Another year, and another what could have been for the 'main grade' after an agonising 7th placed finish. With ODI cricket exclusively on the menu, our side played plenty of fantastic cricket, which was unfortunately also littered with a few under-par performances and nail-biting losses. Congratulations must go once again to Northern Districts on their second consecutive undefeated Premiership, an incredible achievement considering the weather and unpredictability lower grade cricket can often throw up. It's a true testament to the setup and people they have running the club – fingers crossed we can knock them off their mantle next season!

It goes without saying that our club is fortunate to have some of the most dedicated volunteers I've come across in amateur sport. From our committee, to our coaches and devoted scorers and supporters, we are blessed for all of the time these individuals dedicate to the Waratahs. In particular, it's worth calling out Will Gustafson and David 'Lozza' Gardiner for all the work they have done over a number of years for 3rd grade especially, becoming a true feature of the team's culture with their knowledge, selflessness and passion. We would be lost without Will's organisation and support on match day, along with Lozza's coaching and insights honed from years around the club and playing group. Thanks gents – we're truly blessed. Lastly, a big thank you to Roy Vumbaca who seamlessly took over the coaching reins this season. A 3rd placed Club Championship finish and 4th grade Premiership is a testament to the hard work and dedication you instilled in the club this year.

It's hard to look back on such an enjoyable season and not dissect moments that cost us a win, loss or bonus point over the course of a summer that saw us miss out on finals cricket by just 0.05 quotient points. A perfect storm of one-day cricket, BBL bubbles, Covid-19 and La Niña rains meant our side was constantly evolving throughout the season, providing opportunities galore for players to step up, but also a challenge at times as we searched for some continuity week-in week-out.

The pre-Christmas period on reflection was probably what cost us, a 2-4 record, punctuated by an underachievement with the bat, stalled our start to the year whilst other teams struggled to get on the park amongst the rain. A disappointing set of losses to Randwick-Petersham and Western Suburbs were followed by a couple of strong wins against North Sydney and Sydney. Close losses to eventual top-6 sides UNSW and Bankstown were tough to take with a young team, however it was fantastic to see these youngsters get the opportunity to step up in these games and gain some valuable experience.

2022 rolled around and after a tough loss at St George, the side began to build momentum, going 5-2 from this point on to fall agonisingly short of a finals berth. Bonus point wins against Campbelltown-Camden and Fairfield-Liverpool built momentum before a pair of close losses against Easts (by 4 wickets) and Parramatta (by 1 wicket in the final over) had us chasing the pack right up until the final day of the regular season. 3 consecutive wins to finish the year including a bonus point against Hawkesbury was a testament to the potential of this side and drove home the point of how much damage we could've done if a finals berth had fallen our way.

Despite what sounds like a slightly disappointing season, it truly was a great year from this cohort of players who improved throughout the year and showed they have the skills to step up the grades in the years to come. Bain and Dhillon were 2 of the top 5 wicket-takers in the entire competition, highlighting how consistent this pair were throughout a year of one-day cricket. Ellis Raymond, in his first year of grade cricket, was also a top-10 run scorer in the competition, along with his skipper Hole, showing immense talent and all the traits to step up into the higher grades next season.

Above all, this group of players continues to set the benchmark club-wide for how to play high quality, hard cricket while maintaining a culture of enjoyment that permeates beyond the field of play. We are blessed to have a group of great people that are so tightknit, who

care for the club and for each other, regardless of how they perform on the pitch. I can't wait to see this team continue to grow and improve next season, while maintaining the special bond that makes this club so special – cheers to season 2022/23!

Roopmehar Dhillon. A true breakout season for the young leg-spinner who dominated 3rd grade at the tender age of 16. 26 wickets at 12.4 tells the full story, and is punctuated by the fact that Roop didn't even take a 5-wicket haul in the 'main grade', a testament to his week-to-week consistency. Higher honours await Roop next season, and we cannot wait to see him show his talents at the next level in the years to come.

Ellis Raymond. Another player who had a true breakout season – Ellis deservedly took home the club's Player's Player award with some of the most consistent and destructive middle-order batting seen in the lower grades for some years. In his first season of grade cricket, 'Elray' scored an impressive 352 runs at 39 to continually steer the side home. A handy finger-spinner and athletic fielder, the all-round talents of Ellis have him primed for success in the higher grades next season.

Alex Bain. 26 wickets at 12.3 to pip Roop to the bowling award outlines just how good a season 3rd grade stalwart Baino had. Taking a true leadership role with the ball this season, Alex consistently led our bowling group while also receiving an overdue debut in 2nd grade. His maiden 3rd grade 5-wicket haul against Gordon, after so many near misses, was the icing on the cake of a great all-round year for him. With work commitments potentially arising in season 2022/23 and beyond – I hope Alex can continue to star for the Waratahs when available into the future.

Lachlan Trewartha. Another solid year for Lach, who is fast becoming an experienced 3rd grade cricketer despite being a sprightly teenager. 9 wickets at 33 doesn't really do justice to the role he played, often tying an end up while Roop spun the ball hard at the other. The partnership these two formed was probably the most important of the year with the ball and allowed us to consistently win the middle overs of an ODI innings. A return to 2-day cricket next season will give Lach the chance to showcase his skills even more.

Dom Wheeler. By his own admission 2021/22 wasn't Dom's strongest year for the Waratahs, although he was eventually part of Dr Rochford's Premiership side. Consistently getting in and finding a way to get out,

Dom was one score away from breaking through in 3rd grade but didn't have much luck. Despite this, Dom's experience and leadership was a mainstay of our side throughout, and I hope he decides to go around again with more 2-day cricket sure to suit his temperament next season.

Lachlan Coyte. A hard-hitting top-order keeper-batsman from Orange in his first full season for the Waratahs, Coyte became a vital cog in our side after a round 1 century in 4th grade. Blessed with natural ball-striking ability, Lach's season was highlighted by a quickfire 79 against Parramatta that earned him a 2nd grade debut (and another subsequent half century). Still only a 20-year old, Lach has great potential and has already shown he can feature in the higher grades for years to come.

Evan Dunnachie. A first full year in 3rd grade for Evan, whose cricket came on leaps and bounds as he developed his craft as a mainstay in our side. A nagging swing bowler and hard-hitting lower order batsman, Ev has all the skills to be a destructive cricketer into the future with some more consistency to round out his game.

Jordan Daly. Despite a slow start to the year, Jord ended the season with a respectable 212 runs at 30 in 3rd grade along with half a dozen performances in 2nd grade. Probably the club's most consistent performer in the 'main grade' over the past decade, not many come more reliable on the field than the Goober, even with his consistent off-field antics!

