President's Report

Our final Board meeting of the year was held in unique circumstances – our first "virtual" Board meeting in our 142 year history as we all dialled into Zoom for an hour finale!

To date, fortunately none of our players or club members have been physically affected by the virus, so we all hope it stays that way and everyone remains fit and healthy.

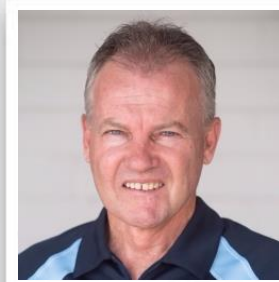
I do unfortunately need to elaborate a little on the impact COVID-19 will have on us. I hate being negative in these reports and even more so at a time like this, but the fact is, most clubs will be impacted and we are no exception. Unfortunately, several of our very loyal sponsors have suffered enormously already, so our sponsorship income will be affected next season – however we will continue to support our valued partners and do anything we can to assist them. And it is still unknown whether our grant funding will be reduced. But either way, the club is looking at a significant reduction in income.

Fortunately, the club is in a healthy financial position, as the Board have been very strategic over the past 7 years, ensuring we had planned properly for a "rainy day" – we just didn't ever envisage that it would be a pandemic. We will get through this, but there will be forced changes and increased costs next season, to ensure we don't eat too much into our cash reserves.

To cricket now and onto the positive stuff.

If I'd been asked to write this report at the Christmas break, it would have been very different to what you're about to read, as we sat 16th in the Club Championship (men) at that stage. Despite another excellent pre-season, for some unknown reason, our results were really poor across most of the first half of the season.

But we certainly atoned for that after the Christmas break and incredibly were able to climb up the ladders in every grade to finish the season in 5th place in the Club Champs – an amazing comeback that really showcased the fighting Manly spirit!

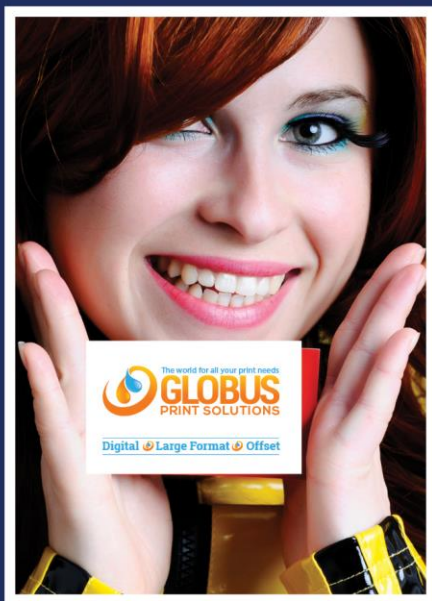

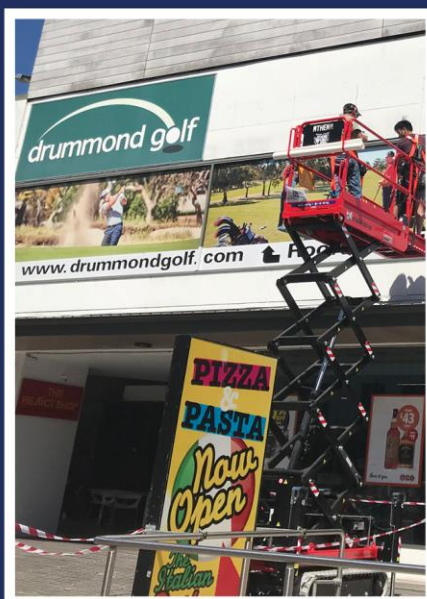

Club Coaches Report

At the start of season, we had a clear objective to improve each grade's finishing position on the competition table from the previous year, as well as claiming the Club Championship title. The approach to achieve these Club results was to improve team results and for this to happen the focus was on improving individual results. To facilitate players to grow and develop their cricket, each player engaged in a pre-season one on one goal setting process. Specifically, players were given the task of identifying their ambitions, strengths, areas for development and to then set specific season goals. They were asked to take ownership of their training regime and design a plan of what they wanted to undertake and achieve at Tuesday and Thursday training sessions. To further improve Club results, another priority identified was to ensure that both 1st and 2nd grade were accommodated with coaching staff to support them on game days.

With these objectives in place it was imperative that the pre-season provided players with the opportunity to be best prepared and ready for Round 1. This was certainly achieved as Simon Couch, with the support of David Gardiner, delivered a pre-season program that ensured players' levels of strength and conditioning and skill development were of an extremely high standard. With a focus on core strength and technique, the pre-season provided by Simon and David has for two consecutive years been very conducive to preventing injuries. This was complimented with the quality batting sessions run by Bobby Rollins and Sam Mesite which gave players the opportunity to build good foundational batting techniques. A very welcome addition to the pre-season, and entire season, was throwing coach Mike O'Neill. Mike's input has been invaluable in developing and strengthening the standard of throwing of our players at every level. It was very encouraging to see so many players across all grades attending the pre-season sessions, a great sign of player commitment and connectedness.

The pre-season culminated in some very worthwhile trial match weekends, both at home and north of Sydney. Despite being affected by weather, 1st and 2nd grades' trip to Toronto saw a very competitive T20 match played. The rain provided a great

opportunity for the players to bond, play games and better understand their favourite pastime using the letters of the alphabet! The



weather was more favourable for 3rd and 4th grades' weekend in Toronto and allowed for two highly competitive games to be played. Off the field we witnessed the wonderful comradery that exists among this group of players which contributed to an outstanding weekend. Our 5th grade junior talent ventured to Mandalong to enjoy the hospitality of Stirling Hammond and they showed a lot of promise with both bat and ball, giving selectors a lot of options to consider for Round 1. A big thank you to the club for providing the financial support to allow these very worthwhile trial weekends to take place. They also would not have happened without David Gainsford's fantastic organisation and planning, as well as the wonderful hospitality of the Toronto Cricket Club. At the conclusion of the pre-season we felt we were very well prepared for the start of the season.

