$2,000.00 for the extension of the turf practice wickets at Manly Oval.


The end result certainly belies the constant financial struggle that the Club has had this season and understates the efforts of the Committee to keep the books balanced. Strict control over expenditure this season, although unpopular for some, has been justified with this result.

The failure of the Communications Depot to fulfil their sponsorship commitment of \$20,000.00 and their subsequent receivership was devastating to the day to day cash flow of the Club. The abovementioned purchase of nets and the extension of the practice wickets were to be funded directly from these sponsorship funds.

To offset the cash flow problems that the sponsorship shortfall created, the Committee organised a fund raising dinner at Harbord Diggers to celebrate Michael Bevan's selection in the World Cup Squad and ran a raffle with first prize being donated by the Nukubati Resort Fiji. To those of you that supported these initiatives, the Club is indebted to you.

Many thanks to our sponsors, namely, CUB, Manchester Unity, Sparke Helmore, Manly Elders Real Estate, Dencorub, James Langfield Holden, Nukubati Resort Fiji and Apaachi Australia for their financial support. I would implore all of our members to support our sponsors, as we are becoming ever increasingly reliant on them for our existence.

# 1ST GRADE CRICKET REPORT 1995/96

"The hours of toil will need to continue next season if the side is to be a part of the end of season fireworks ..."

These were words we all uttered at the end of 94/95 and a pledge was given from the first man to the last that to train with a passion, play with a passion and fulfil our dreams of finals glory; and then ...

What followed was a tale of two seasons entwined as one; what promised to be a most rewarding one ended as just an affair with success - the season finishing in a heartbeat, colliding with despair and an embarrassing succession of losses.

We commenced the season against Waverley overflowing with exuberance, boyhood fearlessness and a ferocious excitement that tripped over our desires firstly to perform and secondly with the unabashed hunger to win. After being bundled out for a measly 140 and counter punching with 9/146, we were able to set a target of under 200 - thanks largely to an emphatically controlled century by Michael Bevan (who also captured 5/18 bowling his sneakish leggies). Waverley gave up the chase leaving us with dented pride but our fight back provided us with ammunition for our tussle with foes, North Sydney.

With excellent positive cricket and four half centuries crafted (Richard Fry, Craig Glassock, Shawn Bradstreet, and a sturdy knock from an ever improving Geoff Tucker in the allrounder category) helped the side to post a formidable 8/303. Geoff Tucker then led the charge for our inaugural season victory with a gutsy 5/59. A washout against Penrith and a challenge against a bolstered Mosman awaited.

What followed was probably one of the most memorable wins that led us on a post game, on-field merry dance of indescribable proportions. After posting another 300 score (aided by a Brian Clemow textbook 70) rain tumbled on day 2 and threatened to reduce the match to a fruitless exercise. The match continued though, through the poorest of conditions - Glen Evans bowling 25 superbly controlled overs with a cake of soap. With Mosman requiring 7 runs with 2 wickets in hand and seemingly in control and forging towards a brilliant win; in fading light, Paul Hoffmann produced an amazing three ball, two wicket spell to provide the Manly boys with our own rendition of grand final acrobatics and reducing the opposition to tears. An unbelievable win.

Another Sutherland scalp in the cupboard, chasing 276, Michael Bevan and Shawn Bradstreet set about destroying their declaration and cementing our ambitions with purpose. Their partnership of 231 (152no and 107no respectively - Shawn's maiden 1<sup>st</sup> Grade century, complete with many whispering drives) bettered the 4<sup>th</sup> wicket 32 year old record previously held by club legends, Peter Phillpot and Barry Rothwell back in season 63/64.

A gutsy win against nagging opponents in Campbelltown and another against Hawkesbury and Uni of NSW saw the team at the half way mark bristling with confidence and perched equal 1<sup>st</sup> on the league premiership table. In chasing 245 and being 3/20 against Hawkesbury, Craig Glassock produced a composed, mature and merciful innings of 131no to provide the

team with six points. Geoff Tucker produced his best bowling against NSW Uni with 6/85 and chasing 275, Richard Fry's century guided the team to it's target with 5/279.

