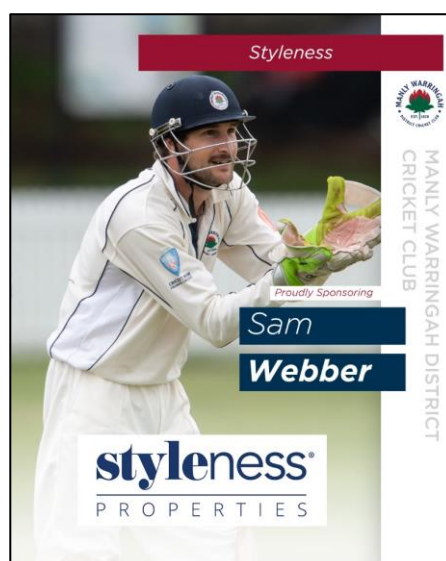
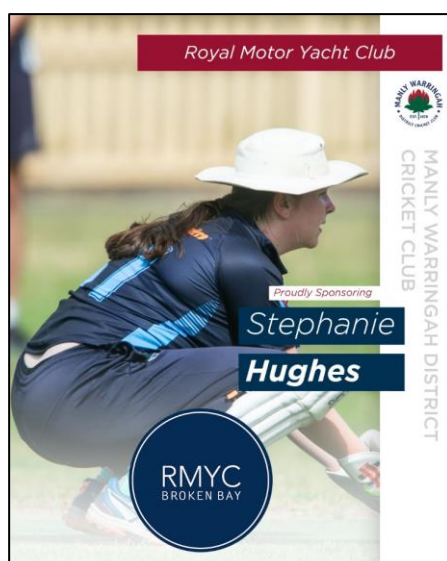














## Tim Cruickshank – Life Member #53

At our 145<sup>th</sup> Annual Presentation night, Tim Cruickshank was inducted as our Club's 53<sup>rd</sup> Life Member. Tim made his debut for Manly in 1997 as a 15 year old and played for 20 seasons until retiring in 2017.

Tim batted in 354 innings across his career with a high score of 203. He scored 14 centuries and 67 half centuries (not a great conversation rate Timmy!).

But undoubtedly his highlight at the Club was captaining 1st Grade to a thrilling Premiership victory in 2015, breaking a 26 year drought – that tense final day at North Sydney Oval is one we will never forget!

Tim is a part of Manly's DNA and Manly is a part of Tim's DNA. He has now been involved with the Club for over 25 years. He is now a very highly respected member of the cricket community both at club level and at the professional level.

Tim very much deserved this prestigious accolade, and we all congratulate him as our MWDCC Life Member #53.

## Treasurer's Report

I am pleased to present the audited financial statements of the Manly Warringah District Cricket Club for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> April 2023.

While the club had some wonderful successes on the field this year it has also been an excellent season financially. We were able to deliver an operating surplus of \$53,922 compared to \$5,029 in the previous year due to a substantial uplift in sponsorship as well as having the benefit of fundraising from our Golf Day which we had been unable to host last year.

Our overall revenue for the year increased by 20% over the previous season. We welcomed a number of new sponsors as well as retaining a majority of the existing ones. Credit must go to Joel Mason as well as our President Andrew Fraser who are able to drive an extremely strong sponsorship base for the Club. We also hosted our annual Golf Day which was extremely well organised by Sam Hole and was our most successful to date. Overall costs were down 1% over the previous year, with an increase in hiring costs and marketing expenses more than offset by savings in clothing as we utilised stock from the previous year, as well as lower coaching expenses.

The Balance Sheet shows the Club ended the year in a strong financial position with net liquidity

(cash at bank less amounts owed) increasing to \$406,301 versus \$345,740 at the



end of last year. There are a number of maintenance and improvement projects to be addressed in the next few years, particularly the Grahams Reserve Training Nets, Mike Pawley Oval change rooms and Seaforth Oval development. The Board will also be considering other initiatives to help improve and support cricket in the area.

A big thank you to all our wonderful sponsors who continued to support us and to those new ones that came on board through the season. Thanks also to Cricket NSW who continue to invest in and support community cricket.

I would like to acknowledge the support I received during the year from Steve Cole and Patricia Yap at Enspira Financial who act as our tax agent and Doug Wood from Foster Raffan who is our Auditor. Both organisations provide their services on an Honorary basis, and we appreciate their support.





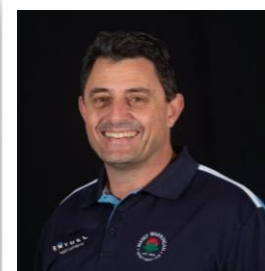
Character and connectedness; it is pleasing to have the opportunity to formally acknowledge and thank those who have contributed so much to shaping these two driving forces of our success.

In previous Annual Reports, only some T20 years were included in 1st grade stats.

What a season it has been, Club Champions, Minor Premiers and finally Albert Cup Premiers for 2022/23. I said to the boys at stumps on day 2 of the Grand final when the final hour had not gone our way, “that premierships are hard, and they don’t hand them to you”. What I’m most proud of with this group is the amount of resilience they showed in some extremely challenging moments towards the back end of the season. This team has long prided itself on its ‘team first’ attitude and not relying on the same one or two individuals to win matches on a weekly basis. This most certainly shone through in the big games in the back half of the season.

