MWDCC also entered teams in the Women's Sydney Premier cricket competitions in 2nd and 3rd grade and the Brewer Shield U/18 competition.

The season had a staggered start due to COVID restrictions and winter codes finishing their finals. 1st and 2nd grade men along with the Women's competitions started as per usual, while lower grade men's started a month late. I would like to thank all the volunteers and club officials who tirelessly set up the grounds under COVID safe conditions every week.

Club Coaches Report

What a season! Every single person involved in our club should be extremely proud of our achievements this season. The end result was a Second Grade Premiership, runners up in the Club Championships, a First Grade Grand Final, a First Grade Limited Overs Semi Final, a Third Grade Qualifying Final, a Poidevin-Gray Semi Final and a Green Shield Quarter Final. Congratulations as well to Simon Waddington and Ross Denny on the huge success of the Women's season!

As a result of all of those achievements our club continues to be up there, leading the competition both on and off the field.

With the previous season ending so abruptly due to the Covid-19 pandemic without finals being played, we were denied the opportunity of silverware having 3's, 4's and 5's all qualify. It was a strange and empty end to proceedings.

Following that and keen to get started, our pre-season fitness campaign was again led by Simon Couch with the help of Lozza Gardiner, Roy Vumbaca and Mike O'Neill albeit with the new social distancing and Covid protocols in place, which didn't have much of an adverse effect. These sessions were again well attended and ensured a solid preparation to the season. Batting sessions followed shortly afterwards on Saturday mornings as per previous seasons with Sammy Mesite doing a fantastic job running these.

Rob Rowland-Smith, aka the Sandhill Warrior, put the club through two tough beach sessions at Palm Beach and Curl Curl in mid-August and really gave all the boys a lesson in mental toughness, camaraderie and goal setting. It also gave the boys an indication of where they were at with their individual fitness levels. Well worth the investment, no doubt about that, and a big thanks to Rob.

From a season planning standpoint and given the lack of consistency in our top grade in recent seasons, a more focused approach was introduced to rectify this. This included appointing Tim Cruickshank as our First grade coach, a decision to make coaching resources available to both 1's and 2's at every game for warm-ups and preparation, and also, when possible, to have a dedicated "top" grade net at training to increase the quality of their training sessions. We were very aware

of not creating a division or elitist atmosphere in the club with these changes. The result of these decisions created the

positive outcome we anticipated, with First grade turning things around in all formats on the field and displaying a renewed attitude off it. More of this will be covered by Tim and Jay in their report, however congratulations to both on their combined efforts. Well done too to Jay who grew enormously as a captain this season and led from the front in all aspects.



The jewel in our crown this season was undoubtedly Second grade. A justly deserved Minor Premiership and then confirming their dominance by taking out the title in a magnificent Grand Final performance. Their entire season was built on combined on-field contributions coupled with genuine care for one another and a 'backs to the wall' attitude. This ensured that title-winning three days of tough and uncompromising cricket. It couldn't have finished any better and the players celebrated as they should. Andrew Jamieson led the group brilliantly all season with the help of Sam Gainsford, Andrew Hicks and Izzy Vumbaca during his absences, initially to 1st grade and then at the end cruelly, to injury. To cap off the season, Jamo was awarded the 2nd Grade Captain of the Year at the SCA Awards, a final honour so justly deserved.

It was exhilarating to emerge from the Covid imposed isolation and reconnect with our cricketing family for a new season. 1st and 2nd grades both set a cracking pace with dominating early successes providing an inspirational example to the club and fuelling the desire to play cricket ourselves. The lower three grades commenced a month later following the easing of Covid- 19 restrictions and the availability of grounds. Consequently, most of the 15 rounds were scheduled as one day fixtures.

We congratulate the strong Northern Districts team which was a worthy winner of the 5th grade Premiership this season beating Gordon in the Grand Final. ND's were the strongest team we played this year and they beat us decisively in our round 6 contest. Despite winning our last game we missed out on the finals, but were in contention before the last round. Sadly, other results conspired to see us drop from a probable 6th to a disappointing 8th position. However, I have long believed that every single play counts in a game and in turn, every match counts. If we leave it to the last match and depend on other results to make the finals, our destiny is not in our own hands.

