While we were in the middle ranks of the Club Championship, it is pleasing to acknowledge improvements in six of the eight competitions from last year.

There were a number of brilliant achievements from team members including Matt breaking Jimmy Burke's 1968/69 batting aggregate record, Shawn's second placing in the O'Reilly Medal, the team's fourth place in that prestigious Medal award competition, Michael Bevan and Richard Fry's record breaking partnership in the Balmain game and Glenn Evans' 6-50 in the Limited Overs competition against Sutherland and Matt Phelps' 148 not out against St George. Matt's record will be enshrined in the Club room when his bat will be encased and displayed as a major memorabilia item for the Club.

Congratulations to all players who contributed to the success of our Club, their teams and their fellow players. PRESIDENT' REPORT

Each year the task of writing this report is faced with a range of different emotions. Last season the task was not easy, as a result of an indifferent season affected by average performances, internal division and poor facilities.

No such problem exists with this year's report, the season being one marked by Club harmony, great facilities and good performance, both by teams and individuals especially 1st Grade. As expressed at the Presentation Dinner, I firmly believe this to be a watershed year for the Club and the beginning of a period of sustained high level of performance.

There were many highlights to the season, and in hindsight the signs were there from the very first match of the season on Manly Oval. This match marked the return of Brian Clemow to grade cricket after an eighteen month absence following a life threatening motor vehicle accident. To witness Brian playing cricket again for the Club was satisfaction enough, but to see him score a century in his first game after sustaining such serious injuries really set the tone for the season. The fact that Brian went on to average over 30 in 1st Grade for the rest of the season is testament to his dedication and courage, and he serves as a role model for the rest of the Club.

It is no coincidence that the Club's improved performance in 1st Grade coincided with a dramatic improvement in the condition of the grounds and the training facilities. Last season the Committee stated openly the number one priority was to improve the Club's playing and training facilities. It is with some satisfaction I report the Committee has delivered, for this season the Club's playing and training facilities were second to none. Full credit for this must go to the new groundsman, Steve Gajzmelski and his team. Without doubt this season confirmed the importance of playing training facilities.

On the playing side, the highlight of the season was the performance of the 1st Grade team, which deservedly made the semi-finals. The team made up of nine local juniors, perhaps the highest local representation of any team in the competition; demonstrated to the Club the values of team work, self belief and commitment. In many ways, it was one of the best team performances I have witnessed with the Club with every player making a contribution to the team effort.

Whilst the team report mentions the individual performances, a couple of individual performances are worthy of mention here. Matthew Phelps had an outstanding season breaking a Club record held by the late Jim Burke for scoring the most number of runs in 1st Grade in a season. Deservedly, this resulted in Matthew being added to the State squad. It is to be hoped that Matthew makes his Shield debut next season.

Shawn Bradstreet also had a season to remember achieving one of the best all rounder performances in this history of 1st Grade. No cricketer has a stronger work ethic than Shawn, and every success he achieves is richly deserved. His selection in the State side for the Mercantile Mutual Cup final was a fitting reward for his effort over past seasons, and it is hoped that he can press on and debut for the State next season.

It would be remiss of me not to mention the contribution Craig Glassock made to the 1st Grade performance. As a player, Craig had an outstanding season batting well and keeping superbly, culminating in his selection for the State side in the match against Tasmania. Whilst his contribution as a player is not to be underestimated, it was really his leadership qualities which had a major impact on both the 1st Grade side and the Club. At the beginning of the season, Craig made it clear to all that he not only wanted but expected 1st Grade to win the competition. Having set this goal, he converted others and instilled

confidence in them to believe this goal was achievable. Leading on an unheralded team, this ultimate goal was almost realised. As a leader, Craig has unique qualities and it is to be hoped that he has the opportunity to show these at higher levels.

A further highlight of the season was the influx of a number of promising juniors to the Club, in particular Louis McMillan, Tim Cruikshank and Todd Sekulich. All these juniors had good seasons for their first season in grade cricket, in particular Louis McMillan who was named Junior Player of the Year.

I would like to thank all the Club's sponsors for their support during the season and I would like all Club members to support these sponsors whenever possible.

Further thanks go to the Captains and selectors for their efforts during the season in performing what is often a thankless task. In particular, special thanks to Keith Fitzpatrick and Don Sellin for their efforts.

On the Committee front, I would like to thank all members for their contribution. We welcome back Ron Holmes to the Committee, who in a short time has already made a significant contribution. In particular, I would like to thank the executive of Bob Brenner, Tony Scanlon and Peter Martin for their support and tireless efforts throughout the season.







3RD GRADE REPORT

As happens so often in the middle Grade at Manly, we are left to ponder what could have been as four other sides battle it out in the semi-finals.

There are two sides to every coin and it will be easy to say that we performed well throughout the season with the players available, won more than we lost etc, which is all very true but attitudes like that breed mediocrity.

The truth of the matter is that a lack of mental toughness and willingness to make the extra sacrifices for team mates cost us a place in the semis if not a premiership. Only twice this year, against Hawkesbury in Round 1 and Uni of NSW, were we beaten simply by a better side.

Our batting which was our strength, also became our weakness. I have never been one to take much notice of statistics, but there is one outstanding statistic of note, on 56 occasions did our batsmen reach 20 runs compared to only 40 against us! Of these 56 occasions, only 20 were converted to scores of 50 or more, of these 20 half centuries only 5 were converted to scores over 75.