Neal Prowse. The star overseas pro only found time for 7 games in 3rd grade this season between gallivanting around Australia. Despite this, Neal scored runs and took wickets at crucial times throughout the year, highlighting his value to any side. Hopefully, an extended visa might just give us another year of the competition's leading slow right arm all-rounder!

Sam Webber. The most reliable gloveman this club has seen in my time, Schwebbs was up and down throughout the year covering for our BBL stars, even getting a long overdue return to 1st grade. Limited opportunities came Schwebbs' way with the bat this year, however he was a constant source of leadership in the side and his wise words to the skipper were always appreciated.

Lachlan Charles. One of our 4th grade champions, Lach was solid without being spectacular in 3rd grade when

given an extended run in the middle-order this year. His 50 at Easts in a tepid team batting performance highlighted his ability at this level to grind out success, and I have no doubt that a resurgence in 2-day cricket next year will give the Chicken Shack Fielder of the Week every opportunity to feature for the 'main grade'.

Zach Trewartha. Zach ended up in 2nd grade for most of the season after a hot start to the year which featured a clutch 59 vs rivals North Sydney on a wet Graham's track. An ODI king, it was great to see Zachy get an extended run in a 2's side that made it all the way to the semi-finals.

I look forward to seeing more of these players star next year!

Lastly, I want to say a massive congratulations to Dr Rochford and his 4th grade side for their incredible Premiership success. Any trophy is special, but to do it amongst the chaos of this season and the mountain of players that have come and gone through that side is a testament to Rochy's leadership and the support network around him at the Waratahs. Where do I start. What an unbelievable team, and an unbelievable achievement. Premiers in a competition with 20 strong clubs is no mean feat, and something not only the players, but the coaches and support staff that were a part of the success, should be immensely proud of. A disjointed pre-season, rain-interrupted regular season and finals series, all culminating in one of the more special Grand final victories at Hurstville Oval against a well-rounded Parramatta side. Brynn Mendel, to put it simply, one of the most insane innings under pressure to deliver the Premiership to the Tahs. The celebrations were all-time, capping off an incredible season for this team who truly deserved their success.

Mid-2021, and this season looked on shaky ground, with COVID spiraling out of control in NSW, and restrictions heavily in place. At a time where pre-season training would normally be in full swing, the whole club was stuck at home, with no indication that cricket would be resuming any time soon. However, as lockdown brought case numbers down and restrictions slowly eased, the 2021/22 season looked positive, with a November commencement finally set in stone. With only a few weeks of team training before round 1, everyone had to be ready to rock and roll from the get go, and to their credit, everyone was, none more so than this 4's squad who were keen to bounce back from a disappointing 2020/21, where they had finished 15th in the grade.

With the semi-retirement of club legend Adam Gummer, last year's 5th grade skipper/TV presenter/medical genius Andrew Rochford stepped up to lead the 4th grade side into the new season, with the goal of continuing to bring through some of Manly's most promising young cricketers as they progressed up the grades. Rochy's vision was solely about getting the boys who represented this 4th grade side to believe in their cricketing abilities, as all the coaches and selectors do, which would ultimately result in more positive on-field performances.

The season kicked off on November 13, and with skipper Rochy unavailable saving lives overseas, Gummer's retirement was quickly reversed as he put

the spikes on once more to lead a strong 4's side into battle. A dominant win against Randwick kick-started the momentum, on the back of a maiden Manly century for Lachlan Coyte. Convincing wins against Western Suburbs, Sydney and UNSW followed, before the pre-Christmas clash with Bankstown saw the 4's boys suffer their first defeat of the campaign. First round back post-Christmas, and COVID ran rampant through the club, with over 20 players affected by the virus and unavailable to play. There were multiple changes to the 4th grade side, however Rochy's XI got on with business and comfortably defeated St George in a top of the table clash.

Another couple of strong victories against Fairfield and Campbelltown courtesy of a 6fa from the skipper and 78* from Jack Pickering, saw the side well placed in the top three heading into the business end of the season. Unfortunately, a heavy defeat to Easts followed by a close loss to Parramatta and a frustrating wash out against Gordon halted our momentum, but the boys bounced back to record a huge 8 wicket win over Penrith (Parko took 4 for 0 that day, no big deal). La Nina dominated the headlines in Rounds 15 and 16 with two consecutive washouts as all of Sydney was inundated with A LOT of rain. This saw the Tahs needing to win in Round 17 to secure a home final, otherwise we'd be travelling. Unfortunately, Hawkesbury proved the better side in the final round of the regular season, meaning the Tahs would face St George in an away Quarter final.

Finishing 5th after the regular season, the 4's boys travelled out to Hurstville and defeated the Saints in a hard-fought Quarter final, led by Oscar Lucius with the bat and stand-in skipper Adam Parkinson with the ball. Sydney Uni presented the next challenge, and with Rochy on medical duties overseas, Parko stepped up again to lead the side. Ollie Melville was the hero with 4/17, before Lachie Charles and Josh Cooper guided the team home in a nervy run chase to secure a Grand final berth. And we all know very well what happened there. Lachie Kerr, Brynn Mendel and Lachie Charles the heroes as the Tahs secured the Premiership on a memorable afternoon.

Onto the thanks. This magnificent season wouldn't have been possible without the hard work of a number of people.

To Roy Vumbaca, thank you for your commitment, hard work and tireless efforts as Club coach this season. You managed to bring the whole club together despite the interruptions of player availability and the weather. This success is as much yours as it is the player's. Thank you for your guidance at training and games, co-ordinating warmups, training drills and being there to share your wisdom with the players. Roy's dedication to the club is incredible, never more clear than when he scored the entire Quarter final to ensure the players could stay together and support from the grandstands.

To Dave Gainsford, thank you for your unbelievable work ethic behind the scenes as Director of Cricket in ensuring everything is organised and running smoothly for the club. On top of this, thank you for your assistance at training and on game days, particularly in running the warmups at many of our games.

To Roy's coaching staff – Morne Morkel, David "Lozza" Gardiner, Sam Mesite, Richard "Dicky" Fry, thank you for all your assistance throughout the season. Whether it was at training or games, you offered invaluable advice to the group and all the boys were extremely appreciative for the expertise you passed on.

Thank you must also be extended to all members of the Board – Frase, Steve, Scotty, Maso, Gumms, and all others who work incredibly hard day in and day out to make this Club as great as it is today, in turn allowing the captains, players, and coaches to focus solely on the cricket.

Finally, thank you to all the support staff and volunteers for your assistance, guidance and banter at training and on game day. Special mention to Adam and Henry Lucius who both looked after the scoring in the Semi final and Grand final respectively, thank you for your hard work and support.