1st Grade. Despite the challenges of having a number of representative players involved in State cricket, Big Bash and other representative commitments, there was a strong belief we could manage the disruptions to player availability and perform with a high degree of success. We would like to thank Cricket NSW for making these players more readily available this season around their representative commitments. Still, this unfortunately did not translate to winning performances as much as expected, particularly in two day cricket. The loss of representative players did however provide the opportunity for three younger players to make their First Grade debut this season – congratulations to Griffin Lea, Matthew Brewster and Isaiah Vumbaca on successfully stepping up to the top grade.

In the T20 competition, the team performances better reflected the ability within the squad, with some outstanding round results culminating in a semi-final appearance, which disappointingly ended in a loss to Sydney at Drummoyne. In the one day competition, the team enjoyed a top eight position

finishing 7th, which was a significant improvement from last year's 18th position. The opportunity to progress further was taken away with the finals match against Sydney washed out.

Despite an improvement in position from last year's 14th to this year's 11th in the two day competition, the season was still an underachievement for the calibre of players in the side, and disappointing as this is the fifth season in a row that this has been the case. Whilst it was encouraging to see the team finish the season strongly, showing what it is truly capable of, this standard needs to be evident across the course of the entire season. Since the end of the season, we have spoken to all players in this year's 1st grade squad regarding performances in two day cricket. We are heartened by their honest self-reflection and genuine desire to rectify this performance trend and have been able to start putting in place solutions to address this for next season.

A very big thank you to Jay Lenton for his captaincy of this side. Jay has a very sound understanding of the game and works hard to get the best out of his players. We would also like to acknowledge the valuable contribution of Michael Visser who performed admirably as stand-in captain during Jay's Big Bash absence.

2nd Grade. Reflecting on 2nd grade's season one thought keeps haunting the memory – "what if?". What if there was 10 minutes more light; 5 minutes more rain; one degree less heat; or one more over before the smoke rolled in? On so many occasions this season, the team was painfully close to a first innings or outright victory before circumstances beyond their control cruelly took the opportunity away from them. Nonetheless, that is cricket and we will never use it as an excuse. It just makes finishing 7th, and so close to a finals position, harder to deal with. Hopefully next year we will see these players seize opportunities at crucial times in matches to ensure external factors don't influence the results.

Congratulations to skipper Andrew Jamieson on continuing to improve this team. Apart from advancing the team's position on the ladder from last season he has continued to develop the outstanding team dynamics which has been evident for several years. Andrew is working hard to get players in this grade ready to step up and perform in the top grade.

We look forward to this trend continuing and for those close games to be converted to victories and the team playing finals cricket next year.

3rd Grade. For the second year under the leadership of Nick McLachlan, 3rd grade finished in the top six particularly off the back of a very strong start to the season. Had the finals gone ahead we were confident this team were a real threat of taking the title. A top six side for the duration of the competition, and blessed with players of enormous talent and higher grade and finals experience, their chances were promising. Their goal is to build on recent success and dominate next season.

A huge congratulations to Nick McLachlan for his many years of service to the club. From a local junior cricketer to a First grade premiership winning player and finally an outstanding 3rd grade captain. It has been a pleasure seeing him develop as a player and leader in the club. We wish him all the best overseas. Thank you to Sam Hole for captaining the side commendably at the back end of the season.

4th Grade. Having reached finals cricket for the past six seasons, this grade has been one of the strongest performing and most consistent teams in the club in recent years. It was not surprising but nonetheless very heartening that they continued the trend and finished the season in 5th place. Congratulations to Tony Clark and the Bankstown team for winning the Albert Cup. Unfortunately, due to another slow start, 2nd Grade was forced to play catch up for the majority of the season. When you're chasing points in the last few rounds, weather generally plays its part and that was no different in 2019/20. We had some rotten luck throughout the season, but also cost ourselves in a number of matches.

After being hammered by St George in Round 1 we proved to be up for the contest in most games for the rest of the season. Again, consistency proved to be our biggest challenge. Our batting numbers were extremely disappointing, and we let sides off the hook at crucial times. The 140 run, 10th wicket partnership against Easts was a low point.

On the positive side our bowling group was super consistent, often keeping us in games and producing wickets when it counted. To have five bowlers average under 20 shows the depth we have in our pace bowling ranks. Special mention to Jake Carden, Andrew Hicks and Taylor Beatty who bowled their hearts out, week in week out and led the side with great conviction.

To be a force to be reckoned with in this competition we need to develop consistency and be tougher in the big moments, particularly with the bat. Too often in the last two seasons we have lost wickets in pairs and put pressure on our middle and lower order to get us to a competitive total. While batting to 11 is a huge advantage, I believe it can often be our downfall, as batsmen think they can leave it to someone else to score the runs. The handful of games we had wickets in hand after tea or in the backend of a one-day innings, showed the damage we can do.

The comradery and team spirit within this group is second to none. We have blokes who consistently turn up ready to play for and enjoy each other's company on and off the field. The challenge is to

harness that comradery and put it into consistent performances on the field. It has been an absolute pleasure leading the team this season and I look forward to doing it all again next year.

Having played at two strong SCA clubs, I feel it's important to mention just how lucky the MWDC playing group are to have such great support from the large number of hard-working volunteers we have at this club.