As disappointing as it was to miss the finals, especially having made it last year only to have the finals series evaporate under a Covid cloud, there were some strong team and individual performances throughout the year. Many junior players joined the Manly Cricket Family at grade level, the over 40's club performed strongly in support of Skipper Rochford, and there were harsh lessons learnt from losses which should not have occurred. Having said all that, it was great to be playing the game we love with the club we love, growing as cricketers but more importantly growing as people.

Once again 5th grade was privileged to be led by the indomitable spirit of Andrew Rochford. How Rocky fits all he does for cricket in the district is tiring enough but add in his family, press and medical commitments and you see a well organised, committed man driven by self-motivation and desire for personal and group achievement. Fifth grade basically represents our pathway players, mostly current or past Green Shield

boys experiencing the rigours of grade cricket in the infancy of their senior careers. They are nurtured on this journey by the entire club coaching and management team. On the field however is when the over 40's club swings into action. It is invaluable for the youngsters to have the calming influences and mentoring on and off the field from people like Andrew Rochford, Simon Waddington, Damon Smith, Ross Trewartha, John Warn and Darryl Buchanan.

The opportunities for boys to become men emerge regularly when players are injured or unavailable through a variety of reasons, especially our State and BBL contracted players and others playing in age group State and Australian teams. At these times it looks like our Green Shield coach Rocky picks up his team, throws in a mentor and plays with them as 5th grade. It is hard to overstate Andrew's influence and value to the boys, the team and the club. He sets high standards and everyone works together to attain them. It doesn't always work, but that is part of the learning process. Some of the boys blossomed in this environment and even moved through to higher grades. Others found the going tough and slipped back giving someone else an opportunity to succeed. It really is a rewarding experience to be part of the development of these fine young men.

As reported last year the wet weather played an enormous role in the results each week. Two of our games were washed out, the first against Gordon we had all of day 2 to score 164 with all wickets in hand but no play was possible. Our Round 8 clash with the last placed Campbelltown-Camden was abandoned denying us the opportunity of valuable points. In three other matches, the pitches were underprepared and it was a case of "win the toss and bowl, win the game". In two of our two day games, day one was washed out and day 2 became a 120 over marathon. Some of the noteworthy matches of the year include:

Northern Districts beat us soundly with both bat and ball and deserved their win. They were too good for the rest of the competition as well. The **Mosman** contest however will always haunt us. Having scrapped our way

to 151 the bowlers were on fire. Rochy set the tone with 2 wickets in the opening over and we rolled through them methodically to have them on the ropes at 9/86. All the thinking was on a Bonus Point, however we ended up bowling 20 wides and dropping 9 catches as the last wicket put on 68 and won them the game. We just didn't close it out. When it came down to the final game to make the semis, a win here would have secured a finals spot.

In the Round 9 clash with **Eastern Suburbs** we did something similar; Easts were 5/138 then the 6th wicket put on 69 taking them to 207 and a final total of 215 after the maximum 50 overs in which we bowled another unacceptable tally of 17 wides. Despite a pyrotechnic 58 from Will Akhurst making a guest appearance and 41 from Skipper Rochford, we only finished on 186. On the positive side, the following week we dismantled last year's premiers, **North Sydney** to win with a Bonus Point. Batting first we put a solid 194 on the board. Keelan Mendel and Reiley Dunlop got us off to a good start with a 63 run opening partnership before one of Manly's favourite sons, Scottie Patterson, who had answered the distress call, batted beautifully for 36. Evan Dunnachie then smashed a brilliant 52 batting at 8, before our spin twins of Roop Dhillon and Raj Ganeshraj destroyed them. Roop taking 5/27 and Raj 2/1, routing the Bears from 4/73 to be all out 83!