On to the players. A total of 31 players represented the mighty 4th grade side in 2021/22, and all contributed in some way at different stages of the season. With the constant player movements caused by COVID, injuries, and representative commitments, there were numerous opportunities for many players, and all played a role in the ultimate success of the 12-man squad there on Grand Final day.

Oscar Lucius. Lush is one of the rarest but most loveable characters at Manly, and was our ever reliable wicket-keeper/batsman, playing every game in 4's this season. Opening the batting, Lush scored 303 runs including a number of match defining innings. No innings stands out more than his gritty 54 in the Quarter final, where he helped get the team off to a great start against the higher placed St George. A very talented and classy wicket-keeper, Lush took 18 catches along with 3 stumpings in a brilliant season behind the stumps. His glovework in the Grand final was simply superb, 2 ripping catches to go with another 2 lightning fast stumpings. Well done on an excellent season big man, you were a huge part of this success.

Brynn Mendel. Simply unbelievable. That's the best way to sum up Brynn's innings in the Grand final. One of the best individual innings under pressure, Brynn took the Parramatta bowlers apart, hitting the ball to all parts of Hurstville in his 105 off 71 balls. What made the innings even the more special, was that Brynn only returned to the club this season after a couple of years unavailable due to footy commitments, but you wouldn't have known from the way he performed throughout the season. Scoring 342 runs at 57 across the 10 games of 4's he played, Brynn dominated a number of bowling attacks and was a huge contributor in many of the games. He has an incredible knowledge of the game and took on the responsibility of being a senior player in a very young side. Congratulations on your successes this season, no one was more deserving of the player of the final after that masterclass.

Dom Wheeler. One of the best clubmen going around, Dom has been a huge part of the 4th grade side for a number of years, and returned to the side for the back end of the season after some very well deserved time in 3's. Dom is a gritty top order batsman who has worked incredibly hard on his game for a long time, and showed his class against Parramatta in the round games with 47 in a low scoring game. Some unlucky dismissals cruelled him of more time at the crease, however Dom was a crucial member of this Premiership winning team. Another senior player in the team, Dom's cricket brain was an invaluable asset, helping guide the younger players both on the field and at training.

Lachlan Charles. Charlesy is another club favourite with a brilliant sense of humour that always draws a laugh out of the boys. He works very hard consistently at training, and it was extremely pleasing to see the hard work pay off in two crucial innings in the most important matches. In the Semi final, Charlesy came to

the crease with the side under pressure chasing a small total, but stayed calm amidst the persistent sledges from the Sydney Uni crowd, to guide the team home. This form carried on to the Grand final, where Charlesy again entered the frame at a crucial stage of the game, but batted magnificently to combine with Mendel for a match-defining 82 run partnership, before hitting the winning runs himself to finish 48 not out. Two of the most important innings of the season, well done Lach.

Andrew Boulton. Boults is one of the most talented juniors coming through the ranks at Manly, having played a big part in the Green Shield squad over the past few seasons. A classy top order batsman and very promising fast bowler, Boults' misfortune through injury saw him miss the first three quarters of the season, before returning to the field and playing some unbelievable innings in the 17's reps finals. Due to his injury, we were only able to use Boults as a batsman, where he returned to the 4th grade team for the Semi final and Grand final. Boults' maturity was on show in the Grand final, when he came to the crease and combined with Charlesy for the match-winning partnership. Despite only being 15, Boults never backs down from a challenge, even in the Grand final where he stood tall against the Parramatta opener who was trying to get under his skin. It won't be long before we see Boults cementing his spot in much higher grades.

Josh Cooper. Coops is another one of the promising youngsters at the club, and has an incredible cricket brain and great leadership skills, having captained the Green Shield side last season. Batted in the middle order for much of the season, however is a very talented top order batsman who will feature prominently in higher grades in the near future. Played a couple of very important innings throughout the season, none more so than against St George in the Quarter final to get us to a competitive first innings score, followed by a mature knock under pressure in the Semi final to help secure a Grand final berth. Coops is also a skillful off-spinner, and took a number of crucial wickets this season at a low economy.

Adam Parkinson. One of our former greats, Parko returned to the 4th grade side for the second half of the season and played a pivotal role in the team's success with his all-round ability. Stepped up to captain the side in Rochy's absence for the Quarter final and Semi final, and led the side admirably with a positive, supportive attitude that was a big factor in both games. Parko played a couple of handy cameos, particularly against St George to change the momentum of our batting

innings and push us to a competitive total. It was with the ball though that Parko was dominant, taking 13 wickets in 8 matches, including an unbelievable 4 for 0 against Penrith. But no spell was more important than in the Quarter final, taking 3/23 to turn the game on its head and ultimately lead the team to victory.

Andrew Rochford. Our fearless skipper. Rochy led the side incredibly well all season, and was very deserving of the title of 4th grade Premiership winning captain. Rochy took 28 wickets across the season, the most of any bowler in the 4th grade competition, to lead our bowling attack. His 6/28 against Fairfield was a masterclass, as he dismantled their top and middle order in a clinical display of fast bowling. Also took 5/29 against UNSW in a big team win, along with countless 2fa's and 3fa's. Rochy wasn't required with the bat too much, but did play a number of crucial cameos. Rochy's tremendous experience and knowledge of the game was crucial to the development of the younger players in the team, and allowed them to have the confidence in their games to stand up in the pressure moments.

Lachlan Kerr. Kerry is another one of the best clubmen at Manly, both on and off the field. He works exceptionally hard on his all-round game, but also never fails to support his teammates and lift the morale of the team. It was very special to see all of Kerry's hard work pay off in the finals series, as he spear-headed our bowling attack in all 3 finals matches. Picked up the important opening breakthrough in the Quarter final, before bowling fast and economically in the Semi final to take 2/22. But it was the Grand final where Kerry really stepped up, taking 4/33 as he picked up big breakthroughs at crucial times to lead the bowling attack and restrict Parramatta's first innings total. Kerry is also a very good lower order batsman capable of scoring crucial runs, as seen against Fairfield where he made 28 in a game-changing partnership.

Liam Dinan. After a few games in 4th grade last season, Dino cemented his spot in the side on the back of some strong performances. Dino bowled economically all season, regardless of whether he was bowling with the new ball or first change. Spells that stood out were his 2/19 off 10 overs against Penrith, getting the ball rolling for a dominant win, along with 1/21 off 8 overs in the Grand final, as he tied down the Parramatta top order in a smart performance. Not only is he a very crafty medium pacer, Dino is a solid batsman with the ability of batting in a number of spots, and will certainly get more opportunities to show his potential with the bat in years to come.