To Skid, Roy, Loz, and the entire coaching staff, thank you for your unwavering support throughout the season. To Frase, Gains, Steve, Scotty and the rest of the management committee, thank you for all your hard work and dedication again this season. The time and effort put in behind the scenes is certainly appreciated by the playing group and we sincerely say thank you for helping make this the best club in Sydney. A special shout out to Joel Mason for coordinating proceedings with the playing group and among other things helping produce the best social media of any amateur sporting club in the country.

Finally, to all the amazing hard-working volunteers this club has, I say thank you. We consistently have 10-12 of you there at each training session and I can assure you no other club has this type of support on a weekly basis.

Max Webber. For the second season in a row Max finished as the leading run scorer in 2nd Grade. For a bloke who had previously opened the bowling and batted middle to lower order that's no mean feat. Elliott Herd. In his second year with the club Herdy again proved himself to be a quality all-rounder. Elliott averaged 42 in his seven games for 2nd Grade, showing plenty of fire power at the top of the order. A player that has all the shots, Elliott's next challenge is to start turning his 50's into 100's and cement a place in the top grade. A proven match winner with the ball, who consistently asks questions of the batsmen.

Sam Webber. Another great team man, Schwebbs played matches in 1st, 2nd and 3rd grade this season. A fine gloveman who very rarely misses an opportunity. First of all, congratulations to Sydney Uni on being first past the post this year and taking home the 3rd Grade title. It's a shame we weren't able to take them on in the Quarter final, given we beat them comprehensively earlier in the season and were one of the few teams to do so all year, in what would've been a really tight, high quality finals series.

Secondly, thank you to all of the team managers, scorers, coaching staff, support staff, the committee and everyone else who makes this club run year in, year out. The commitment and resources that go into this club to allow 55 guys to get on the park every weekend and everything that comes with it are always appreciated. Special thanks to young Will Gustafson, Dave Gardiner, and Roy Vumbaca who provide great support specifically to the 3rd Grade side and to Sam Hole for stepping in as captain throughout the season.

The 2019/2020 season was, in my mind, very much planned to be all about continuity, hard work, and growth from the solid foundations and development set in the back half of the 2018/2019 season. We had an excellent squad of rapidly improving players, a quality core of leaders who I can truly say are all friends outside of the Saturday 11 – 6 grind, which definitely makes succeeding all the more exciting.

Cricket is a balance between skill and luck. We had high hopes of winning the competition and were very strongly positioned in 2nd place until what we could term as a sequence of genuine bad luck from round 12 onwards (called off for heat, then rained off the next week against the 20th placed side, coming up against a driven ex-professional cricketer the next game, rained off from a good position in round 15) and some poor execution to settle for a draw in round 14 saw us drop to 6th place by the end of the regular season.

Statistically, it was all for nothing in the end, but I do believe with a few different turns of fortunes and

different global circumstances, this team certainly could have achieved the goal it set out to at the start of the season.

Outside of statistics and trophies, I do believe this season was one where hard work paid off for a lot of the young graduates. My primary focus as a captain is to ask the players to set themselves tough goals and to commit to a primary discipline or role within the side to promote major contributions (5fa's, 100's), over bit part ones (2fa and 20). This season saw that approach pay off for a few players in particular with multiple players going on to make their First grade debuts (Matt Brewster, Griffin Lea, Izzy Vumbaca), score big runs more consistently (Jacob O'Sullivan, Griffin Lea, Izzy Vumbaca, Jordan Daly, Zach Trewartha, and even Ned Hole once he figures out how to get past 60) and go from bowling good spells to driving the team throughout the day (Michael Counsell, Josh Seward, Josh Wigney, Alex Bain, Lachie Trewartha).

We went a second season in a row undefeated at home (last 3rd Grade loss at home was January 2018), with the new, modern Grahams turning into a true fortress. Captaincy is also definitely powered by the leadership crew around you, and the side was much stronger for the maturing cricket brains and wise words of Zach Trewartha, Sam Hole, Michael Counsell and Josh Wigney, the return of Jordan Daly and the arrival of the white-collar Pom Neal Prowse who all set an excellent example for the younger players coming through the ranks.

We also saw some really exciting development of some of our younger talent this year. Josh Seward is one of the best young fast bowlers coming through the ranks and consistently had everyone in the competition hopping around including several ex-professionals. Joel Davies continued his development into a superstar and his approach to batting matured significantly. Jake Osborne made a well-deserved 3rd Grade debut after some rave reviews from 4th Grade

and Lachie Trewartha continued to improve all facets of his game, taking a few decent hauls in his first season of 3rd Grade.

The season ended with another ripping tour down the Northern Beaches, karaoke and Chinese (for some) and a night on the dancefloor (for even fewer) and was a fitting and early end to what was another great season.

Zach Trewartha [366 runs at 30.50]

This guy continues to improve steadily year after year into one of the club's most important middle-grade cricketers. He sets the tone and competitive edge for the side both at training and on the field, and demonstrated this with several key innings, in particular in round 15 against Parramatta. If he can turn his 60s or 70s into 100s, he can be a high-quality number 6 and push up the grades in the coming years. People forget he hit the winning runs in a First grade T20 at 18 (though he will tell you)!

Jordan Daly [353 runs at 50.43]

It was amazing to have JD the big goober back in the side this year. He is a batsman of high-quality and demonstrated this by averaging over 50 for the year. Played several crucial knocks, and was robbed of a match-winning innings against Bankstown when he stood head and shoulders above everyone else on a tough deck. A great leader and a true eccentric.

Jacob O'Sullivan [241 runs at 60.25]

This was the year Sully realised how good he was. After scoring his first ever hundred last year, he scored two more this year and ended up being a critical component of the Second grade charge to the finals, spending most of the season there. Averaged 60 in 3's which is proof he is way too good and is also one of the best fielders in the club. Hard work is the only thing that sits between him and a consistent First grade spot in the next few years.