Two losses in particular can be pinpointed. In Round 5 v Sydney Uni, we had six batsmen reach 20 runs yet only one just reached 50. They had only four reach 20, but the batsman who went on and scored 100 against us won the game for them. In Round 9 v Wests, we had four batsmen score 20 or more, they only had two but one batsman went on and scored 90no and won the game for them.

Our batsmen have to become tougher with themselves and realise that 20's and 30's are not good enough to win games against good sides, this failure to carry on also stems from a lack of complete preparation, this is a problem the Club faces from 2nd Grade down not just 3rd Grade.

Grade cricket is not about just turning up to training twice a week, doing as little as possible without getting caught and then turning up and playing on Saturdays.

Training must simulate match conditions, at least a match level of intensity, only then will these disciplines become natural in matches. Players must also turn up to matches in a physical state to play the game, too many times this season did we have individuals turn up after nights of "less than perfect preparation". In fact, unfortunately most of the transgressors will read this report and have a laugh about it and not really care about the team mates and district that they have let down. They must realise that their "lifestyle" for the whole week will affect their ability to perform at the optimum level on match days.

On the positive side, there have been some outstanding improvers pass through 3rd Grade this year. Adam Parkinson and Craig Currie were our outstanding performers of the season, both genuine all-rounders it provides great strength to any side when two of your top five bats are also your main strike bowlers.

Cuzza who shows a hardness of a seasoned grade cricketer at still such a young age dominated with both bat and ball this season, and his ton against last year's premiers, Easts was one of the highlights of the season. Parko's leggies improved every game and he rightfully finished the season in 2's with five wickets on debut. His undoubted natural ability with the bat will flourish when he learns to control his innings better.

Rohan Buls proved too quick and too hostile for most bats in 3's after being promoted from 4's, his whole hearted efforts were a captain's delight as he would literally "run through brick walls" for you to coin an old cliché.

Andrew Hodgson also passed through 3's on his way to establishing himself in 2's and also proved a great team man and asset to the Club. Elliot Leahey rounded up the quicks and proved a valuable member of the side in his first year in Grade cricket, a disciplined athlete he is constantly learning game by game and visibly improved as the season progressed.

Undoubtedly the biggest highlight for me this season was Cameron Lawes' seven wicket haul against Easts on a very batsman friendly wicket at Grahams. Lawesy rightfully didn't spend much time in 3's, the determination and will to win shown on that day (and at every practise session!) will ensure his success. A great example of the discipline and determination required to succeed at this level.

My vice-captain, Scotty Fitzsimmons, showed glimpses of what he is capable of on a handful of occasions this year, 75no with 15 boundaries against Gordon was pretty good to watch to say the least. Again as with a few other batsmen in the side, a bit of extra discipline whilst out in the middle will see him score many more runs. Arguably the best fielder in the Club, he was the heartbeat of the side and I must thank him sincerely for the support he has shown me this season. It was great to see him back in the groove with his offies during the last few games of the season.

Shamie Iqbal joined 3's mid way through the season and became an invaluable member of the side, a "young" veteran, he added much needed stability to our middle order, again along with Fitzsy a dynamic fielder. What a combination they made as we executed run outs at will, they both made fielding at the "sand pit" look easy.

Forrester Leahey, whilst unfortunately coming down from 2's, also made valuable contributions with both bat and ball. Forry, like most bats in the side has to make a conscious effort to carry on after making starts invariably getting out after effortlessly cruising to 20 odd. He also developed into a terrific partnership breaking bowler, his competitiveness on the field made him an invaluable asset. He has shown he has the ability to play 1st Grade, some hard work in the off season will see him being considered again. Graham Turner after promising plenty early in the season in 4's took a while to get settled into 3's, but eventually cracked it for a big one last game, batting second under pressure in a one dayer against Norths, he carried his bat for 94no in what will be one of his most memorable innings.

Further proof of the fact that a bit of application and dedication will get you a long way in this Club can be found in the results from Joel Mason and Drew Dickson, both these young guys have worked hard this year and made the most of their limited opportunities earlier in the season in 3's. They were rewarded for their tenacity with permanent positions towards the end of the season and both performed beyond expectations. Joel's 100 against Parramatta in the second innings was his coming of age, and Drew's 60 in the second last round as well as steering us to victory in the last will leave him no doubt that he can perform in this grade. Both players also filled the role of all-rounders and contributed when called upon.

Speaking of dedication, few train harder and are more dedicated to the cause than young Josh Peterson, he easily took the step up to 3's and kept brilliantly, considering he is only 17, this was a terrific effort. Knowing Joshy, he will work hard over the winter and will be very hard to dislodge next year and with a further year of maturing under his belt, he will put pressure on the Glassocks for years to come!

I must thank again all the players for their support and loyalty throughout the season, it was an exceptionally happy and social side with most of the boys continuously reminding me of my age, especially when we bonded at certain venues throughout the district, especially one night we will all remember at the Jet Club!!!

Thanks to Donny for all he did for the team, it wasn't until his health was not at its best and he could not get to the games that we realised all that he did. Also, thanks to Ron Holmes who always helped me out and took some of the responsibilities off my shoulders.

This side being such a young side, will most likely be predominantly in 3's together again next year, and will benefit from some of the tough times this year and take the next step.

Thanks again to everyone at the Club, and it will be with great pride that I will always be able to say, "I was captain of a team representing Manly-Warringah".

If we are to be a threat next season, we have to start the season where we finished off at the end of this season.