A huge congratulations to our entire 2nd Grade squad on their Premiership season. Using 24 players in a Premiership year is no mean feat and something everyone involved in the Club should be extremely proud of.

To Tom Felton and his Northern District team, thank you for again being terrific Grand final opponents and for always playing in the spirit of this great game. The manner in which the Grand final was played and won will live long in the memory of all involved.

With the hurt of falling short in last year's Semi final still lingering, the team started the season with one goal only, to get back to the top! The off-season departures of two of our most experienced batsmen in Sam Gainsford and Logan Weston meant that others would need to step up. With Ned Hole, Jacob O’Sullivan and Matt Brewster all spending the winter in the UK, developing their skills by learning their games in foreign conditions, things were looking up.

We didn’t exactly start the season on fire though. With a Duckworth-Lewis loss in round 1 and a mid-game wash out in round 2 we were 12 points behind the leaders early doors. However, the next 3 rounds would involve some of the most dominant wins I’ve been a part of. We were able to defeat Blacktown, Bankstown and Hawkesbury all on Day 1, but fell just short of the outright victory on each occasion. I truly believe these

close calls for outright provided the catalyst for the resilience and hard-nosed approach we displayed in the back half of the season. Dominant wins over defending champs Mosman, Easts and Penrith would see us go into the Christmas break in 2<sup>nd</sup> position.

The second half of the season was where the Premiership was truly won. After a disappointing loss to Parramatta in round 11, we faced some challenging moments in matches against Sydney and UNSW. On both occasions we started the match by losing most of the top order in quick succession, to leave the team at 5/20 and 4/10 respectively. Both times we were able to fight back and put big totals on the board with standout performances from Ben Bryant (150no), Tom Kaye (84no) and Brynn Mendel (87no). Each of those innings were match winning and helped the team to push to the top of the ladder after 15 rounds of competition.

Finishing in top spot was an outstanding achievement, but we would be forgiven for thinking we were a little hard done by when we had to play a 6<sup>th</sup> place St George team in the Qualifying final. They were boasting 6 or 7 players who had spent most of the season in First grade, due to the availability of their representative players. When we turned up to a wet wicket at Pratten Park and got sent in, things were looking challenging. Again, the mental toughness was shown when after a great start getting to 0/50 in quick time, we lost 4 for 1 in 10 minutes. The next 5 hours is probably the proudest I’ve been of any performance in my 7 seasons at Manly. The First grade quality St George attack threw everything they had at us and despite their best efforts the boys dug in and showed the toughness we’ve come to expect of our experienced batsmen. We were finally dismissed after 136 overs for 309, just before lunch on day 2. Elliott Herd, playing in his first 2nd grade game in a few seasons and having scored only 4 runs all year, played one of the great knocks at number 9, scoring 89 chanceless runs. In reply, St George could only manage 86, showing just how difficult the deck was to score on. Josh Seward was the chief destroyer, claiming 6 wickets in 7 overs.

Onwards to the Semi final we went, where we faced a determined Gordon outfit who turned up ready to play, despite their heavy loss in week 1 of the finals. We again got sent in and faced a more challenging deck and much slower outfield than you would expect at Allan Border Oval. Things were going along steadily when we again lost 4 wickets in quick succession. A fighting 75no from club legend Cameron Merchant and a determined 38 at number 10 from Josh Seward helped us to a competitive total of 206. Day 2 proved to be a nail biter as the Gordon innings ebbed and flowed on what was a much flatter wicket than Day 1. The bowling attack stuck together however and showed their experience to dismiss Gordon for 171.

A 3 Day Grand Final is a unique experience for a 2nd grade cricketer. For most of us, it is the only chance we will have to experience long format cricket. The most challenging aspect for those that had been there before is the mental and emotional turmoil you go through during the 3 days. Things can change in an instant and that again was the case this time around. We lost the toss and were asked to bowl on the flattest wicket we have seen at Manly for some time. All 3 of our seamers were sore after bowling big overs the Sunday before and only having a 5-day turnaround. The conditions could not have been better for the experienced ND's line-up to post a big total. With Kaye and Jamieson not having the conditions to do what they had done for most of the season the team would need something special and for the third week in a row that would come from Josh Seward. The next 4 hours would see one of the great Grand Final performances from the young tearaway. 23 overs, 10 maidens, 7 for 36! 5 of those were bowled or LBW in what was a match winning performance. To take one 5 wicket haul in a finals series is special but to do it 3 weeks in a row is unheard of.

We left the field feeling happy with ourselves and extremely confident of a big first innings lead. At 0/25 and nearing the end of play on Day 1 things were going along smoothly. Next minute we lose 3 for 1 and finish the day with two nightwatchmen at the crease. Albeit two very accomplished batsmen in Kaye and Dhillon.

Day 2 saw very different overhead conditions and after a short first session and a long rain delay, we were still 3 down with 50-odd on the board and things were looking positive. It's now late in the afternoon with light fading and the umpires inform us that we will have 20 overs to finish the day. Bang! Within 20 minutes we have lost 4 for 10 and are reeling at 7/70 and still had 8 overs to bat that evening.