Joel Davies [200 runs at 40, 9 wickets at 19]

Not much to say about Joel. Incredibly mature for a 16 year old and for someone that plays so much cricket, he still tries to impact the game every time he plays. His batting stepped up a gear this year in terms of how he compiles an innings and his spin bowling also came a long way which means he is turning into a genuine all-rounder.

Tom Kaye [189 runs at 63, 3 wickets at 21]

No doubt disappointed to start the year in Third grade and that decision can push players either two ways. Tom responded in the best manner possible, providing crucial leadership around the group and playing two high-class innings to beat Mosman and Sydney Uni who both finished in the top 3. Went straight back up to 2's, as he should. If he approaches every innings like he did the first few rounds, with clarity, he will get back into First grade in the coming years.

Samuel J. Hole [177 runs at 16, 2 wickets at 20]

Statistically, it was a tough season for Sammy. The first season of full-time work and cricket is hard to balance for anyone and he just lost confidence in his batting for a stretch of time. True to himself though, he didn't let it affect his ability to drive the side with his intangibles and energy, and still managed to play two crucial innings that could've been match-winning throughout the year. A great bloke and a future leader of the club, he sets an excellent example for the younger players and has a great passion for Manly Cricket.

Griffin Lea [173 runs at 29, 7 wickets at 27]

An amazing new addition to the club, Griff had a dream start to his Manly career, scoring an impeccable hundred and taking a 5fa against Sydney Uni all in his first few games. Immensely talented, he struggled with focus and a clear role for the remainder of the season, which all comes down to understanding who he is as a cricketer and how he can impact games. For me, he has the technique to be a long term number 3 in First grade and will work to add more craft to his bowling. Could be a great change and one-day/T20 bowler if he adds variation. Great hunger and passion for the game and culturally slid right in, feeling like he's been a Manly boy all his life.

Hamish Starr [154 runs at 51.33]

It was a shame to lose Starry at the halfway point of the season, but a great move for him and his life! Managed to score his first hundred (130 off 68 balls) in an amazing counter-attacking performance against Campbelltown to turn a poor position into an outright victory. All the best Starry.

Ned Hole [127 runs at 18.17]

A bit like his brother, Ned had a statistically tough season. He had a bit of bad luck early in the year, with a few poor decisions going against him and being caught down the leg side and was never really able to get going. He did score back to back 50s towards the back end of the season which showed that his best moments come when his batting is at its most simple. If he learns to harness that similar to how Sul has, he has the potential to have a breakout year next year. Always works hard, always puts in around the team and wants to improve. Great to see.

Matt Brewster [125 runs at 21]

Great season personally for Matty in making his First grade debut and found himself between 1s, 2s, and 3s all year due to his abilities to score quickly in the ODI format and Jay's BBL commitments. A pure stroke maker who can be destructive on his day, if he can learn to harness this and keep simplicity in his decision making he can turn 30s and 40s into run-a-ball hundreds. His wicket keeping also came a long way this year as he learnt to add energy and really drive the team, which was feedback put to him at the start of the year by myself and Jamo, so a huge credit for that. This definitely paid off in his First grade performances where his wicket keeping was praised off some pretty quick bowling.

Izzy Vumbaca [61 runs at 20, 5 wickets at 27]

When they join us, we set them on a path to become better cricketers, but we focus strongly on them becoming better people. Young boys, some aged just 13 or 14 were given opportunities to play grade cricket. No-one expected immediate success but Rochy demanded commitment, effort and desire. Some tasted success early while others will need more time to develop their skills, confidence and self-assurance. Those with the greatest drive, work ethic and will to succeed, will continue to grow.

Unfortunately, the weather had a dominant effect on the outcome of our season. We had games washed out, spent hours on the Supersoppor to get a game started and lost valuable playing time. We played in temperatures of 44 degrees and battled choking smoke from the bushfires. Our match at Benson’s Lane in late December, was played in stifling heat

with smoke blanketing the oval from the fires just across the Nepean River and was really testing for our young team. The Skipper was immense in that game. He bowled 25 overs taking 5/80 as he shielded the boys from the oppressive conditions and the bombardment from two players who scored over 200 runs between them.

There were games in which we were soundly beaten but others in which we just could not close it out to clinch the win. We scored 322 against Easts but were unable to take the last two wickets for the win. Our agonising loss to North Sydney was by a single run, in which we lost our last wicket with 10 balls to spare. Against Wests, we scored 196 but couldn’t bowl them out and they cruised past us 4 down. Yet we dominated at other times. The outright win against Campbelltown, with Roop Dhillon’s sensational debut figures of 6/33 and 3/21, netted maximum points. Roop followed up with 5/46 against UNSW restricting the students to 197 in reply to our imposing total of 281. The Fairfield game was a lost opportunity having scored 256 only to have day two washed out. Similarly, we had bowled Parramatta out for 166 but the weather had the final say without us facing a ball.

The pleasing aspect of our pathway program is that through the combined experience gained from the Green Shield campaign and playing 5th Grade, the boys matured towards the end of the season. They grew in confidence and self-belief within this positive mentoring environment and the results improved accordingly. This maturity was very evident in those who came through Green Shield and 5th Grade last year or the year before. Oscar Lucius, Ollie Melville, Luke Morley, Evan Dunnachie, James Buchanan before his injury and Jordan Brewster all made significant on-field contributions and important roles welcoming the younger boys into our team.

The Finals campaign could have been very interesting had it gone ahead, as we were playing good cricket at the right time of the season.