Jack Hobson. Hobbo was a consistent member of the 4th grade bowling attack this season, and spent some time in 3's on the back of some strong performances. With the ability to swing and seam the ball at good pace, challenging batters with both new and old ball, Hobbo is an exciting prospect for the club and has the potential to perform well in higher grades. His 4/37 against Wests was a highlight of his season. After some strong spells throughout the regular season, Hobbo really stepped up in the finals series, bowling brilliantly in all 3 matches. In the Quarter final, he bowled 5 consecutive maidens with the new ball to put Saints under immediate scoreboard pressure, before he took 2 early wickets in the Semi final to kick-start a dominant team bowling innings. On Grand final day, Hobbo again picked up a couple of crucial wickets, this time at the death to restrict Parramatta's first innings.

Ollie Melville. A skillful all-rounder, Melv played 9 games of 4th grade this season and contributed strongly in a number of those games. With the bat, he made a crucial quick-fire 18* against Wests to push the team to a strong total, while his 41 in the heat at Fairfield was a turning point in the match as he led the team to a defendable score after a tough start. With the ball, Melv's highlight was in the Semi final against Sydney University where he took 4/17 to lead the team in a clinical bowling display. His all-round capabilities, and incredible work ethic, will see him be a regular member of higher grades in the near future. Unfortunately missed out on the XI for the Grand final, but to his credit, Melv took on the 12th man duties with aplomb and was a huge support for the team, playing a crucial role in the Premiership success.

A huge thank you to the other 19 players who represented 4th grade at various stages in 2021/22: Lachlan Coyte, Adam Gummer, Jake Osborne, Ellis Raymond, Ben Falconer, Keelan Mendel, Toby Laughton, Evan Dunnachie, Jack Melchiorre, Aidan Baker, Will Akhurst, Jake Hutchings, Seb Bush, Will Mathieson, Bailey Foster, Jack Pickering, Taylor Beatty, Hayden Calvert, Justin Cox, and Reiley Dunlop.

That just about wraps up what was an absolutely incredible season for the 4th grade boys, who were extremely deserving Premiers of the Reid Cup. It's hard to sum up this report and the season that was, but I think the best words go something like this: "Ohhhhh, we're on the march with Rochy's army....."

After more problems presented by Covid, I could not have been prouder and more exhilarated to be back amongst the cricketing family that we have at Manly. All 5 grades set out with a strong team and individual performances that embody the Manly spirit. This season was surely one to be remembered. Once again, this season was all one-day matches, which provided a unique challenge to hone our 50-over cricketing ability.

We congratulate the 5th grade Premiership winners Eastern Suburbs who had an exceptional run to the Grand final beating UNSW. Eastern Suburbs were by far the strongest team we came up against who came back in blistering fashion to win a game we had almost sealed. This is a testament to the strength of their entire team which contributed to their epic season.

On the brighter side, the mighty 4th grade Manly boys lead by Rochy took home an epic Premiership in a game that is to be remembered long into the future. A Brynn Mendel masterclass and Lachlan Charles cameo lead the boys to an epic victory at Hurstville Oval. A big congratulations to 4th grade and Rochy on an outstanding season and unwavering desire to bring home a well-deserved and hard-earned Premiership.

For our 5th grade season, I couldn't have been more thrilled with how things panned out, even though we were washed out in the Quarter finals. Regardless of how our season finished, the team performed exceptionally well from the very first game – taking down Randwick-Petersham with a brilliant 110 from Jack Melchoire to open our season. The perfect start!

As disappointing as it can be to miss out on playing finals cricket due to rain with a team that was firing on all cylinders, it just proves to all of us how important every single match, every single play and every single moment is on the cricket field. If we are to take home the Premiership next season it won't matter whether it rains or shines, whether we come up against a strong side or not. We will make sure that we leave everything on the field in every game and go into the finals on top.

With a mighty first 4 rounds in which we won 3 and had a washout, we had a textbook perfect opening. Ranked 1st on the table we were crushing the competition and feeling on top of the world. With a keen eye on our players development, we made sure to not let our early wins against Sydney, Western Suburbs and Randwick Petersham get to us, and continued to work hard on the skills and abilities that had given us these victories.

On a day that would rather be forgotten in round 6, UNSW brought their A-game and towelled us up for our first loss. Losing wickets in clumps and not building partnerships in the top and middle order, we were destined to lose. The key takeaway from this game was that if we executed the simple things – building partnerships, batting 50 overs, ticking the scoreboard over, and building dot balls and pressure with the ball – then we would have won this game easily. This was to be a theme across the next several rounds where we had plenty of ups and downs.

In round 7 on a sweltering day approaching 40 degrees we drew the short straw of driving out to Bankstown. In a game that is to be remembered, we bowled first with a share of wickets and some new faces including debutants Seth Thompson, Matt Priest and Beau Kelly. Set to chase the biggest total this season of 232 we sent out Bailey Foster and Hayden Calvert. With some Hayden Calvert bombs and some Baily Foster patience, the 2 openers put on over 100 runs before the 15 over mark. At an incredible run rate, we were set to bring the game home easily. Losing Bailey and Hayden soon after however, it appeared as if we may have been too hopeful. Enter Jake Hutchings whose prowess as a patient but powerful cricketer was first seen this season. Putting on 53 runs alongside Reiley Dunlop in the middle order they steered the team almost all the way to the total, before Seth Thompson took control of the game (after losing 3 back-to-back wickets) and sealed what was an epic Manly victory.

With Covid always knocking on our doors, in round 9 we had 20+ players out across the grades and ended up with 3 of the Manly Women playing in the 5th grade competition – the first time this had ever occurred! We

were extremely lucky to welcome Saskia, Mikaela and Shivani who put on a show both with the ball and with the bat with their individual performances shining.

We sustained some heavy losses to Eastern Suburbs and Gordon which again was a result of not executing the basics. This is the biggest takeaway for us this season – the team that executed the basics the best and most consistently would win the most cricket matches. If we can do this next season, there will be no stopping us in our search for the Premiership.

Everything that we achieved this year couldn't have been done without the immense support we receive every single week, from training to game day. This support is incredibly valuable to the development of the 5th grade and pathway players. I want to thank all of the coaching staff and volunteers from Danny LeMoy, Doug McGrath, Steve Beatty, Lozza, Roy, Sammy, Gary and all of the parents who tirelessly bring the boys to training and to & from games. I am so proud to be a part of such an amazing group of people who spend an enormous amount of time giving us everything we could possibly need to maximise our opportunity to succeed and enjoy the game we all love.

Reiley Dunlop. Reiley led the 5th grade team for the first time this year. He played every single match and lead from the front, bagging a 5-catch game in round 2, finishing with 21 catches & 2 stumpings with the gloves. With the bat, he finished top of the entire 5th grade leaderboard with 349 runs at an average of 29.08, opening the batting in all but 1 game. Some matching winning performances with the bat against Penrith and in a tight Campbelltown-Camden clash proved that he is capable of leading from the front. He is an inspiration on the field vocalising team spirit every over and this demonstrates his value as the captain of 5th grade and in the development of our pathway cricketers.