Day 3 brings the earliest arrival in grade cricket history with the daylight savings change and an hour early start for lost overs, we arrive at the ground for what was supposed to be a 7:30am start. Monsoonal like rain puts a stop to that and we sit around nervously for the next 5 hours knowing if it stops raining, we will play some cricket. O'Sullivan and Jamieson are told the game will restart at 1pm with the home side needing 43 runs to win on first innings. The rest as they say is history, we would take 14 overs to score the runs with Brynn Mendel hitting the final boundary as the heavy rain returned with the staunch Jacob O'Sullivan remaining not out at the other end in his most impressive innings of the season. A Premiership for the Manly boys with resilience absolutely personified!

I can't thank the entire club enough for the amazing level of support we receive on a weekly basis. To Andrew Fraser and the Board thank you for all you do to help make this amazing club what it is today. I've said publicly many times, that we are very privileged to play for such an amazingly run club and the playing group truly appreciate all that you do.

To Roy Vumbaca and his coaching staff, thank you for your tireless efforts and support. Roy, you have shown extraordinary dedication to your role over the last two seasons and the success of the club this year is testament to the amount of work you've done to help us better ourselves, both as players and human beings. Thanks as always to our huge army of volunteers, who are the backbone of the club. Personally, a massive shout out to our long-time scorer and the 52<sup>nd</sup> Life Member of MWDCC Gordon Currie for his dedication and support.

To the world's greatest manager Will Harding, thanks for your amazing match day support and for always saying yes to the endless requests from our over precious batsmen. The team and I truly appreciate all you do for us and we feel very blessed to have you. Thanks also to Mark Bryant and Jono Seward who both supported the team this year.

To Chairman of Selectors Michael Visser, thank you for your calmness and clarity around selections, most weeks as late as Friday night. You did a sensational job in your first season in the role, and we hope to see you go around again next year.

**Ned Hole.** Another consistent season from everyone's favourite teammate. Neddy will do whatever job is asked of him and that is what his teammates love most.



While his numbers weren't prolific, he made some crucial runs in big moments. A well-deserved First grade debut in round 8 against Penrith. One of the best Gully fieldsmen I've seen, Ned took some absolute hangers this season. I look forward to continuing to watch his progress over the next few seasons.

**Lachlan Coyte.** A real breakout season for the hard-hitting batsman from Orange. Coyte played all but one game in 2's this season and like Ned batted in a number of different positions. Never afraid to take the game to the opposition, what we love most about Lachy is his aggressive approach to batting. His 90 in the opening round against a quality Gordon attack was a real highlight. Off to the UK for the winter, I'm sure Coyte will come back a more complete player and look to push for a First grade debut.

To play in 4 Grand Finals and have First grade go so close after a super season is truly amazing. A special mention to Rochy and the 4's lads to for going back-to-back for the first time in the Club's history.

The ‘main’ grade put together its strongest season since the 2014/15 Premiership – a 3<sup>rd</sup> place regular season finish (3 points from Minor premiers), undefeated finals run and heartbreaking wash-out to end what was a phenomenal year. Unfortunately, the weather Gods at Old Kings Oval stood between us and a chance at Premiership glory, however Parramatta must be congratulated on a fantastic season that saw them finish higher on the table and take the Mitchell Cup.

A massive thank you must firstly go to the army of volunteers who contributed to the Club's success this year, from Will Gustafson each weekend to Sam Mesite running our net sessions and everyone in between – none of this would be possible without them. A special call-out must go to club coach Roy Vumbaca for leading this playing group with such poise; 5x finalists, 4x Grand finalists, 2x Premierships and a Club Championship is testament to your dedication and leadership.

Beyond the on-field success, this season was characterised by the arrival of a new 3rd grade manager who took to the playing group like few others have. Noah Vumbaca seamlessly slipped into our sides culture, becoming the heartbeat of our dressing room week-in-week-out. Aside from drinks, gloves and warm-ups, Noah gave us (and our captain) a fresh set of eyes that proved invaluable throughout the year. Noah also proved the most nimble of substitute fielders, covering for our ailing troops on a number of occasions and nearly holding onto a few hangers in the Semi final! Thank you for everything this season Noah – it wouldn't have been the same without you.

Third grade's year, as many before it, was characterised by our consistent strength with the ball and at times underachievement with the bat, particularly post-Christmas. Remarkably, only one team scored 200+ against us all season (in a game we still won), with our fast-bowling depth time and time again dragging us to key victories.

The team raced out of the blocks to start the year, with comprehensive wins over Gordon, Blacktown, Bankstown and Hawkesbury punctuated by back-to-back centuries from Brynn Mendel (in his only pair of 3rd grade games all year), a Sam Hole ton and clinical bowling from a number of old-timers including Hicks and Counsell. Heading into Christmas, the side was sitting on top of the table having only lost the one game to Mosman and picking up an additional pair of key ODI wins at Easts and Penrith.