There were areas which let us down at times and on which we need to focus next season as we strive to develop our players to be the best cricketers they can be. Our batting lacked consistency and resolve at times. Too often players got a start but got out in the 20s, 30s and 40s. There were no centuries registered all year by any of our players, Jack Melchior's 75 was our top score. The bowling at times lacked purpose and precision. Wides killed us in the one day games and this will require a lot of effort. Pleasingly as the season progressed this improved. Catching was our Achilles heel however, as we ended up putting down far too many chances.

Almost 30 players turned out for 5th Grade during the course of the season. With the team so young, drawing consistently from the Green Shield team, the selectors invited some experienced players to help Andrew guide the boys. Daryl Buchanan, John Warn, Matty White and Billy D'Arcy all assisted at times.

The coaching staff and volunteers were immensely supportive all year, both at training and on game day. The boys were made to feel welcome and received a great deal of encouragement. There was always someone there to assist these young players. Towards the end of the season and the drive towards the Semis, Skid, Roy and Lozza really stepped up their support for this team which was greatly appreciated.

Andrew Rochford. Captained the Fabulous Fifts in all 14 matches played. Andrew bowled a mammoth 176 overs, led our bowling taking 30 wickets at 18.93 each with best figures of 5/80. He also made a huge contribution with the bat, scoring 315 runs at an average of 28. He scored two 50s but often went on the attack when we were getting bogged down and took the initiative away from the bowling team. Rocky is an inspirational leader from which all of the boys have learned a lot this year.

Oscar Lucius. Oscar, just one year out of Green Shield, took his game to another level. Played 13 matches topping our batting with 401 runs at an average of 33.42. Oscar scored two 50s and consistently finished in the 20s and 30s. As a wicket keeper, he improved out of sight taking 12 catches and completing 2 stumpings. He had an excellent season contributing enormously to the team and has huge potential for the years to come.

Oliver Melville. Ollie played in all 14 matches and is another who just a year earlier was learning his craft under Gainsy and Roy in Green Shield. During the off-season, Ollie put on size and strength which showed in his all-round game. His accurate medium pace bowling had become quicker and he challenged the bat consistently. He bowled 62 overs taking 9 wickets at 22.89. His spell against Sydney at Ryde Oval was mesmerising. With the bat he really stepped up scoring 245 runs at an average of 20.42 with the highlight a brutal 62 in very quick time against Easts. A dedicated trainer and good fielder, Ollie took some great catches and runouts. I look forward to watching him move up through the grades next year.

Luke Morley. Moz played some games with us last year in his Green Shield season but came back having had a growth spurt over winter. He played in 12 of our matches and bowled the most overs after Skipper Rocky, with 69. Luke's leg spin improved steadily taking 6 wickets at 37 with a best haul of 3/50. He now has a gun arm and was our best outfielder. Another keen trainer, he will get his rewards from his work ethic and dedication.

Jack Melchior. Gentleman Jack had 100 runs in the bank from his first two innings, scoring 31 in our win against Sydney Uni and his highest, a brilliant 75 against Easts. He really got our attention. A dislocated finger put him out for nearly a month and Skipper Gummer, recognising his ability, kept stealing our rowdy opener to 4th Grade. Despite this, Jack played 9 matches for the Fighting Fives and scored 254 runs at 28.22 to be third in our aggregate behind Oscar and Doc. Jack is an old school opener who puts value on his wicket and works his way into an innings. Jack also took a couple of screamers in the slips and has enormous cricketing potential in his own quiet way.

Toby Laughton. Toby came to us from the Under 14's. Standing 6'2" at 13 years of age here is potential personified. Toby only played 8 games for fives, because, like Jack, Gums kept picking him in 4th Grade. Coached by Michael Visser, Toby has a good action, is an excellent listener and has learnt a lot in his first season of Green Shield and Grade cricket. Considering that at his age, the bowling restrictions are such that he can only bowl 4 overs in a spell and 10 for the day, it is testimony to his ability that Andrew bowled him for 56 overs. He was very economical, bowling at the stumps and took 9 wickets

at 15.89 with 2/8 his best. Batting 11 is an unenviable task but Toby did so 6 times, was not out on 4 of those occasions, scoring 24 runs with 12* his best. He will develop into an all-rounder with maturity and experience. He is a pleasure to coach and have in a team. This young man is a player of the future.

Andrew Boulton. Speaking of Under 14's with huge potential, Andrew is half Toby's size but is also very talented. Andrew joined us during the Green Shield campaign and stayed for the next 8 games. He batted 7 times for 86 runs at 14.33 with a top score of 39*. He bowls accurate medium pacers which as he grows and matures will enhance his all-rounder status. He bats with a calmness and maturity which belies his age and is an excellent fielder. He is another to watch in years to come. Big future.

Josh Cooper. Josh is another boy from this year's Greenies who once he made his debut, made his mark. In just 7 innings he totalled 138 runs at 23 to rank 5th in our team. Josh's highest score of 63 against UNSW pipped his skipper by 1 run on the day. He also bowls accurate off spin with a best of 2/20. He is calm and considered in his approach and has a bright future with hard work.

Ky Broome. Another from Greenies, Ky came to us following some good scores for Warringah but found it difficult to replicate that success in grade. He played 7 games, scoring 70 runs at 11.67 with 30* his best. Ky is committed, trains hard and has desire to go with his talent. Next season should see that realised. Ky is a good fielder and bowls left arm tweakers which will add to his appeal as his career unfolds.

Jordan Brewster. Jordy has been with us since we won the premiership 2 years ago. He is now big, strong and bowls fast. Unfortunately we only had him for 6 games this year in which he took 2 wickets and batted 4 times for 59 runs at 19.67.