Our win over **Sutherland** was a sweet and sour game for us. It had been wet during the week and Andrew called correctly at Mike Pawley Oval and sent them in. It was a great toss to win. Evan Dunnachie bowled the spell of his life taking the first 6 wickets before having to come off because of bowling restrictions. He finished with 6/14 from 9 overs with 5 maidens! We were batting before tea chasing 72 for 1st innings points. We didn't fare much better than they did, but thanks to a gritty 22 from Simon Waddington we scratched past them to a total of 84. Week 2 was a totally different proposition in terms of the weather but we were on track for outright points at 8/65. That was until their 9th wicket partnership of 81 propelled them to a solid 180. Our run chase was progressing comfortably with 32 from Rochy and a solid partnership between Andrew Boulton and Simon Waddington. Boults went for 20, then Roop Dhillon departed leaving us at 6/150 with 17 runs to win and 4 wickets in hand. What could go wrong? Waddo was on 50 in total control, joined by Reiley Dunlop and was run out! Reiley went 2 runs later and Josh Cooper and Raj Ganeshraj shut up shop for the last over, just 12 runs short of outright points.

The match against **Penrith**, the eventual Minor Premiers, proved to be the over 40's show. They batted first and posted 8/216. Wickets went to Simon Waddington 2/31, Liam Dinan took 2/39, Rochy and Damon Smith 1 each, with Simon also pulling off 2 run outs. John Warn ghosted in for his annual guest appearance and set about dominating the attack. His punishing 42 was an inspirational innings punctuated by six 4's. Damon Smith then took up the attack where Warny left off smashing seven 4's on his way to 36. His dismissal brought Andrew Rochford to the crease who proceeded to light up Mike Pawley Oval with an exhilarating display of controlled aggression and power hitting, murdering the attack on his way to 75 not out. Rochy hit four 6's and eight 4's to canter to a crushing victory with 4 overs to spare. Liam Dinan stayed with him batting intelligently turning the strike over for 22no. A huge win.

Although these and other individual performances are highly commendable, we still have work to do at this level on preserving wickets, keeping the scoreboard moving and going on to register big scores. This will come if we work hard enough.

I would like to thank the coaching staff and volunteers for all their support of our young team. It can be very daunting for young boys to be thrust into the routines and rigours of senior sport. They were integrated seamlessly into the club in a warm and welcoming manner which is recognised and greatly appreciated.

Andrew Rochford

Andrew led the team in all 15 matches played. He led from the front with the ball edging out Evan with 21 wickets including three 3fas. With the bat he hit 257 runs which included a match winning 75* and a 40 in his punishing rapid fire style. Despite winning both batting and bowling honours, his value as a leader is immeasurable to the shaping of the careers of our teenage boys. He is an absolute inspiration.

Evan Dunnachie

Evan's game went to another level this season coming in second to Rochy in both batting and bowling. He batted in each of the 8 matches he played totalling 197 with notable scores of 52, 47 and 34. His bowling was a revelation taking 20 wickets with a season high devastating spell of 6/14 against Sutherland. Evan was stronger, faster and more confident this season. His trajectory is clearly on the up.

We started our pre-season with news that our First grade submission had not been accepted for the coming season. This only strengthened our resolve to have a strong performance throughout all grades. In the end, our expectations were well exceeded when we finished 2nd in the Women's Premier Cricket Club Championship. Congratulations to Sydney Cricket Club, winning the CC by a huge margin.

Equipped with our Covid Plan, we stepped up our preparations this year with some strength and conditioning training on a Monday night at Manly Oval. These were well attended, and Duncan Kerr ran an excellent program to get all the girls physically prepared for the season ahead.

Our pre-season sessions also included fielding drills and a throwing masterclass with Mike O'Neill. With winter sport being delayed and running into October, we had limited access to grounds for pre-season training. This however gave us an opportunity to focus more in smaller groups working on batting and bowling techniques.