Unfortunately, a couple of disappointing performances with the willow in January meant our season stagnated a tick, before roaring back to life throughout February and March to grab 3<sup>rd</sup> place amongst a hotly contested pack of sides. It's cruel to dissect such a long and arduous season so closely, but if we're honest with ourselves, we know that each of our defeats (bar a lost toss on a soft UNSW wicket – I could write a thousand words on this game alone!), were avoidable and ultimately cost us a Premiership.

We hit the finals series at our absolute peak on reflection, and grafted our way through a Qualifying final against North Sydney. Our score of 163 on a lively wicket was far more imposing than first thought, before our clinical attack went to work and bowled the Bears out for 98. A Semi final against Penrith was next, where our bowlers again did the job and restricted the opposition to 120, before a Sam Hole century and Jordan Daly masterclass put the game beyond reach. That took us to an eagerly anticipated Grand final, where sadly those dropped games here and there ultimately meant the trophy was not ours to keep, despite going undefeated over the finals campaign (like our Parramatta counterparts, mind you).

As always, what sets 3rd grade apart is the comradery and friendship that permeates right through the side. While not walking away with a trophy, to have new faces like Noah Vumbaca and Matt Sunshine so seamlessly slip into this team's culture means more than anything, and is a testament to the environment that this club continues to foster. The highlights of my

season looking back weren't the runs or wins, it was always the times we shared, whether it be in the dressing room, at the pub or anywhere in-between – that's ultimately why we play this silly game! Cheers to more good times, and hopefully one more win next season!

**Andrew Boulton.** Winning the batting and bowling award in the same grade is a remarkable achievement for any player in any grade, let alone a 16-year-old in 3's. Boulton had a phenomenal season for us, racking up 341 runs at 37.9 and 22 wickets at the miniscule average of 9.1. Throw in a 2nd grade debut and selection in the U17 NSW side, it really was a standout year despite injury cruetling him from participating in the Semi and Grand final. I have no doubt Andrew will feature heavily in our top grade in the next year or two.

**Sam Webber.** A phenomenal cricketer, leader, clubman and teammate, Schwebbs stepped in to captain the side with aplomb throughout the season. After starting the year slowly with the bat, Sam found form at the right time and scored crucial runs throughout the back half of the season, finishing with 326 runs at 25.1. One of the best glovemen this club has ever seen, any side with Sam behind the stumps is stronger for his presence, and I hope he chooses to go around again next year.

**Lachlan Charles.** Charlesy spent the entire year in the 'main' grade and has become a crucial cog in the top order, owning the #3 position. Lach's year was highlighted with a gritty 85 at a sweaty Bensons Lane. While probably scoring a few less runs than he would've liked, Charlesy looks on the cusp of breaking through in 3's and converting those weekly starts into big scores.

**Zach Trewartha.** Another season that was characterised by consistent starts which didn't materialise into a big score, Zach often did the hard work building an innings before finding a way to get out. His best knock of the year in 3's was the Grand final, where he made a crucial 39 that would've proved match-winning if the weather had given us a chance. Zach's experience is an asset to have in 3's and he has become a true leader within the playing group.

**Ellis Raymond.** Another player that couldn't turn starts into big scores, Ellis struggled to get going throughout his second year with us. Crucial knocks early in the year against Blacktown and Easts were the highlight of his season and I have no doubt Ellis will have more success

and learn from his first year of two-day cricket at this level.

**Jordan Daly.** I don't have the data, but I would confidently guess Jordan is the most accomplished 3rd grader in the recent history of Manly cricket. A man who consistently scores runs for fun in whatever grade he's picked in, Daly spent a large portion of the year in 2nd grade before graciously joining us to lead our finals charge. A great leader and fielder, Jordan is one of my favourites on a team sheet and I truly believe he wouldn't be out of place in a First grade side if given the opportunity.

**Jake Hutchings.** It's hard to believe Hutchie is only 16, but the man is fast becoming one of the most exciting young cricketers in the club. With a quiet demeanour and humble manner, Jake began the year in 4th grade, scoring enough runs to win their batting award before stepping up into 3rd grade and featuring throughout our finals campaign. More than just a batsman, Jake bowls fantastic seamers as well and has all the talent to be a top grade cricketer for Manly in the future.

**Matt Sunshine.** A breakout year from our Central Coast import. Mr Sunshine took to 3rd grade like a duck to water, taking wickets and scoring runs consistently throughout the season to become a crucial cog in our side. 32 wickets at 14.4 says it all with the ball, however Matt's value also comes from his hard-hitting batting and athletic fielding. I can't wait to see Matt continue developing over the coming years, he's got all the tools to push into our top grades.

**Josh Wigley.** Wigs featured in 3rd grade this season more than he probably has in 4-5 years, after being a mainstay of our 2's side. 17 wickets at 11.2 tell the story; that Josh is a class above this level on his day and can take the game away from top sides. 9 wickets in the Semi final, especially 4 crucial first innings wickets drove this home. 16 runs in a crucial last wicket partnership during the QF also showed his tenacity with the bat, I won't mention the ducks in the SF & GF!

**Michael Counsell.** Another man who is a level above 3rd grade, Mick dominated each week, ending the year with 28 wickets at 14. I'm not sure there's someone that beats the bat more than Counsell, blessed with pace and bounce that goes unrewarded in 3's. An underappreciated batsman, Mick's statistical improvement is likely a record across the history of grade cricket, vaulting from 3 runs at 0.75 last year to 75 runs at 15 – a 1,900% average return on investment!