Roopmehar Dhillon. Another Under 14 Greenies product, Roop hit Grade cricket with a bang bowling the batter around his legs first ball with a big leggie. Another wicket 3 balls later, then 2 more in the next over. In two overs he'd taken 4 wickets, all bowled. Later in his spell Oscar snared a stumping and Roop finished the innings with a caught & bowled. 6/33. Campbelltown-Camden then followed on and he took a further 3/21. Throw in his 5/46 against UNSW and

in 6 games Roop came in second to Rochy with 18 wickets at 10.17. Hard work and concentration on control and Roop has a great future. Batting only 4 times he showed considerable ability with the bat as well, finishing unbeaten on 52 in the last game, underlying his all-rounder potential. Watch this space and remember this name.

Ned Healey. What a huge asset Ned was early in the season, contributing with bat, ball and in the field in all of the 6 games he played. Sadly for us, he went overseas at Christmas and was lost to the team. Up until then he had batted in the top order for 118 runs at 19.67 with 46 his highest. He opened the bowling as well and took 8 wickets at an average of 24 with 3/30 his best. An outstanding fielder he took catches and ran players out with a direct hit. Ned is a very accomplished all-rounder who would certainly have played higher grades had he stayed longer. I can't wait to have him back.

James Buchanan. Jimmy was with us for a few games last season in his Greenies year. He came back having grown in maturity, self-confidence and physicality. Unfortunately, James injured his hand after just 5 games and did not play again. He had scored 104 runs at 20.80 with 33 his best. It will be great to have a fit and more mature James Buchanan on deck next year.

Daryl Buchanan. Daryl played 5 games and experienced the pleasure of playing with his son James following on from recent names like Farrell and Trewartha. Not only is Daryl an excellent cricketer, he added enormously to the team in helping Rochy mould and mentor our young players. In 3 innings, Daryl scored 74 at 24.67 with a punishing 39 against UNSW a highlight. He was a huge asset to our team.

Darcy Fleming. For a boy to make Green Shield team and 5th Grade only two years after starting to play the great game of cricket, speaks volumes for his potential. Darcy played 5 games for us and is still raw while he learns the game but has a good action and can swing the ball both ways. As he develops physically and gains experience in the art of bowling, he will be rewarded.

Hayden Calvert. Hayden is another from Greenies who was given an opportunity and grabbed it with both hands. He only batted 3 times in the 4 games he played but showed a lot of promise. He scored 42

runs at 14 with a solid 21 his best. Hayden is an accomplished keeper but did not take the gloves with Oscar in our team. He showed that he is also an outstanding fielder. He is keen to learn, trains hard and has desire. Next season should see him blossom.

Lachlan Kerr. It was a joy to have Lachie come back to cricket this year. He started with me at Warringah at 13 but has grown into a fine athlete. He only played 3 games bowling express pace taking 2 wickets before Skipper Gummer tapped him on the shoulder never to be seen in 5th Grade again. Lachie also scored 62 runs at 31 with a scorching 23 against St George.

Evan Dunnachie. Evan graduated from Greenies last year and played some games for us then. This season it was great to have back, albeit for only 3 games in which he took 4 wickets at 26.50 with 2/34 his best. With the bat he scored 41 runs with 2 not outs so averaged 41. Tall and strong, I look forward to seeing his development over a full season.

John Warn. Warny gave us his time, enthusiasm, commitment and competitiveness on two occasions this season which is wonderful as he is based in Queensland these days. His contribution to the team was enormous and of great value to Andrew. We just love having Warny play in our team. We only saw a glimpse of the Warny of old in one innings of 21, but he did put on a fielding/catching clinic to inspire the boys. Come back next year Warny – all is forgiven!

Matt White. We were privileged to have the great Matt White play 2 games this year. In his first, against North Sydney on a damp day he was literally unplayable bowling at the stumps or in the corridor outside off. His first ball hit the stumps. From then it was caught behind, LBW, and 2 more caught for a haul of 5/19. In his two games Matt took 7 wickets at an astonishing average of 5.71. What's the plan for next year Matty? Love to see a few more guest appearances to mentor the boys on how to bowl at the stumps.

We were also lucky enough to have **Hurshwin Sharma, Liam Dinan, Sam Barnett, Lachlan Johnson, Aiden Bennett, Billy D'Arcy, Jake Osborne, Tom Wood and Reiley Dunlop** join us at various points throughout the season. Thank you all for your contributions to Phenomenal Fifts this year!

It was my great privilege to manage this team and assist Andrew in mentoring the transition into senior cricket of a wonderful group of young men. I thank Danny LeMoy also for his tireless assistance on game days at Mike Pawley Oval.

It is clear that we have an abundance of young talent coming through at Manly and I’m sure this group will be the nucleus of a dominant First grade side in the future.

Player Profiles

Andrew Boulton

A very handy medium pacer through the middle overs and a gun in all areas of the field.

Ky Broome

His power hitting abilities in the middle order showed with a run a ball 86 against Sydney, including some big sixes towards the tennis courts. Very good in the field, Ky regularly found himself on the boundary with a safe pair of hands and strong throw.

Hayden Calvert

Hayden was great to have as part of the Greenies squad this season and consistently performed with bat in hand. His 53 against Hawkesbury guided the team to a bonus point win, while he regularly got the side off to good starts at the top of the order, including 33 against Blacktown and 42 against Bankstown in the Quarter final. Match Summaries

Round 1 vs Blacktown

After months of preparation, the team descended on Fortress Manly Oval for their first game against a strong Blacktown side. Skipper Joel Davies started off with a win at the toss, electing to bat first. Hayden Calvert got the boys off to a solid start with 33, but couldn't find any support as the side limped to 6/80.