Hayden Calvert. Showcasing his firepower from his second game this season with a blistering 53 runs from 31 balls, Hayden set the tone with Reiley every single game. Scoring 3 back-to-back 50's at one stage, he has a bright future ahead of him. Alongside Reiley opening the batting, these 2 openers were a staple in the consistent great starts 5th grade had for the entire season. He finished with 273 runs at an average of 29.22. Hayden is a class batsman, if he develops his ability to bat for longer periods of time there will be no limit to how many runs he will accumulate for himself and Manly next season.

Liam Dinan. Liam was one of our strongest all-rounders in the early part of the season before being channeled up into higher grades. His pivotal contribution of 32* and 2/18 off 7 overs in our win against Sydney was a testament to his hard work, dedication at training and cricketing craft. His bowling is almost unplayable at times and he has a bright future at Manly up the grades. He also deserves a batting promotion to showcase his talents in the higher grades.

Jake Hutchings. Jake was our staple number 3 this season with his notable 53* against Bankstown to guide us to a big victory. He scored 176 runs at an average of 19.56. His ability as a cricketer is yet to be fully unlocked and his performances in the Green Shield and the junior competitions as well as his developing maturity are going to be brilliant to see next season and beyond.

Bailey Foster. Bailey played 3 matches for us with his most notable contribution of 48 runs in our epic run chase against Bankstown. He scored 77 runs at an average of 25.67. Bailey looked his best when he was patient with the bat and if he develops that patience along with his temperament, he will be a great addition to the 5th grade side.

Jack Melchior. Jack played 6 matches for us this year while also spending time up in 4th grade, scoring a magnificent century against Randwick-Petersham in our first outing to set the tone for us. Scoring 198 runs at 39.60 in 5's, Jack has the patience of a saint out there in the middle and loves to accumulate runs. With his maturity, I'm sure he will be moving up the grades next season and beyond.

Will Matheson. Will also played 6 matches with us this year. He bowled 33 overs, took 6 wickets for 107 runs at an average of 17.83 with the ball, with a best bowling of 3/27. These figures illustrate his patience and quality with the ball. A fine young quick bowler who when given the chance, also swung the willow hard.

Simon Waddington. Simon was an important supporter for Reiley with his captaincy this season. He provided support in the lower middle order with the blade accumulating 97 runs in total with a high score of 32 this season, steering us to 2 great victories with the bat. He took 7 wickets with the ball with best figures of 3/19 and an average of 17.86. He took 5 catches in the slips as well and his expertise and game sense is of great value for all of the 5th grade boys.

Raja Ganeshraj. Raj is one of the most effective spinners we have had in 5th grade in many years. He bowled 88 overs in only 11 matches taking 14 wickets, at an average of 21.5. His best bowling of 3/27 showcases his consistency to tie teams down and build immense pressure which led to the crumbling of several batting attacks this season. His bowling figures don't represent the pivotal role he played in our awesome start to the season. He has a very bright future with Manly.

James Waddington. Waddo was the fastest bowler in 5th grade across all grades. Big claim, not really. His ability to trundle in and send thunderbolts with a new ball demonstrates a promising future in grade cricket. He bowled 78 overs this season, taking 11 wickets at an average of 20.73. His best bowling was 3/23 and his form began to flourish as the competition continued. James is a star to be watched closely and developed. With the bat he averaged 14.17, scored a total of 85 runs in the lower-middle order. His highest, match-winning score of 46* with 5 brutal boundaries is a testament to his work ethic and game finishing power.

Josh Lawson. Josh was our most reliable opening bowler this season. With excellent control and pace, he bowled 57 overs including 8 maidens and took 9 wickets at an average of 18.11. His best figures of 3/28 and economy of 2.88 highlight his quality as a grade cricketer. In many games his bowling was just too good for the 5th grade batsmen he bowled against. Given the chance to bowl against higher calibre batsmen his success may be much higher, something to consider in his own development as a rising star at Manly.

Seb Bush. Seb was incredibly consistent across the 6 matches he played in 5th grade his season. He bowled 38 overs, taking 6 wickets. His best figures of 2/35 came as a result of patience and planning. Being dispatched for 20 runs in his first over, he bounced back and took 2 wickets in 2 consecutive overs. This scenario was not uncommon for Seb who executed his plans and strategy for the team's benefit week in and week out. He averaged 25 with the ball and provided incredible support to James Waddington and Josh Lawson at the top of the bowling attack.

George Cumming. George joined us late in the season to play 6 matches with us. He is a very natural spinner who took 4 wickets with best figures of 2/21, which is only just the beginning of what George has to offer Manly in the coming years. Given the chance with the blade, his high score of 24* lead us to a superb victory.

Jake Osborne. Jake played 3 matches with us this season. He scored 32 runs at an average of 10.67 with a high score of 16. With levelled patience his talent will come to life. His skill as a cricketer is immense and his development is something to be highly sought after to reposition himself back into the higher grades.

Oliver Melville. Playing 4 matches with us this season, Ollie is an immensely valuable all-rounder. He took 6 wickets and bowled 9 maidens in only 33 overs for us. His best bowling of 3/35 and economy of 2.18 in 5th grade illustrates his ability to succeed in higher grades. His performance in the 4th grade campaign to the Premiership further demonstrates that ability.

To every player that played with us this season (of which there were many), thank you for your discipline, your hard work, your attitude and your dedication to playing hard, tough and fun cricket. I could not have been prouder of every single young man (and the three women) this season. The development of all of you is why we play 5th grade and I know for a fact that every player emerged from this season as a new and better version of themselves.

To Danny LeMoy, thank you for your early morning laughs, warmth and unending support at Mike Pawley oval. You are one of the main reasons we perform so highly there. You mean more to us cricketers than just a support staff, you are a part of the Manly spirit and the development of every young player that comes through 5th grade.

To Doug McGrath the Manly 5th grade manager. You are more than a manager at 5th grade Doug, you are the heart and soul of what it means to be alive, what it means to improve ourselves every single day and what it means to all of us to enjoy our cricket, not just to perform well. I cannot fathom how much work you do for us all every week from turning up before dawn to supersop Mike Pawley, rallying the team to give it their all and making sure the score book, facilities and everything else are all ready for us without even asking.

Despite the loss of numerous players, the squad were confident in the personnel we had available, led by the likes of Joel Davies and Josh Seward.