**Lachlan Trewartha.** LT put together another solid year in 3rd grade, finishing with 17 wickets at 17. As in previous years, Lach acts as a superb holding figure throughout ODI and first-class fixtures, building pressure while our seamers go to work at the other end. Consistently taking crucial wickets, LT broke our QF wide open with North Sydney's big wicket and would often be the man to prize out teams' strongest players.

**Evan Dunnachie.** Another 4th grade Premiership winner, 'Crazy Ev' came in and out of our side, often covering as an additional seamer and lower order stick. While not getting too many chances to shine, Ev is an asset to any side and on his day can win the game with bat or ball. I'd love to see Ev force his way back into 3rd grade next season, I've got no doubt he can succeed at this level.

We also had a few debutants step up from the 4th grade side and debut in 3's for the first time this season including George Cumming, Oscar Lucius, Fraser Noack, Hayden Williams & Keelan Mendel. Each of these men had superb seasons in 4th and 5th grade respectively,

and I'm sure will feature heavily with us in the years to come.

A big thank you must also go to some Manly veterans who stepped in at different points throughout the year to offer their experience. Sam Gainsford and Logan Weston made celebrity appearances in round 1 before respectively departing the Sydney metropolitan region. Neal Prowse was in and out of our side before committing to becoming a full-time vacationer. Andrew Hicks featured a couple of times early in the season, including the spell of the year at a hot Blacktown (6/13 from 10 overs). 4th grade Premiership winner Dom Wheeler stepped up into 3rd grade for a couple of rounds and made a match-defining 87 against eventual champions Parramatta. Finally, Taylor Beatty made the arduous journey to Penrith from the Central Coast to steer us to victory before Christmas. We thank all these gentlemen for their service!

Being sandwiched between these two grades is made easy by the level of quality we have flowing through this club and the leadership these two men provide. With 9 of the 29 3rd grade players this season finishing the year in a Premiership winning side, it's clear how much of our success as a club is shared. Season 2022/23 will long be remembered as one of the most unforgettable seasons in the history of our great Club. To win a Club Championship so convincingly is a testament to not only the incredible team performances of all grades, but also to the hard work and commitment of all the players, coaches, Board and volunteers that make this club so special. Congratulations to the captains for leading your respective teams superbly throughout the season, to have all 5 grades reach the Semi finals, and 4 in the Grand finals was absolutely phenomenal. Particularly to Jamo, a huge congratulations on what you and your 2's group achieved this season.

Onto the 4's boys. To be the first team in the Club's 145 year history to win back-to-back Premierships is an extraordinary achievement, and is testament to the skill, work ethic, dedication and team-first mentality of every player that represented the 4th grade side this season. With several top grade players tied to rep commitments, combined with the inevitability of injury and unavailability, change was regular week to week. It would be easy in these situations to use this as an excuse, however, it ultimately galvanised the group, with different players stepping up and making strong contributions to the team's success. Moreover, the never-say-die attitude of this group was a cornerstone of our success, regularly finding ourselves in situations behind the eight ball, but always seeming to find a way to collectively fight back. Simply put, this team refused to lose. The way this team fought to the very end of every game with an unwavering commitment to the team-based approach was testament to the character amongst the group, and more often than not, resulted in victory.

Andrew Rochford once again stepped up to lead the team, alongside the leadership and experience of Dom Wheeler and Adam Parkinson, and with the majority of the group retained from last season, there was a strong belief amongst the boys regarding our prospects.

As was the case for much of 2021/22, rain across the opening rounds meant no play was possible until Round 3 vs Blacktown, where we kick-started our season with

a massive outright win. Excellent team performances against Bankstown and Hawkesbury followed, resulting in first innings victories, before our second outright win of the season, this time over local rivals Mosman. Our first one-day fixture saw us victorious in a tight tussle with Easts, making it 5 wins from 5. Unfortunately, we were nowhere near our best against Penrith, our first loss of 2022/23, before more rain washed out a clash with St George. Back on the winners list with a solid win over Sutherland, we then faced Parramatta in the GF rematch from last season, maintaining bragging rights with a fantastic victory. A record-breaking Round 12 saw us register a huge win against Sydney, before a memorable run chase at ND's had us sitting pretty at the top of the table. Returning home against UNSW, a gutsy fightback with the ball wasn't enough as we fell just short losing by one wicket. Concluding the regular season with a big win over Sydney Uni, we finished 12 points clear in 1<sup>st</sup> place to book a home Qualifying final.

The finals series that followed reflected not just the talent, but more so the character of this group, as we fought ourselves out of difficult positions to win the game. Batting first in the QF vs Sydney, a gutsy innings from Hutchings combined with the lower-order fight of Dunnachie, Kerr and Rochford saw us post a competitive total, before the entire group refused to give up in the field, resulting in a thrilling 2 run victory. In trouble again batting first in the SF against UTS, Nick Rigg stood tall in the top order, but it was once more the tail that stepped up, Kerr, Cumming, Rochford and Lachie Trewartha leading us to an excellent total, before all bowlers chipped in to secure a place in the GF vs Parramatta. Winning the toss and batting, we were bowled out for 168 on the back of crucial runs to Mendel and Dunnachie, and with Parramatta 2/37 in reply, the game was right in the balance. Unfortunately, rain spoiled what would have been a great finish, but as the higher placed team, the Manly boys were deservedly crowned Premiers. Cue the celebrations!