The 2020/21 season was an amazing one for the Women's 3rd grade team. The competition was split up in two formats – T20's for the first half of the season and limited (40) overs in the second half. Congratulations to the winner of the T20's, Campbelltown-Camden, who were a great side to play against and thoroughly deserved the win. Also congratulations to Gordon who won the limited overs competition, just pipping us in the Grand Final.

This was the third season we had entered a team in Women's 3rd grade. There were many new faces in the side this season, with girls coming up from Brewer Shield and old faces returning from previous seasons. With a fairly new team and being the youngest team in the competition, we knew it would likely be a tough season but we were keen to make the most of it.

Charlotte Ambler was a new addition to the team this year, being her first time playing Grade Cricket, having come up from Brewers. She adapted well to her position as opening bowler despite being so young and removed many batters with her consistent pace bowling. She took 8 wickets in 14 matches as well as becoming a key batter in the back half of the limited overs competition and playing a key role in the Grand Final, scoring the second most runs.

Congratulations Parramatta on winning the 2020/21 Brewer Shield competition, beating the previously undefeated Sydney in the Grand Final. We had a couple of really competitive games against Parramatta during the regular season – we got the better of them in the 50 over match, but they were too good for us in the T20. We thoroughly enjoyed playing against them, especially their hospitality and help in the 41-degree heat out at Old Kings where we all struggled. Well done Parramatta.

Brewer Shield (an U18 competition) had previously been a shorter December to March competition, however this year it became a full season competition across 18 rounds, with nine T20s and nine 50 over matches. There were 10 clubs in Brewer so we played each club twice, home and away, which was very fair and made for a much better format than in previous years – thank you Premier Cricket.

It really was a fantastic season for Manly with a great bunch of girls. We played very competitive and consistent cricket and there were also a number of standout individual performances. Brewer had their best season ever in the short history of the Women's program at Manly. This was our fourth season entering a team into the Brewer competition, but it was the first time we had ever made the Semi's which was very exciting (sadly the semi was washed out), especially because we only made it in by 1 point, after winning our final regular season game with a bonus point! We won 11 of our 17 matches, beating two of the other three Semi-finalists along the way.

We all had so much fun this season, grew as a team and really enjoyed our cricket. We loved playing and played our best when we played as a team, stayed calm and supported each other. Everyone contributed throughout the season and delivered match winning performances, whether it be through taking a catch, scoring some runs, getting the much-needed break through or saving runs in the field. We couldn't have done any of it however without our amazing coach Scott, who was always there to help us, tell us jokes, run deodorant and towels out with drinks, shout us iced coffees pre-game, give us motivational speeches or feed us lots of red frogs! From being our game day coach, to running fielding drills at training and making sure we were always having fun, you really did everything. Thanks for all your time, commitment, help and guidance throughout the season – you really helped all of the girls improve. completely different without you as coach, so we truly can't thank you enough.

Awesome effort also from all of the coaching staff – it is so professional – Simon (bowling), Bobby (batting), Scott (fielding), Duncan (stretching and injury management), Dom (wicket keeping), Ross (nets and selections) and Bill (in the nets) thank you so much for all your time, as well as to all the guys who assisted from the mens club – especially Gainsy and SOK our guest bowling coaches – for all of your effort and dedication. It is truly appreciated by all of us. Toby thanks for being the net boss, and Sharon thanks for organising all of our gear. Ross a special thank you also for all your time and effort you put in behind the scenes. You all make the club work so smoothly and professionally.

And now on to the girls.

Kate Salmon – awesome season especially with the ball, her best season to date. Kate opened the bowling where her line, length and outswing troubled all batters. She is the second Manly Brewer bowler to get a 5fa and finished the season with 22 wickets @ 8.8. Kate was our best bowler and was the third highest wicket taker in the entire competition! She is also one of our key batters, scoring 233 runs and on top of that she was our leading catcher and is very reliable in the field. Kate was called up for some matches in Second grade in the second part of the season which was a great reward for a sensational season. Kate was always consistent and could be relied upon to get us out of a tough spot, whether that was with bat or ball. Her Just Dance skills were also sensational, almost as good as her cricket skills.