Unfortunately, skipper Ollie Davies was unavailable for the round games, due to both injury and BBL commitments with the Sydney Thunder. However, Ollie showed incredible support to the team, attending all games he could and sharing his wisdom with the team.

Ollie's unavailability saw younger brother Joel step up to lead the squad into the season, a role which wasn't new to Joel, having previously captained the Green Shield side for two years. Joel was supported brilliantly by vice-captain Seward, who also took over as the man in charge when Joel was away with rep commitments.

The season itself wasn't completely smooth sailing, as rep commitments and injuries saw many changes to the starting XI each week. However, none of the boys complained about this, and remained confident that the team taking the field each week could get the job done, with a depth of talent in the squad. Round 1 saw a dominant 5 wicket win against Randwick, as a tight bowling performance led by Hobson, Melville and Davies was backed up by runs to Seward, Dunnachie and K.Mendel to secure the victory. Unfortunately, La Nina was the headline of Round 2 as torrential rain washed out our clash with UNSW at home. Easts were the opponents for Round 3, and proved too strong for our boys despite some class bowling from Seward, Hobson, Davies and Cooper, and a run-a-ball 47 from Seward in the run chase. Round 4 saw the Tahs at North Sydney Oval, with persistent rain again playing a part, resulting in a reduced overs game. A big total from North Sydney set up a challenging run chase, but the boys gave it a red hot crack courtesy of runs to Coyte, Seward, Osborne and Cooper. The final match of the regular season was against Mosman, where the Tahs rallied as a team, led by Dinan with the ball, before skipper Davies went berserk in the run chase with 81* (41 balls) to secure an 8 wicket win.

Unfortunately, a 6th place finish in our conference saw the boys narrowly miss out on finals, with just one more win needed to have put us in the frame. In the end, the wash out against UNSW and various passages of other games proved costly, however, this was an opportunity for the boys to learn and improve for next season. Despite missing out on finals, all the boys should be incredibly proud of their efforts throughout the season, considering the young squad we had and the many interruptions faced. The squad loses very few players next year and is building something special as a group.

Joel Davies. The skipper is an absolute freak of nature, and showed his all-round talent on a number of occasions throughout the season. His knock against Mosman stands out, as he peppered the Allan Border Oval construction site with multiple sixes. Joel reads the game unbelievably well, and his captaincy was on another level at times as he always seemed a few steps ahead of the opposition. Joel's bowling and fielding is

of high class, taking a number of important wickets, while plucking catches and saving runs for fun in the field. Had a huge debut season in 1st grade which is a testament to his talent and work ethic, that will see him continue to progress through the cricketing ranks.

Josh Seward. Josh is another senior player in the squad who is blessed with heaps of natural talent with bat, ball and in the field. He bowls exceptional pace with the ability to hit the seam and challenge both edges of the bat with new and old ball. Took a few important wickets throughout the season, but it was with the bat that he really put the team on the front foot. Opening the batting in all games, Josh scored 140 runs @ 35 from four innings, getting the team off to a flying start regularly. Has great leadership skills accompanied by an experienced understanding of the game, which saw him step up to skipper the side in Joel's absence. Earned a very well deserved 1st grade debut this season, and has a long career ahead in the top grade and beyond.

Josh Cooper. Coops was one of the PG's debutants this season, having captained the Green Shield side the season prior. A very talented all-rounder, Coops batted in the middle order and adapted his skills to the T20 format with a few quickfire innings for the team. He has a hunger for big runs and understands his game well, something which will hold him in good stead for the next few years of PG's. Coops' off-spin is of high quality too, showing his skills with the ball by challenging some of the best batters in the competition. With tremendous leadership capabilities and an excellent knowledge of the game, Coops has a big career ahead of him in the higher grades at Manly.

Lachlan Coyte. Coytey joined the Tahs from the country last season, and after some hard work in the off-season, showed his potential with a classy 100 in Round 1 for 4th grade. Very quickly made the move up to 3's and didn't look back, cementing his spot at the top of the order. Batted at the top of the order for most of the PG's season, and after a tough start personally, belted the North Sydney attack with a quickfire 35 to put the team on the front foot in the run chase. Someone who benefits from more time in the middle, Coytey continues to improve and shows great commitment to his game which will see him dominate in years to come.

Liam Dinan. Dino debuted in PG's at the back end of the 2020/21 season after some consistent performances with both bat and ball. He is a crafty medium pacer who bowls stump-to-stump, and challenges the patience of all who face him. After being left out of the team for the

opening games, Dino continued working hard on his game and putting in good performances in grade, forcing his way back into the starting XI for PG's. His performance in the Round 5 match against Mosman was exceptional, completely shifting the momentum of the game with 3/17 after the opposition got off to a flying start. Earned a 3rd grade debut as well, and is sure to feature prominently in coming seasons.

Evan Dunnachie. Ev is a very promising fast bowler who played a bit of PG's last season, before cementing his spot in the side for much of this season after some strong performances with the ball in 3rd and 4th grade. Became a big part of the 3's bowling attack as the season progressed, and will be a key player in years to come. Bowled first change in PG's during the round games, taking 2/27 against North Sydney in a strong display. Also a very talented batsman who is capable of hitting the ball a very long way, Ev played an important innings of 29 against Randwick in a successful run chase, and was used as a pinch hitter on a few occasions with his power hitting ability.

Jack Hobson. Hobbo returned for his second season in the PG's side after a couple of impressive performances with the ball last season. He is a tall fast bowler with the ability to hit the seam at good pace and cause trouble for top order batters. Bowled brilliantly against both Randwick and Easts, taking 2fa each time at a low economy to help restrict both sides to sub-par totals. Played a big role in the 4th grade premiership side as the opening bowler, bowling exceptionally well particularly throughout the finals series, while also making a number of appearances in 3rd grade on the back of consistent wickets. Will be a key part of the PG's bowling attack next season as the team continues to build to something special.

Oscar Lucius. Lush is one of the most loveable characters at the club, and made his PG's debut this season as the side's wicket-keeper/batsman. He is a very talented gloveman who has proven himself in 4th grade over the past few years, and is well and truly good enough to play higher grades, however, is a victim of the depth of high class wicket-keepers at the club. The great man kept exceptionally well all season, taking 2 catches and 3 stumpings and letting nothing past him. Got limited opportunities with the bat in PG's, however, is a very stylish and classy top order batsman, who was another key member of the 4th grade Premiership winning team as their ever-reliable opening batsman.

Ollie Melville. One of the hardest working players at the club, Melv has great potential as an all-rounder with a strong skillset with both bat and ball. Returning for his second season of PG's, he played a big role with the ball against Randwick and Easts, taking 2 crucial wickets in each match to contribute to well-rounded team bowling performances. Melv is also a very capable batsman who can bat in anywhere in the middle to lower order, and although he got limited opportunities with the bat in PG's, will play a big role this coming season. Took 4/17 in the 4th grade SF in a display of his true talent. It won't be long before we see Ollie become a key member of the middle and higher grades.