Head coach Roy Vumbaca deserves all the praise in the world for his monumental contribution to the success of the club this season. Roy, to achieve what you achieved in just your second season in the Head coach

role, is a testament to your tireless efforts week in week out, whether that be running training sessions, game day warm-ups, or working behind the scenes to ensure all bases are covered for the playing group. The culture that makes this club so special is a credit to the standards and values you drive consistently, while your own knowledge that is built on the back of your coaching experience is of such value to every single player.

Dave Gainsford has done an immense amount of work for the club over several years, particularly behind the scenes in organising everything for the playing group, coaching and support staff, to ensure things are running smoothly. Thank you Gainsy for your efforts both behind the scenes and on game day, the passion and commitment you demonstrate on a weekly basis for this club is incredible, and it was so special to see this recognised with your Clubman of the Year award. More importantly, thank you for the support, advice and laughter you provide to all the players, coaches and volunteers, it means the world.

To all of Roy's coaching and support staff, thank you for your hard work and dedication week in and week out, to ensure the playing group are well-prepared and confident to perform at their best. The wisdom and support you provide the players is first class, and your efforts are hugely appreciated. Special shout out to David "Loz" Gardiner and Billy McLerie for your assistance with warm-ups throughout the season, your commitment to the club is incredible. Thank you also to Billy, Duncan Kerr and Mark Cooper who looked after the scoring over Grand Final weekend.

Thank you to Chairman of Selectors, Michael Visser, for your efforts this season, it is never an easy task finalising teams each week with the inevitability of injury, unavailability and representative duties amongst the playing group, but the way you managed things was brilliant. Finally, thank you to the Board, your hard work behind the scenes over several years is a huge contributing factor to not only this season's success, but the overall functioning of the club too.

Now to the players. With changes on a weekly basis, 33 players represented the 4th grade side this season, different players stepping up when opportunities presented themselves, ultimately playing a significant role in the success of the final squad at the business end of the season.

**Dom Wheeler.** What a season for one of the greatest clubmen you'll ever see. 2<sup>nd</sup> in the leading run scorers across the entire competition, Dom's stability at the top of the order was a cornerstone of the team's overall success. 104\* against Mosman stands out, along with 68 vs Easts and 69 vs UNSW on difficult pitches to really show his patience and class. Battled illness all through the finals series but his work behind the stumps was simply sensational, 5 catches and an unforgettable match winning run out in the QF vs Sydney.

**Keelan Mendel.** On the back of consecutive 5th grade hundreds early on, Keelan became a key member at the top of the order in 4's for most of the remainder of the season. An unbelievable 92\* against Easts in tricky conditions proved his abundance of talent with the bat, along with other important innings throughout the season. Also a very handy medium pacer, Keelan had limited opportunities with the ball, but is always reliable. Big things ahead in coming seasons.

**Oscar Lucius.** The heartbeat of this 4th grade side for a number of years now, the energy and laughter Lush brings to the group is unmatched. While he didn't produce the output of runs he hoped for in 4's, Lush is a very patient, elegant, technically correct opening batter, and this talent was on show with gutsy runs in the 5's QF, ultimately earning a spot back in the 4's side for the final. Also an excellent wicket-keeper, Lush took the gloves for the first half of the season, before finding a home in the slips cordon during the finals.

**Nick Rigg.** Our resident Pom from abroad, Riggsey played a huge role for us, featuring in a number of matches whilst juggling a full-time medical career. A classy left-handed batter, he provided great stability to our middle order with three half centuries across the games he played. Innings of 63 vs Hawkesbury and 79 vs Mosman gave us the first glimpse of his skills, but it was a game-changing 64 against ND's in a pressure situation that was most pivotal. Provides great energy and agility in the field too, hopefully Riggsey's back again for 2023/24.

**Josh Cooper.** Another Manly junior, Coops is a talented young all-rounder, his batting the focal point of his game, on show at various stages this season. Understands his game very well, with his ability to bat for long periods of time built upon his patience and clever thinking at the crease. A maiden 100 for the club against Bankstown was the clear highlight, a testament to his hard work and commitment to his game. Bowls handy off-spin too, changing his pace cleverly, and is strong in the field.



**Jayden Kennedy.** Joining the club at the midpoint of the season, Jayden added crucial experience to the middle order. A natural clean striker of the ball across all parts of the ground, Jayden's positive approach means the game is always moving forward. On Manly debut vs Sutherland, a crucial contribution of 40 immediately highlighted his value to the team, while a solid start in the QF vs Sydney was important in stemming the flow of wickets and consolidating our first innings. Also a gun slips fielder, made 1st slip his own this season.

