125th ANNUAL REPORT

To the members of Manly-Warringah District Cricket Club Inc:

The Management Committee has pleasure in submitting for your consideration the 125th Annual report and Financial Statement.

The Club entered teams in the five Sydney Cricket Association Grade competitions, as well as the Limited Overs Competition, the Poidevin Gray, Green Shield Competitions and the Sydney Masters Competition.

Our players and officials honoured the Club's 125 years history of competition by capping a splendid season with a last round, five grades clean sweep (the third for the season), winning the SCA Club Championship for the fourth time in our illustrious history, with firsts and thirds being minor premiers and fourths in the finals. That night we shared and celebrated the achievements with many venerable, former MWDCC players and officials at the magnificent, unforgettable dinner that coincided brilliantly with the claiming of the Championship. The traditional late night, minimalist lap of Manly Oval sealed a memorable, superb season for the players.

First grade came storming back from a lean previous season, under the successful consensual leadership style and discernment of new captain Peter Procopis, achieving five outrights, defeating last year's premiers twice outright, claiming the minor premiership and leaving us memories of some passionate contests. We congratulate Peter on his marriage and wish him further success with his university studies, thank him for his captaincy and hope that he enjoys his cricket after relinquishing the captaincy to concentrate more on other aspects of his life. While the many outstanding individual performances and match results are outlined elsewhere, it is important to acknowledge the efforts of our two Blues legends who have remained steadfastly loval to the club. They have contributed quality performances in matches and have passed on encouragement and wisdom to our developing players. Superb allrounder Shawn Bradstreet almost singlehandedly accounted for Randwick-Petersham (113 &4-22) and Eastern Suburbs (130 & 4-45) in passing the club 4000 runs and 250 wickets milestones. Shawn's outstanding club efforts were rewarded in becoming the runnerup in the prestigious, SCA, SMH O'Reilly Medal award. Congratulations also to Shawn and Catherine on the birth of their second child Dylan. Master batsman Matthew Phelps gave the team a huge impetus to the season start with two blistering innings, 144* & 136 against Wests and Penrith. In an outstanding season he broke his own club first grade aggregate record compiling 944 runs and passed the club milestone of 5000 runs. Congratulations also to Matthew and Tamara on the birth of their first child Thomas. Our newly capped Blues Pura Cup player, Mark Cameron, bowled magically to claim 67 wickets, including a match shattering 8-34 against North Sydney. It was great to welcome back Jamie Heath after injuries and note his club spirit in unselfishly captaining fifths during his recovery period, and then claim 38 wickets in firsts when they really counted, in his usual menacing manner. Blues Colts players Ryan Bonner and Mark Faraday (also Blues U19s) contributed strongly. Congratulations to Mark on his award of the highly prestigious 2003 Sir Donald Bradman Scholarship. Congratulations also to budding first graders Shane Cleary and Michael Cosentino on their Blues U19s selection. Rookies Andrew Lindsay and Peter Jacka also showed their class and promise on debut.

The excitement and success of our players rewarded the efforts of our tireless and peerless director of coaching Mike Pawley in his second year at the helm, the true heart beat of the Club. Players matured, built on their sense of belonging and pride in the positive club culture and came to know themselves and their strengths better and played more confident and attacking cricket in the spirit Mike has embedded deeply in the club. We are so fortunate to have Mike with us as benefactor, guide and coach. Mike's use of innovative counselling work, utilising Marco Vesse's innovative martial arts preseason conditioning work, photographic analysis and video coaching techniques involving former club great Mark O'Neill were very effective. Mal Elliot's expert coaching work, particularly with our 'keepers and third and fourth grades, was another key factor enabling our players to unleash their capabilities and enjoy success. Mal's extreme efforts were rewarded in his award of Clubman of the Year.

We congratulate our captains for backing the club's non-sledging policy. At the end of the season we maintained our positive record with no player citations, few blemishes, but with plenty of commendations for the way we blended enjoyment with honest aggressiveness in the field, culminating in a season to remember. We also congratulate the many umpires, administrators and the other clubs who worked against the vulgarity of on-field personal abuse that threatens to harm the competition. We commend the SCA Committee's introduction of first grade post-match discussions between captains and umpires which have proved to be a most positive step forward.