Brynn Mendel. An incredibly gifted footy player, Brynn returned to the club on a permanent basis this season after being unavailable last season. From the outside looking in, you wouldn't have noticed that he hadn't picked up a cricket bat in a long time, as he dominated at the top of the order for 4th grade. In PG's, Brynn batted primarily in the middle order, and after a couple of unfortunate dismissals, he showed his class with 27* against Mosman in an unbeaten 99 run partnership with skipper Davies. Will be a key member of the PG's side next season as a senior player, look out for this man to dominate in 2022/23.

Keelan Mendel. Brynn's younger brother, Keelan was another one of our Green Shield graduates from 2020/21, and fitted in seamlessly to the PG's side this season. On debut against Randwick in round 1, Keelan batted positively to guide the team home with a mature 23* in the run chase, showing his potential. Not only is he a promising batsman, Keelan also bowls very handy medium pace, which although not required this season, will be a key asset to the side in the next few seasons. Was a consistent member of the 4th grade side before returning to school cricket, and will be a regular face in PG's for a number of years.

Jake Osborne. Jake has been at the club for a number of years now, and is one of the most naturally gifted batsmen when he's on song. An aggressive top order batter, Jake plays his best cricket when he looks to move the game forward. After a tough start to the PG's season, Jake showed us glimpses of his talent in a quickfire 25 against North Sydney, including one of the bigger sixes of the season onto the North Sydney Oval roof. Also bowls very handy off-spin which was used at various stages of the competition, and is a strong fielder. Jake will be an important member of the XI next season as we look to build on our performances from 2021/22.

Lachlan Trewartha. Lachie debuted in PG's in 2019/20 and has been a crucial member of the XI since then, with his skillful off-spinners taking regular important wickets for the side over the past few years. The T20 format for this season brought with it challenges for all bowlers, however Lachie's performance with the ball against Randwick was a big part of the team's success in round 1. Despite batting No.11, Lachie is a very handy batsman who is capable of scoring crucial runs, and will have more opportunities to do so if the competition returns to the traditional one-day format next season. Played a consistent role in the 3rd grade side this season as they pushed for finals, and it won't be long before he's knocking down the door of higher grade selection.

Thank you also to the members of the extended squad: Seb Bush, Hayden Calvert, Liam Chang, Raja Ganeshraj, Jack Melchior, Matt Somerville, James Waddington and Hayden Williams. Despite not playing, your efforts at training and supporting the boys were exceptional, and many of you will be key members of this squad in years to come.

See you all in 2022/23. Something special is building within this group, and next season promises to be a very exciting one!

Player Profiles

Roop Dhillon. Through Boults' injury, Roop was given the opportunity to captain the Green Shield side this season, and showed great development as the season progressed. With each game, Roop grew in confidence with his leadership, which was also reflected in his individual performances. A few solid starts with the bat, before a classy 84 in the QF showed his true talent, but it was with the ball that Roop really excelled, his leg spin causing havoc for all batsman as he took 20 wickets across 9 matches, earning a spot in the Green Shield Merit XI.

Andrew Boulton. Unfortunately Boults was cruelled by injury for the majority of this season, missing all the round games due to stress fractures in his back. However, to his credit, Boults made the trip to every game, home and away, with his cricketing knowledge offering great assistance to all the boys along the way. We were lucky enough for Boults to return for the finals, immediately showing his immense talent with the bat against Gordon after a long injury layoff. A star of the future, we look forward to seeing Boults progress up the grades in the coming years.

Ethan Buchanan. Returning for his second year in the Greenies squad, Ethan had a tough start to the season with the bat after a few unlucky dismissals, before returning to form later on with some crucial innings. Preston Lee. Preston is a great all-round talent who works hard on his game regularly, and showed constant glimpses of his potential throughout the season. His innings against Mosman, while not appealing in the scorebook, was just what the team required and showed great temperament and calmness under pressure. Batted positively against St George before running out of partners, further highlighting his potential. Preston is an absolute gun in the field and also bowls accurate medium pacers which are a huge asset for the team.

Will Matheson. The team's first change bowler, Matho is another one of the young fast bowlers coming through the ranks at Manly, and showcased his skills regularly with the ball. While not taking a big bag of wickets, Matho bowled well consistently without luck, picking up some important wickets at crucial times. Can hit a very long ball too, as we saw against St George with a huge six down the ground, and will continue to improve with the more cricket he plays.

Angus McConnell. Gus returned for his second consecutive season with the Green Shield squad after showing great promise last season. He is a tall, lanky left arm quick who bowls good pace and has the ability to challenge both edges of the bat. Unfortunately, a nagging neck injury saw him miss a couple of games he probably would've played, while his opportunities in other games were limited. Another great team man who brings great energy to the team environment, and was always the first to provide some laughter when the boys needed it most.

Brodie McDowell. Brodie was one of our country players for this season, coming from Pottsville up north, and performed strongly in many of the games. One of the most talented wicket-keeper batsmen to have played Greenies, Brodie batted in the middle order all season, his innings against Mosman and UNSW in particular being crucial to those victories. His glovework behind the stumps is quick and clean, taking multiple ripping catches off both the quicks and the spinners, while he also provided great energy in the field to lift the team's morale.

Nathan Pryke. The second of our country players, Prykey was one of the most consistent performers for the team throughout the season. Bowled first change in the first couple of games, but due to his performances, was given the responsibility of taking the new ball for the rest of the season. Prykey bowls great pace with both new and old ball, and has the capacity to swing the ball both ways, which caused problems for top order batters all season, as he took big wickets in every game. Also played a crucial innings of 28 against Wests to get the side to a defendable total, showcasing his talent with the bat, and has a rocket arm in the field.

Seth Thompson. Seth is a crafty off-spinner who has had success for Warringah in the Shires competition, and in the Manly junior reps system. Bowled well without luck at times throughout the season, but has great skills, varying his pace to cause trouble for batsmen in the middle overs of the innings. Seth is also a very solid lower order batter capable of playing important innings, which we saw glimpses of in various matches this year.

All in all, 2021/22 was another fantastic Green Shield campaign for players, coaches, support staff and parents. Reaching the Semi final of an extremely strong competition contested by 20 clubs is no mean feat, and although the boys were disappointed to fall short of the final hurdle, they should all be incredibly proud of their efforts over the course of the season.

Thank you once more to all the boys, along with the coaching and support staff, as well as the parents and families for making this such an enjoyable season for all involved. Onwards to 2022/23!