**George Cumming.** In his first full season for the Tahs, George played a massive role for the group, first with the ball and later with the bat. Bowls consistent left-arm orthodox spinners, his clever, subtle changes of pace a key feature of his skillset. Took 27 wickets @ 13.5 in a strong season, 5/28 against Sutherland the highlight leading us to a big win away. George's batting also proved pivotal late in the season, 57 vs Sydney in a record 10<sup>th</sup> wicket partnership to save our innings, along with an elegant 44 in the SF, a testament to the work he puts in at training.

**Adam Parkinson.** With a wealth of cricket experience at Manly, Parko was back on board for the full season, his leadership of immeasurable value to a young squad. Spent some time both in the top and middle order, a quick-fire cameo vs ND's helping us get off to a positive start in our run chase, while he scored a fighting 34\* to try to keep us in the game vs Penrith. With the ball, Parko's crafty leg-spinners were again crucial, 3fa vs Parramatta in Round 11 turning the game back in our favour, while his 2fa vs Easts also helped guide us home in a tight contest.

**Evan Dunnachie.** Ev's all-round talent was on show again throughout 2022/23, his skills with both bat and ball a big reason for the team's success. With the ability to swing the new ball, Ev took regular early wickets to get us on the front foot, 3fa's against both Blacktown and Sutherland and big wickets early in all three finals matches helping the team into strong positions. His clean ball striking and aggressive intent with the bat saw him score some crucial runs, 49 vs UNSW a standout, but arguably no more important innings than his 37\* in the Grand final.

**Lachlan Kerr.** Mr April. Kerry's performances in the finals series capped off an excellent all-round season. Took 22 wickets in 7 innings for 4's, 3/38 off 22 in the QF and 3/37 off 20 in the SF showcasing his aptitude for performing under both pressure and fatigue, a testament to his exceptional work ethic and talent. He

just kept charging in, giving his absolute all. A very talented lower order batter too, 41 vs ND's was huge in the context of that run chase, but his 58 in the SF was most vital to lead us out of a tricky situation. Also a genuine gun in the field in all areas, what a player.

**Andrew Rochford.** The skipper. To be the captain of the first team in the Club's history to win back-to-back Premierships is a phenomenal achievement. Rochy's natural skill with the ball was again displayed on various occasions, 5/42 against Mosman a clear highlight, along with 4fa vs Hawkesbury and important wicket-taking spells in the SF and GF. Like the rest of our lower order, Rochy's batting also proved significant to the team's success, 45 in the QF helping us post a competitive first innings total, as well as a late match-winning knock against ND's.

**Jake Hutchings.** On the back of consistent all-round performances, Hutcho cemented his spot in the 4's side this season, scoring 342 runs @ 48.9. This is testament to Hutcho's patience and match awareness with the bat, 126\* vs Bankstown his maiden hundred for Manly, before a gritty 147 ball innings of 54 in the QF was key to steadying our innings after a shaky start. Also a very good medium pacer, injury prevented him from bowling for much of the season, but his spell in the QF was superb, while he also proved significant in the field with numerous big plays.

**Hayden Williams.** After an injury-stricken 2021/22, Haydos kick-started the 4's season in scintillating form with the ball. A maiden Manly 5fa vs Blacktown gave us the first glimpse of his intimidating pace and ability to move the ball both ways. Hayden backed this up with classy 4fa's against Bankstown, Mosman and Easts to further highlight his talent. Also lightning quick in the field and an underrated lower order batter, Hayden was unlucky to miss out on finals for 4's, but his performances in the round games were instrumental to the team's ultimate success.

But his match-winning 4fa vs Parramatta in Round 11 stands out, as he took 3 late wickets to turn the game in our favour. Another player unlucky to miss out on the SF and GF sides, but was a crucial reason for the team's success.

With the bat, Melv's composure at the crease and ability to manipulate the field is a focal point of his game, innings of 42 vs Bankstown and 22\* vs Parramatta key to the team's success in those matches. Bowled well with little reward in several games, his medium pacers providing a crucial extra option with the ball, and also very good in the field, Melv was a big part of this squad.

I thoroughly enjoyed this season and it was great to see the improvement in all players throughout the year. These improvements are obviously due to the big efforts of the players themselves but also thanks to Roy and our fabulous team of coaches, and a massive thanks to the legend Doug McGrath. His contribution and efforts in assisting 5th grade and mentoring these young men has been invaluable. Similarly, Danny le Moy has been a great help at all of our home games.

I would like to congratulate Michael Visser on surviving his first season as Chairman of Selectors. There were so many players unavailable most weeks, and it was not an easy task. Thanks and congrats to Frase, Steve, Gains and the whole Board. The Club's success is largely thanks to your huge efforts behind the scenes.

Our pathway program is the envy of many clubs so thanks to Ross Trewartha, Kev Davies, David Gainsford, Chris Melville and Warren Evans to help maintain the smooth transition of players coming up from Warringah Shires to play 5th grade each week.

The following players enjoyed 5 or more games in 5th grade this season:

**Matt Evans.** Matt had a great first season in grade cricket and was our leading run scorer. He showed that he is capable of regularly putting together big scores with a wide range of shots. His accurate medium pacers were also a valuable partnership breaker. I would however like to see Matt embrace fielding a bit more as he tended to drift off a bit at times.