When Richard Fry moved up to firsts Mark McInnes accepted the captaincy of seconds. While they had a lean season in terms of points, Mark's professionalism was evident as he worked hard to keep spirits up and the lads came back to assist the club with the clean sweep in the last round. There were some patches of brilliance and a number of players promise to press hard claims for higher levels next season

Third's captain John Warn proved that positive thinking is a vital thing of the mind that can work so effectively for a team. It also contributed towards his award of SCA Captain of the Year. His implementation of the non sledging approach was acknowledged as a key factor that fostered enjoyable and profitable cricket as they swept to the minor premiership, aided by some excellent individual performances by the club's Player's Player of the Year Warren Evans and the Gaetan Juul./ Jimmy Castrisos and Brian Clemow/John Warn's club record partnerships.

Fourths came from sixth place to be very worthy grand finalists under the confident and astute captaincy of Paul Brenner. The younger players developed strongly in a team that had its own way of never yielding to circumstances or giving in when the chips seemed to be down. 

2nd GRADE REPORT 2002/03 SEASON

Frustrating, trying, experience, fun, enjoyable, crazy, loose. These are the words that describe season 2002/03 for the MWDCC 2nd Grade team. In a Club Championship year, there were only limited celebrations for the second graders.

In a season with little return, the lessons learned go beyond just results. With only five (5) victories this season, there were plenty of times where we questioned our motives for playing this great game.

The first four games brought no return for the Manly boys with three (3) losses and one (1) draw. The Randwick – Petersham game saw Morgan Youell steer the team to its first victory.

A dominant display against North Sydney secured our third victory on the trot. Things were looking up!

The turning point for the season came during the Easts game. Chasing 225, we were 2/60 overnight but were bowled out for 185. Victory here would have sent us to Christmas with four wins and still in touch with the leaders.

The Sutherland game was possibly our finest hour. They posted 200 with Lamb and Lindsay taking 3 wickets each. Overnight we were in a solid position 5/119, however, we collapsed to be all out for 161, a deficit of 39. A Lamby (6/54) led revival in their second innings saw Sutherland reach only 114. Needing about 4 an over for victory, we finished 3/154 resulting in an amazing victory for the Manly boys.

Our final game was when the Manly machine flexed its muscle. Whilst the bowlers had done the job all season it was up to the batsmen to stand up. Winning the toss, we set Campbelltown a target of 238 for victory, McInnes (76) and Cozza (65*). Lamby (4/24) and Shane Cleary (3/22) destroyed the Campbelltown top order on the bowler friendly wicket with Det Jacka (3/13) cleaning up the tail. Campbelltown, blown off the park for 63. This victory, on a par with the Sutherland game, proved crucial to our clean sweep of Round15 and ultimately the 2002/03 Club Championship.

Throughout the year we tried many things, even running backwards around Manly oval, in the search for victory. At times the ugly duckling of the club, the 2nd graders showed true character dominating Campbelltown in the final game. We played to our potential and it almost made up for a pretty ordinary season.





4th GRADE REPORT 2002/03 SEASON

For the second successive year 4th grade were runners up. These were both in the first session and would have turned the game completely. Waddo had a solid year with the bat but I know he's capable of a 600 run season next year! Ben King is a class player who had a tough season. Ben's health caused his season to be interrupted and this hindered his confidence when he returned to cricket. I could see the frustration of playing at lower standard than he was capable and it's great credit to Ben that he stuck at it until his class shone through in the semi and final. Ben offered some great support to me and was always thinking of ways to get batsmen out and take an advantage over the opposition. A first grader of the future.

Russell Parker had a difficult season arriving at a new club as a keeper yet not keeping all season and batting in every position from 1 to 8 but you would never hear any complaints. I think Russell is a better player than we saw of him this year, his innings of 49 against Sutherland requiring a run a ball was full of intelligent and classy play.

You could always count on Michael to get a few wickets early. 