Thoughts of a semi-final berth, the first in seven seasons, crossed the minds once too often of the experienced, the young brigade and our ever enduring followers. Standing tall with a record of six wins and one loss was followed with one win and five losses, the team falling embarrassingly from grace. Commencing the run home with a loss to equal competition leaders and club championship contenders in St George was followed in quick succession with paltry performances against Gordon and Balmain.

Our season then ended with dismal and, in the end, shaming losses against lowly placed Wests and Sydney Uni, crushing all earlier aspirations; leaving only sickening feelings of misplaced opportunities.

In all our last six games, we began our innings stumbling to two for less than ten or three for less than not many, posting targets or chasing moderate totals proved beyond our irretrievable starts. In these games we placed ourselves within a stroke of the blue ribbon but in the end were given five hidings; telling a sorry tale of poorly constructed efforts in laying the platform for victory or maintaining momentum throughout a match provided by our bowlers.

As one, we failed to produce the steely determination that had previously carried us on our journey towards success. Having fought so hard and then to endure hapless defeats showed us as a shadow of our capabilities, both known and unknown. Through these performances though, the confidence remained high within and fate has given us the opportunity to heal the wounds of defeat with a resilience and new found toughness. All the players are positive in their outlook towards the forthcoming season and we aim to work harder, planning better to provide each with an infallible support towards rebuilding past foundations.

As with all seasons, some exceptional performances are worthy of note; Nick Derbyshire bowled with relentless passion, capturing 27 wickets in six games after the new year, 40 in all for the season - he continually put the side in a winnable position; Geoff Tucker's courageous efforts with the bat gave us a much needed boost with the tail and his dog fighting attitude with the ball met every contest with desire.


Shawn Bradstreet's performances with the bat in posting 537 runs was a magic effort - Shawn continues to improve with each game and was just rewarded with State 2<sup>nd</sup> XI selection. He works unbelievably hard and knows the price but deserves every success and will move to greater heights. Together with Craig Glassock and others, he will provide the club with many more memorable performances. Craig's tally of 528 runs was probably below his expectations but included some match winning innings under pressure which is a mark of a polished player - Craig too, will improve and shows great respect for his wicket and his State 2<sup>nd</sup> XI selection was also well deserved.

Thanks sincerely to Geoff Rogers and Bobby Lind for their unbelievable support throughout a long season, and to our family of supporters who braved every element and travelled to all ends to be with us through the good times and the painful and heartfelt ones.

As one hopeful season ends, we head towards another with renewed vigour and courage, with a promise that these new experiences will be preserved to enable success to endure and ensure that dreams do not remain just as dreams.



### 2ND GRADE CRICKET REPORT 1995/96

Gaeten Juul and Alex Maidment also contributed with important innings during the year. Gaeten will rightly be disappointed for he has so much talent, and success will follow hard





### 3RD GRADE CRICKET REPORT 1995/96

In my appraisal of the 1995/96 season for Manly's third grade team, it is difficult not to feel both a sense of achievement and a touch of disappointment.

Firstly, considering this grade improved 10 positions on its 16<sup>th</sup> placing of the previous season - many would consider 6<sup>th</sup> to be a considerable achievement.

However, on the other hand, had the side been able to score 148 in the round 13 blash against Fairfield, we would have secured a finals berth and quite conceivable, 2<sup>nd</sup> position on the ladder. Unfortunately, the boys were dismissed for a paltry 113 and Fairfield went on to contest the finals.

Whilst statistics do not always tell the true story, a glimpse over the third grade stats provides a good indication as to why we missed the finals:

- No-one scored 300 runs
- No-one scored a century
- No-one took 25 wickets
- A total of 26 players represented thirds throughout the season

I believe the constant turnover of personnel had an extremely unsettling effect on the spirit and unity of the team during the latter half of the season. This is an area the selection panel have to address prior to next season. To have 26 players pass through a third grade team that we either in, or on the verge of the top 4 for the entire season, is an absolutely ridiculous situation.

### Stability breeds confidence and a desire to want to win.

When one analyses the poor quality of practice facilities presented to us by ground staff coupled with the pitch at Graham's Reserve, it's probably a minor miracle that we finished 6<sup>th</sup>. Already, the Committee have taken steps to ensure the facilities are of an acceptable standard by the start of next season.