**James Waddington.** James was our leading wicket taker. He always got wickets with the new ball and beat the bat more than I can remember. He also disposed of several batters with his deadly yorker. He made big improvements with his batting technique and played some valuable innings in some tight run chases as well. Only dismissed 4 times in 9 innings so the skipper probably should have batted him higher.

**Reiley Dunlop.** Reiley didn't have as great a year as last with the bat, but was great with the gloves behind the stumps and is a leader in this team. He captained the two games I missed and led them to an outright and a near outright win. His energy and enthusiasm are the backbone that drove the team forward throughout the season.

In particular, congratulations to Jamo's 2s boys and Rochy's 4s boys for taking home the Premiership in your respective grades – a phenomenal achievement!

The PG's season of 2022/23 saw the competition format shift back to four T20 matches, combined with 2 one-day matches. 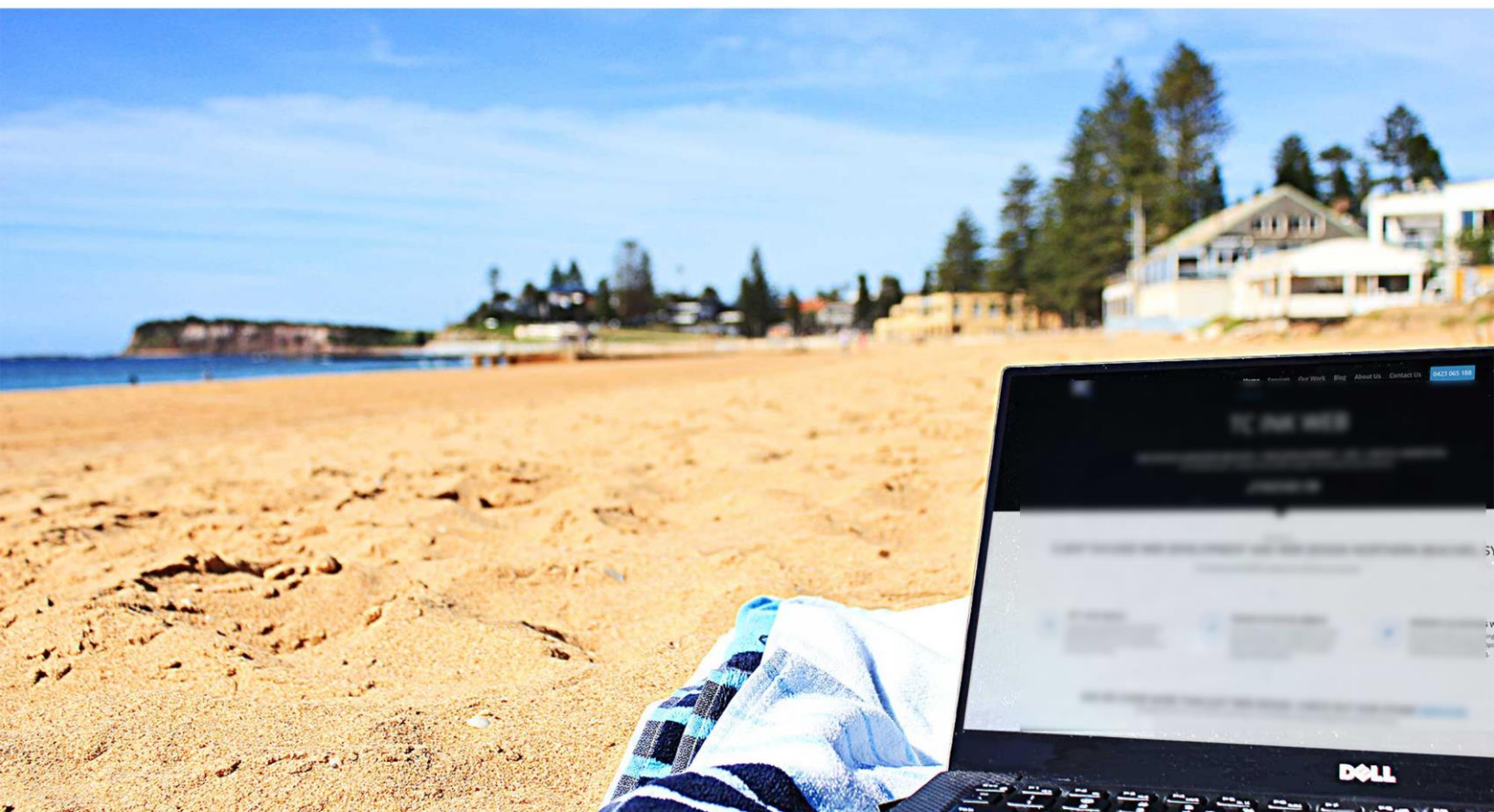

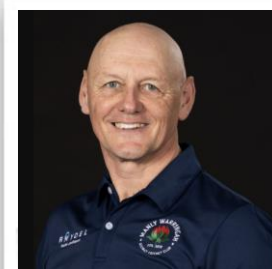
try to keep them uninjured and able to play every week! Our job is always to make sure that we can help the girls reach their full potential,