Finlay Thornton (73) and 13 year old Andrew Boulton (36) combined for a match winning 102 run partnership, starting off patiently to consolidate, before ramping up the tempo towards the end of the innings to help Manly reach 9/209. Darcy Fleming got the side off to the perfect start with two early wickets with hooping inswingers, before Toby Laughton and Hurshwin Sharma ran through the Blacktown middle order to have the visitors 7/60. Some dropped chances saw Blacktown's opener score a brutal 112, combining with the number nine for a 114 run partnership to bring them within 40 runs of victory. Ollie Kantor-Smith picked up the breakthrough with a safe catch from Josh Cooper at deep square, before a wicket to Hurshwin caught by Boulton at long on, and a run out to skipper Davies, saw Manly home by 22 runs.

Round 2 vs North Sydney

The side was full of confidence heading into the first away fixture of the season, against North Sydney. Skipper Joel Davies called incorrectly at the toss, with Norths electing to bat first on a flat Tunks Park wicket. Toby and Darcy started brilliantly, with Toby picking up an early LBW, before North Sydney began to build substantial partnerships. However, disciplined bowling from all bowlers meant Norths never got away. Joel, Roop and Hurshwin picked up important wickets, before Toby bowled a great spell at the death to restrict North Sydney to 7/222. Josh Cooper and Lachlan Johnson combined for a perfect start, putting on 93 before Lachlan was dismissed for an excellent 41. Blake McCarten showed promise in his first innings for the Tahs, before a mix up saw him run out for 12. This brought skipper Davies (47*) to the crease, who combined with Josh for another 93 run stand, working the good balls around and punishing the loose deliveries. Josh was heartbreakingly caught behind for a match winning 97 off 133, before Joel and Finlay peeled off the remaining runs to see Manly home by 7 wickets.

Round 3 vs Sydney

The team returned to Manly Oval to face Sydney in the first game of a two day double header. Skipper Davies won the toss and chose to bat on a very flat wicket. The start didn't go to plan with Lachlan, Josh and Blake gone early, before Joel and Finlay resurrected the innings with a 63 run partnership. Joel (52) brought up an excellent half century, before both he and Finlay went quickly. Ky Broome (86) and

Andrew (58) combined for a match winning 152 run partnership, both boys batting with great composure along with some brutal hitting. Tom Wood added some late fireworks with 14* off 5 balls, Manly finishing on 7/284. Some disciplined bowling saw Manly home by 40 runs with wickets to Hurshwin, Joel, Tom, Josh and Darcy, however a lack of discipline in the field saw the opposition get more runs than they should have in the end.

Round 4 vs Fairfield-Liverpool

Skipper Davies started off the day losing the toss and being sent into the field first. Hurshwin took the new ball with immediate success collecting an early wicket in a faultless opening spell. From then on, wickets fell at regular intervals with Davies the star with 3/32 off his 10 overs, plus a crucial run out to dismiss Fairfield's opener for 95. Ollie and Toby each chimed in with a wicket in a great bowling performance from the group, while spinners Raja and Joel bowled with great consistency and variation. Ollie was promoted up the order and showcased his potential with a solid 27, combining with Lachlan Johnson (41) for an excellent 63 run stand, with Lachlan taking a particular liking to the straight boundaries of Manly Oval, with eight 4's. However, regular wickets saw a few scares through the middle overs, with Davies again holding the side together with 38. When he was dismissed, the side six down with 40 to win, Andrew and Hayden combined for a crucial match winning partnership to guide the team home with calmness.

Round 5 vs Campbelltown-Camden

Davies walked to the toss with confidence after his Julio's team dismantled the Nerd's in the pre-game Vortex match, but this was quickly shut down as Campbelltown won the toss and elected to bat. Darcy picked up another early wicket, before Hurshwin broke an important partnership. Andrew came into the attack and dismissed both of Campbelltown's big guns. Some partnerships began to build, however Joel and Finlay controlled proceedings through the middle to stop the visitors getting away. The death bowling was also excellent, restricting Campbelltown to 212. In reply Josh and Lachlan departed early in the chase, before Blake and Joel combined for 74 runs to resurrect the innings. Blake was then out LBW for a gritty 38 and followed quickly by Finlay, before Ky made a quick 29 but was dismissed soon after. Joel then worked with the tail to edge the Tahs closer to victory, however just as partnerships with Andrew

and Tom built, both departed to some good bowling. Ultimately it was too much for the tail with Manly falling 12 runs short of the 213 run target. Skipper Davies playing an unbelievable innings of 81* to almost see his side home, but unfortunately ran out of partners.

Round 6 vs UNSW

Joel finally got his mathematical chance calculations correct, judging the coin toss perfectly. "Tails". "Tails it is". Breathing a sigh of relief, Joel elected to bat first against UNSW at David Phillips. Ollie returned to open with Josh Cooper, however both were out to some great bowling. Blake (25) and Joel revived the innings with a 43 run stand, before Finlay joined Joel and the two went about building another partnership. When Finlay departed for 15, Manly were 4/103 and things went pear shaped. Ky came and went, then Hayden was out first ball, leaving the team at 6/108. Tom Wood was aggressive with 19 before departing LBW, leaving Joel to go absolutely ballistic, hitting multiple towering sixes in a great innings to finish just short of an unbelievable hundred, not out on 98*. After UNSW started well, Toby was introduced and collected two big wickets. From this point, wickets fell regularly, with all bowlers contributing. Ollie and Toby picked up three wickets each, while Josh Cooper and the skipper collected two apiece. UNSW all out for 138, Manly home by 63 runs.