Nat Guyot (written by Scott Osborne). Nat took on the captaincy role of our young Brewer team this season and as a first-time captain she was eager to learn and really grew into the role. Nat led the team very well and always remained positive. She communicated well with the bowlers and was always encouraging. Her field settings (proactive) got better and better over the season. Nat was also the opening bat throughout the season and was the team's leading run scorer, scoring 334 runs at 22 with two 50's. During the T20 part of the season she maintained a high strike rate and typically got the team off to a strong start with a good range of shots around the wicket and always looked to score. Nat was also used on occasion as the reserve wicket keeper. Well done Nat on a very good season.

Chloe Osborne – a terrific season from Chloe, she played in all 17 Brewer matches, scoring a total of 314 runs including a couple of run a ball 50's and was once again in the top 2 run scorers for the team. Chloe plays plenty of aggressive shots and is an aggressive runner between the wickets. In the field she is very reliable – second on the catches list along with a couple of runouts and she also dives around to prevent runs. Chloe switched from medium pace to bowling off spin this year and took 4 wickets from limited overs – keep going with it and well done this year. Chloe also passed 600 runs for Brewer this season, the first player to do this. Chloe could be relied on to make everyone laugh and kept up the positive vibes, some highlights including her fabulous rendition of Let it Go, her requests when batting (such as towels, sushi, deodorant) and her all-round fun.

Ellie James – another really good season from Ellie, although injuries again hampered her somewhat. She performed really well with the bat scoring 260 runs – the third highest in the team. With the ball she shortened up her run-up this year which helped her bowling and her best balls always troubled the batters. Ellie took 11 wickets from her 31 overs and was our second highest wicket taker. Ellie is also one of our better fielders. Great season Ellie. Ellie also currently holds the Brewer record for the most consecutive shoulder dislocations in a season (4) and the amount of times she asked for deodorant (just about every single game), records that will stand for years to come.

Chelsea McLerie – another good season from Chelsea where once again pace and tight bowling were her key weapons. Chels either opened the bowling or was a first change bowler and she took 6 wickets this season in Brewer, also playing a number of matches in 2nd grade. There were only limited opportunities with the bat, but she will fondly remember her innings in a T20 against St George-Sutherland where we needed 6 runs off the last 5 balls. Chels calmly went 4, dot, 2 to get us over the line – easy. Her height and swing when bowling would've been petrifying when down the other end and her long run up was graceful to watch. Chels was the creator and founder of Linsey, without whom we probably would've lost a lot more games!

Ruby Gruber – this was Ruby's second Brewer season and she also played all 17 matches. Ruby was our main wicket-keeper and she got better and better as the season went on, finishing with 15 dismissals. Only limited opportunities with the bat for the first part of the season, however we used Ruby as an opener later

in the season in the 50 over matches. Ruby is a good aggressive runner between the wickets and when not keeping is also an excellent fielder. The most common saying this season was probably “Where’s the 11th player? Who’s missing? Oh yeah, it’s Ruby”. I’m not sure where you went when you disappeared every time we seemed to be gathering as a team, but if you were listening to eye of the tiger or meditating, it clearly helped you be a fabulous wicket-keeper and take some classic catches throughout the season.

Gemma Lacey – winter sport injuries delayed Gem’s start to the season, so having missed the pre-season it took some time for her to get going, however she had a really strong finish to the season with her bowling and got some very important breakthroughs for us. Gem took 9 wickets from her 34 overs and is as good as anyone when she is in rhythm. There were only some limited batting opportunities for Gem, but she also does her best for the team. Gem always started Sundays slow, whether she was tired or had already gotten sunburnt, but once Gem got going she was unplayable and unstoppable with the ball, always being relied upon to take wickets or bowl those extra overs.