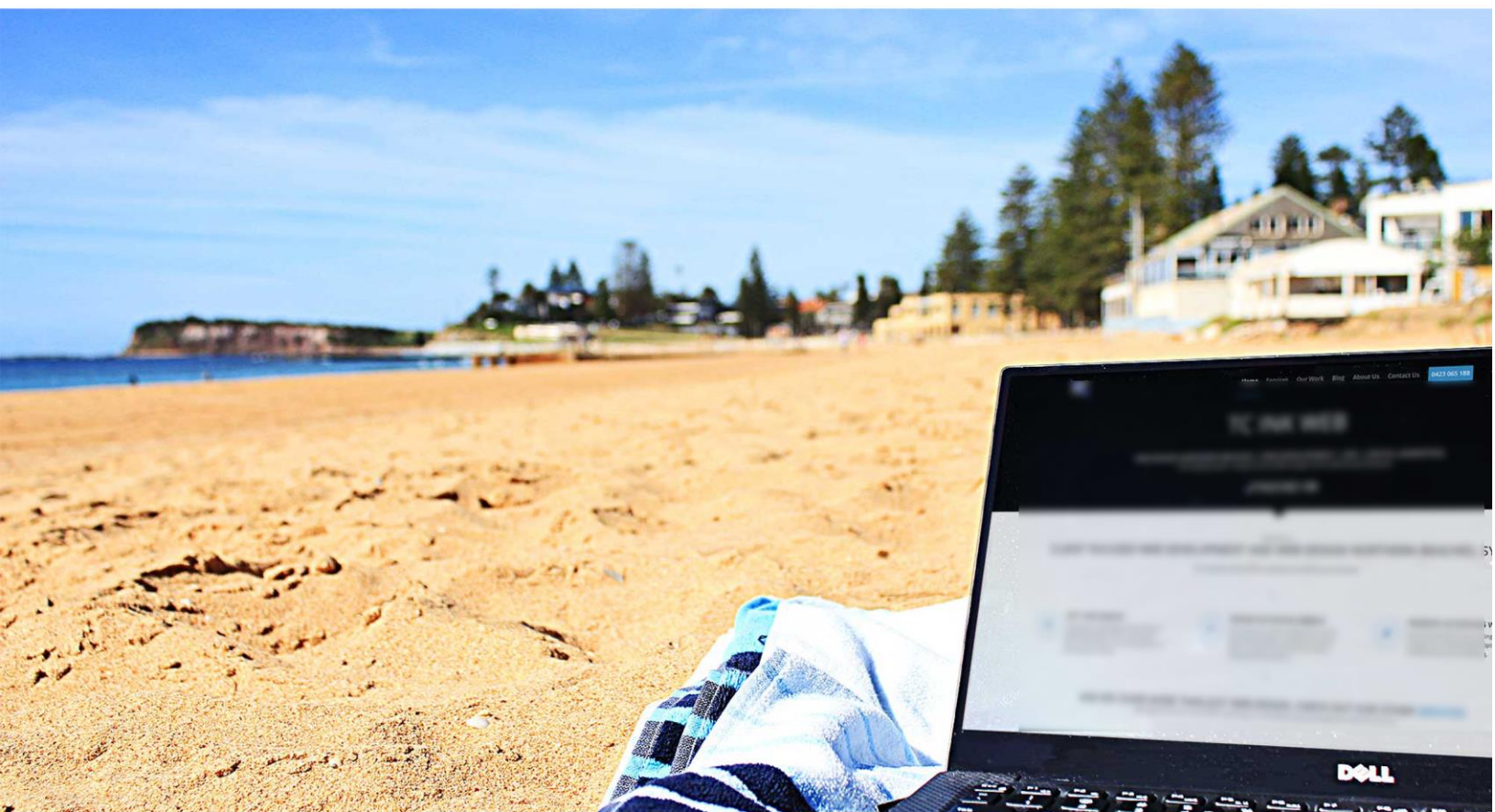

Women's Coaches Report

This season was our first with a team fielded in all 4 of the Women's grades. This meant many players needed to move up a grade, so our expectations were not to win many championships this season. However, our expectations were most certainly exceeded, finishing in 3rd position overall in the Club Championship. Congratulations must go to Sydney Cricket Club for winning the Club Championship to go two in a row.

Our off-season strength and conditioning was again done online with Duncan Kerr running a superb twice-weekly session for the girls and any extras who happened to join in. These carried on into pre-season dropping down to one session per week but by the time we were able to start hitting balls, it was evident our group was significantly stronger than the previous season. Some were bowling faster, and most were hitting the ball harder, and this work will have had significant benefits in reducing potential injuries during the season.

The pre-season again started with a taper out of Covid lockdown restrictions. Numerous adjustments were made to the training program and setup as the NSW government constantly changed the rules. I thank everyone for their patience during that period and the numerous emails being sent out each week. Our vaccination rate was strong which enabled us to get into training as soon as possible and perhaps started the season a bit better prepared than most other clubs. We were also able to have our coaches set up small groups at local nets to get the girls bowling and hitting balls as soon as possible as competition start dates were not to be decided until quite late.

The coaching team did a great job this year with noticeable improvements in skills and performances in all players. We welcomed Mechelle Hare to the team, who coached the 3rd grade side and together with captain Renee Hough, built up a great team spirit to take them to the Semi finals where rain hampered their chances to go further. This team had a number of girls still quite new to the game and it was great to see their enthusiasm and share their success.

Dominic Wheeler stood up to a greater role this year as Brewer Shield coach. He and captain Mia Nel formed a strong leadership team to get Brewers into the finals only to be washed out as well. I really think this talented

young team could have gone all the way if they were able to get on the field in the finals.

Special thanks go to Ross Denny who wears many hats. Helping me as Assistant Club Coach and his Board and SCA Sub-Committee roles, he also assisted 2nd grade and 3rd grade on match days when required and somehow managed to fit in some coaching with the Mollie Dive team and his Pathway Manager duties. Ross does a mountain of work for cricket in our area and can never be thanked enough.

Second grade would probably admit they were capable of finishing higher than they did. But that is cricket sometimes. A couple of narrow losses in the first half of the season put them off the pace but captain Nat Guyot, assisted by Ross, managed to put a couple of wins together to be within a win of the top 4 with 4 rounds to go, but then numerous wash outs at the end of the season and the bye meant they had no chance to claw back those points.

I thank our Board for continuing to embrace the growth in Women's cricket on the Northern Beaches. This growth is also underpinned by strong MWJCA junior girls competitions. The future is looking bright with strong seasons from the Manly junior representative teams as well.

I am immensely proud of what we have all achieved in the last 5 years to get to this point with a strong competitive team in each grade, and I am very much looking forward to the next chapter.