Round 7 vs Hawkesbury

Arriving to see the Hawkesbury River had made itself at home on Owen Earle Oval after consistent downpours of rain, the chance of getting a game in looked slim. However, the tireless efforts of the ground staff for 2.5 hours saw the toss at 12:20pm, skipper Davies calling incorrectly and the Tahs being sent into the field. Hurshwin and Darcy started off consistently, and after a steady start from Hawkesbury, Toby picked up the important breakthrough. Roop was introduced with immediate effect, bowling an unbelievable spell of leg spin to finish with 3/14 off 9 overs. He bowled with flight and guile, and heartbreakingly missed out on a hat trick with a dropped catch on the fence. From then wickets fell regularly, all bowlers chipping in, Davies with 2 fa, Wood and Sharma one each. A late partnership from the Hawks saw them finish 9/130 off their allocated 42 overs due to rain. Andrew was given the opportunity at the top of the order, but unfortunately was bowled early, followed not long after by Blake.

Hayden was holding strong, moving the score along, and combined with Davies (29 off 19) for a 51 run stand. When Joel fell pushing for the bonus point, Tom was pushed up the order and played a remarkable cameo of 26 off 14, including two massive sixes. Tom was run out in comical fashion and soon after Hayden was run out for a match winning 53 off 72 balls. Manly in the end home by 5 wickets inside 23 overs, securing a bonus point and locking in a home Quarter final against Bankstown.

Quarter Final vs Bankstown

Arriving to see a grassy wicket, it looked like the toss to lose for both captains. In the end, skipper Davies got his flipping technique wrong and the Bankstown skipper elected to bowl first after some thought. Hayden and Lachlan strolled out to open the innings, and got the boys off to the best possible start. Hayden in particular going after the bowlers, while Lachlan also hit several towering sixes towards Sydney Road. Together they combined for 90, however the drinks break saw a lapse in concentration, with both departing in quick succession for solid 40's. Blake got one that held up and was caught, before wickets continued to fall, Manly limping to 7/163 when the skipper was dismissed for 37. Tom and Ollie played crucial cameos of 18, with the Tahs finishing 9/209. Bankstown got off to a solid start in the chase, reaching 34 before the skipper came on, bowling pace, and picked up the breakthrough immediately. Toby followed this up with an absolute seed to knock over the other opener, before the visitors consolidated. With the score at 85 after a few dropped catches, Ollie returned and collected two wickets, including Bankstown's captain. A couple of unbelievable run outs from Josh Cooper at long off and Andrew at mid-on followed, before Toby picked up his second wicket to leave the visitors 8/142, and have Manly within touching distance of a Semi-final spot. However, it wasn't to be, as Bankstown's tail pulled off a remarkable unbeaten partnership of 71 to win by 2 wickets with 7 balls left.

The loss was a disappointing conclusion to an unforgettable season with the boys falling just short of a Semi-final spot. Nonetheless, all 15 players should be incredibly proud of their efforts throughout the season, with each and every one of them developing both on and off the field thanks to the guidance of the coaching staff.

From the coaches' point of view, the results on the field came as somewhat of a bonus, with all the boys ultimately developing as cricketers and forming some long-lasting friendships along the way. Obviously, every game presented a new challenge with the end goal of victory, however, the losses were just as important to the growth of the team as the wins, with the boys learning invaluable lessons about skill and mental components of cricket. Reflections on losses were never about dropping heads, rather it was about how they could continue to improve. Coaches addressing the players always had the common goal in sight, which was the development of these boys as cricketers and people, and the way each of the players took this feedback on board and applied it to their own games was phenomenal.

To David Gainsford, you are one of the most committed and hardworking people in cricket, and the boys were incredibly appreciative of everything you did for them, for the laughter you brought to their lives, but of course for the invaluable advice you gave them to help better them both as cricketers and as men.

To Roy Vumbaca, thank you again for all your hard work and dedication this season. Your tremendous cricketing brain, great sense of humour and genuine care for everyone around you are traits which everyone at the club notices on a daily basis and are so incredibly thankful for.

To David Gardiner, you're one of the kindest and most genuine people at the club, and your sheer love for the game is greatly appreciated by everyone at the club. The Green Shield players were so lucky to have your advice for aspects of cricket both on and off the field.

To Doug McGrath and Bobby Rollins, thank you for your ongoing commitment and support with the bowling and batting coaching of the players – it was greatly appreciated by all.

To Kev Davies, your genuine love for the game rubs off on everyone, and we all thank you for everything you did as manager this year. 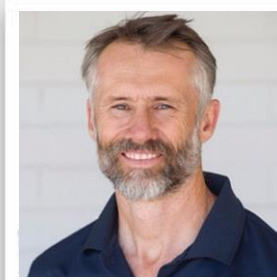

Player Profiles

Abbey Melville had a very successful season with the ball in the U15 Margaret Peden Shield taking a 4fa and 5fa on Grahams Reserve. She also made Grahams Reserve her own in Brewers, taking two 3fa's with her offies this season. Abbey's wicket taking contributed greatly to our team's success and she was our joint-leading wicket taker this season with 7 wickets along with Kate.

Chloe Osborne achieved the second highest score in Women's Manly Grade Cricket to date with a 70 against Parramatta. She was one of our strongest top order batters throughout the season and our leading run scorer. Chloe also held her own in the field and with the ball, bowling good inswingers and picking up 5 wickets.

Chelsea McLerie had limited opportunity due to injury and Second grade call-ups this season. She is one of our most consistent opening bowlers and can be relied upon to get an early breakthrough. Chelsea's highlight was likely with the bat this season, saving our girls from a loss to North Sydney by seeing out our overs and finishing on 39 – her best ever score with the bat!