The Graham's Reserve pitch is hardly worth commenting on. It rated the 19<sup>th</sup> worst ground out of 20 in Sydney and rightly so. The pitch was constantly under-prepared and the post-Christmas outfield was so thick, a full blooded drive would be lucky to reach short cover! Just look at the batting stats - they don't lie. Anyway, enough whingeing, now for the positives.

Firstly, the bowlers, Jason Martin deserves the first credit. If every player had his determination to succeed, we would be unbeatable. He took the most wickets (22) and was Mr Reliable with the bat. A bit more penetration with the ball and he could become a regular second grader.

It was a pleasure to play alongside him again - revisiting the memories of the 1987-88 third grade "glory days". He showed many of the younger players what a fierce competitor he is.

The batsmen - Pete Procopis was the star early in the early rounds before being promoted to seconds where he rightfully stayed for the remainder of the season.

The opening combination became a major headache as the season progressed. Benny Howell started well but lost confidence. He has enough natural ability to play a lot of top grade cricket - I'm sure his dad, 'Raker' will iron out those little technical faults that exist.

The talented Mark Turner was promoted to thirds, eventually taking his brother's spot in the team. He started well with a great 49, but his next 9 digs yielded only 78 runs. Both Mark and Ben should just treat the season as a good learning experience for future years.

The veteran Kenny Pitcher joined us in round 7 and added much needed stability to our middle order. KP scored his 5000th run for the club this year and is always a great asset to any team. Always enjoys his cricket.

Shane Skinner was somewhat of an enigma. Unfortunately, work commitments prevented the writer from being able to participate in the last three rounds of the season and I apologise to the players for this. Due to these commitments, I will not be in a position to continue the role of captain next season.

Alex Maidment - why Alex was graded anywhere below thirds beats me. Congratulations to him on his spirit to lift himself into the higher grades where he belongs.

The players who were the mainstays of the team were either promoted from fives or came down from threes:

Michael Fraser - was in fours all year. Michael found it difficult to get past the thirties this year. He will need to concentrate on being in the middle for longer time periods and work on building a good score. I am sure he can achieve this next year.

Luke Martin - had a taste of thirds this year and I think he realises that wickets are a bit harder to get in grade than in junior cricket. As Luke is still only young, he can look on this year as a stepping stone to a very big career. He had by far the most natural pace of any

A highlight for him was against Balmain where he finished with about 3 wickets off 17 overs for about the same number of runs. This also included a rip snorter of a catch that no one thought was catchable.

It would have been good to see him turn some of his good starts into big scores, however, as this was Ben's first year in grade, those scores will come with added experience. I'm sure Graeme will return next year ready to unleash the talent that we know he possesses.

Andrew Rochford - The bug was a player that could swing a game. He could come on and contain dominating batsmen or he could add some very important runs to the board from lower down the order. He put in a fine performance in one game to capture five wickets. Another first year grade player with the ability to do well in higher grades in years to come with his natural swing bowling.

Thanks to all the other players who had a stint in fours including Sean Annetts, Michael Zann, Tony Scanlon, Morgan Youell, Drew Dickson, Chris Glassock, Jamie Turmanis, Josh Storm, Col Kelaart and Josh Peterson. All contributed in one way or another and I thank them for their support.

Thanks to the members of the committee whose tireless work may go unnoticed by the majority of players but without them there would be no club and no competition. Special thanks to Bob Brenner who spent some early mornings and late nights ensuring the wicket at Graham's was being prepared for play. Thanks also to all the parents, wives and girlfriends for their support. There is nothing more inspirational to have a crowd gather at a game to watch you play. The most impressive thing this year was that you showed up at away games as well as those we played at home.

Thanks again to my wife, Claire and daughter, Sarah for their support this year, for allowing cricket to take me away from them not only on Saturdays but also for selection committees, practice and all the other things that go with captaining.

I hope this year, as all years can be taken as a learning experience. We, the club were caught out cruising up to Christmas, enjoying our game, and enjoying being a winning club. I think after Christmas we thought wins would just happen for us. As we now know, this didn't happen. Let's make sure next year we can win games consistently by putting in the big efforts with commitment and enthusiasm. Winning is not something that comes easy. 