Jess Manning – 8 wickets for Jess this season which was very good as back problems limited the number of overs she could bowl. She either opened the bowling or was the first change, her pace and swing are her key strengths. Jess had some really good spells especially in the second part of the season. When batting she likes to hit the ball hard and score at a good strike rate, her innings against Parramatta scoring a rapid 15 was very important to our winning the match. In the field Jess really threw herself around this year with some big dives to prevent 4’s when patrolling the boundary – great work. Although most people would pick Jess Manning as a scary swing bowler, which she is, she is also super handy with the bat and a very underrated hitter of the ball. You could describe Jess’ batting as hit or miss, but personally I would describe it as selectively picking her times to dominate. When Jess was in the zone, she was bowling beautifully and batting like it was no-ones business.

Abbey Melville – coming off a super strong season last year, Abbey continued to collect wickets and was once again was our leading spin wicket taker with 10 wickets from 70 overs. Abs is a little slower through the air than our other spinners and has good accuracy which challenges many an opposition batter. As a lower order bat there were not many opportunities to bat this year. Abbey’s fielding also improved this season. Although

both her run up and running through the field looks like it is in slow motion, she is actually a lot faster than you would think and chased down the ball a lot of times to save us lots of runs. Whenever Abbey took a catch, it provided energy that you couldn’t find anywhere else and it elevated the team to whole new levels. I don’t know what it was about Abbey’s catching, but it seemed to be electric and change the game for our team.

Eliza Henry – this was Eliza’s debut season in Brewer and she played in 11 of our 17 matches prior to playing junior reps where she co-captain the U15s. Eliza was used mostly as a middle order bat (opening once) and was steady with a few nice 20’s, while also bowling some challenging overs. Eliza is also a super fielder executing catches and run outs and she also throws herself around in the field more than anyone and has a great throw from the boundary. In fact, Eliza’s fielding in the outfield is the best in the club. She isn’t afraid to dive around like a professional diver to save the ball. It’s like she doesn’t have any nerves or bones or anything, because they surely should hurt, but not for Eliza. Her fielding saved essential runs and helped us win games. Some awesome Brewer seasons to come for Eliza.

Emily Horstead – this was also Em’s debut season in Brewer, playing 11 of the 17 matches before playing junior reps as co-captain of the U15s. Em was primarily used as a bowler and she bowled with good pace and accuracy taking 9 wickets @ 15 with a good economy. Although used in the lower order, Em is a solid and steady bat and she is also good in the field and executed a couple of great direct hit run outs. Well done Em you will be a key Brewer contributor next year. Em’s fielding and consistency with the ball were outstanding, especially during the T20’s, where her bowling was unplayable and resulted in lots of maidens and increased pressure at the start of the innings.

Laura Judson – unfortunately Laura was hampered by injury this season and was only able to play 6 of the 17 matches. As an aggressive/attacking batter, Laura opened in our early T20 matches to get us some early momentum during the powerplays, especially during the Penrith game where she hit a 6 that nearly put a hole in their fence! Due to her injury Laura was unable to bowl this season. Hopefully you are injury free next season!

Mia Nel – Mia was another of our wicket taking spinners, collecting 8 wickets in her 11 matches. She also opened the batting on occasions and batted in a

number of other positions during the season scoring some nice 20's. In the field Mia has a really reliable pair of hands and usually fields in the inner circle where she took a number of sharp catches.

Linsey - Linsey is our pet rock, named and found by Chels, who we thought should be introduced to the club. She is about to get destroyed by a hammer, so each girl can have a piece of Linsey as a memento. Thank you Linsey for constantly motivating us and watching over us with a smile on your face every game since we found you. We only lost one game since we found you at Asquith and we wouldn't be where we are today without you.

Also selected into Brewer throughout the season were Jasmin Wilson who took 4 wickets, Sallie Molyneux with 1 wicket and making their Brewer debuts were fast bowler Charlotte Ambler with 2 wickets and wicket keeper Stephanie Hughes. Thank you all very much for your contributions.

Thanks girls for the most amazing season ever and for making us and the club so proud every game. I loved every minute playing with you and I can't wait until next season already! We had the best Brewer season in the history of the club and definitely a season to remember!
