*"It's like déjà vu all over again"*

It was to be déjà vu for 3rd grade in season 2023/24, ultimately drawing a tightly fought Grand final to be bridesmaids once again. Despite the heartache of a second consecutive drawn final, full credit must go to the Sydney University side who put together a fantastic season to finish as runaway Minor premiers and eventual champions.

Third grade is blessed to have so much support from our volunteers at this great Club – so a massive thank you must go to the many people that give their time, allowing this team to go out each weekend and enjoy their cricket to the fullest. Special mention must go to our ultimate 12<sup>th</sup> man Noah Vumbaca who has continued to be the heart and soul of this side. Not only does Noah do everything for us off the field, it was incredible to see him and President's Award winner Will Gustafson achieve their own on-field success in that infamous finish at Mike Pawley Oval. Lastly, Roy Vumbaca also needs special mention for everything he has achieved as Head Coach over the past 2 seasons and bringing the best out of our people!

Despite the disappointment of missing out on the Mitchell Cup, it was another phenomenal season for a 3rd grade side that looked a long way away from a Grand final after losing 3 of its first 4 games. Unavailabilities meant ongoing changes throughout the first part of the season, truncating any momentum and continuity we looked to build.

The turning point however came in round 5, when the side put together a comprehensive outright victory against Hawkesbury that was headlined by Josh Lawson's 9 wickets for the match. Josh went from a 5th grade Grand finalist last season to a 2nd grade debutant in less than 12 months, improving week after week to lead the attack in 3's.

More strong results in the lead up to Christmas against Wests (featuring an 18 from 4 balls by Ellis Raymond to seal a bonus point!) and Campbelltown dragged us back

into the mix. Outside of a humbling out at St Pauls against eventual champions Sydney Uni, we continued our strong form right through to March with tight wins against Mosman, Parramatta and Randwick.

One thing that stood out throughout the regular season was the side's ability to pull itself out of tight situations and pinch results through all-round contributions. Campbelltown by 5 runs, Parramatta by 3 runs, Mosman by 7 runs, Randwick by 2 wickets – we won games we probably had no right in winning – a characteristic of any great team. While batting was the Achilles heel (no shock to anyone that follows Manly cricket closely), the number of innings played by Evan Dunnachie, Fraser Noack, Josh Coyte, and even our resident tail enders Trewartha/Lawson that won us these games cannot be understated – a true testament to the side's tenacity!

So after 16 rounds and finishing with a wet sail, we had reached 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the standings and set up a QF with previous champions Parramatta. A great all-round batting display led by skipper Hole (105) and Merchant (73) got us through this first test, before a great SF win over Easts led by 3rd grade one-hit wonders O'Sullivan (5fa) and B.Mendel (65) saw us through to the GF.

A beautiful weekend at University Oval greeted us and with a favourable toss we batted, dragging ourselves to an even 200 thanks to fighting contributions from Z.Trewartha and F.Noack. With 104 overs to take 10 wickets we were confident of driving a result, however a gritty afternoon of batting left us needing 8 wickets in the final session. Enter Evan Dunnachie who bowled nearly 20 overs unchanged, taking 4 wickets to drag us back into the contest and make for a nervy final hour of play. It wasn't to be however, with the Students reaching 197/6 to seal the Cup.

Disappointment yes, but in a season that saw many fresh faces and 33 players featuring, it was such a monumental effort to come this far, and one everyone should be truly proud of.



I want to finish by thanking some of the other players in this group that made the season possible and so enjoyable. Firstly to Lachie Charles, our stand-in captain multiple times throughout the year, I know it wasn't the season and finish in 3rd grade he deserved, but his development as a leader was a treat to see and I hope he continues rolling out for the Waratahs in the future. To Sam Webber, a constant source of wisdom and one of the Club's great servants, we'll get that Premiership eventually! And finally to Cam Merchant, it's not often you get an 8,000+ runs player join your side, so for 'Nappa' to bring not only all the on-field experience but his energy and perspective off the field as well, was the catalyst for this team to achieve what it did.

**Andrew Boulton.** It's remarkable that Boults is into his 4<sup>th</sup> season around this 3rd grade side, despite having just turned 17 years old. 224 runs at 32 (our highest average) doesn't jump off the page, however Andrew consistently scored runs when the team needed him the most, including match-winning half centuries in tight wins over Mosman & Campbelltown. I can't wait to see Boults back bowling again; he certainly won't be featuring in 3rd grade if so.

With four more one-dayers before Christmas, the Tahs went 4 from 4, dominant against Fairfield-Liverpool before backs-to-the-wall victories over Sydney and Western Suburbs, and a remarkable win inside 2.5 hours against Campbelltown-Camden. Post-Christmas, victories against Bankstown and Randwick-Petersham didn't come easy, before a big batting collapse saw a Round 13 tie with Sydney Uni. The next-man-up, never-say-die mentality was exemplified with a thrilling away win against Parramatta, followed by two more strong team victories over Mosman and Penrith to round out the regular season, booking a home Qualifying final.

Bankstown were the opponents for the QF, an excellent team effort across the board leading the Tahs to a dominant victory. This was followed by an intense, topsy-turvy SF against Western Suburbs, the Tahs' fighting attitude ultimately the difference to secure a home Grand Final at the beautiful Manly Oval. And to put it simply, the Tahs were unstoppable in the GF, a well-rounded batting performance followed by a demolition job from the bowlers, securing the Premiership and confirming the three-peat!

The continued success of this Club and the 4th grade side would not be possible without the dedication of the coaching and support staff across the whole season. To Roy Vumbaca, second year as Club Coach, two Club Championships under your belt speaks volumes of your tireless work ethic behind the scenes. Not just this, but the values and standards, both at training and on game days, you consistently drive to the playing group and your staff, is a major reason for the Club's strong culture and performance. To David Gainsford, words don't do justice the mountain of work you do on a weekly basis to ensure everything is organised for the playing group and staff. Your commitment and passion, and your genuine care and support of everyone, is incredible. Not to mention stepping into the Chairman of Selectors role, dealing with unavailability and selection headaches most weeks, yet still managing to make things work, a huge factor to the Club's success.

Thank you to all the coaching staff, Board, and volunteers who also played a significant role this season, and for your assistance with 4th grade. Particular mention to Billy McLerie for your regular help with warm-ups, and to parents Mark Cooper and Dave McDowell for assisting with scoring throughout the finals series.

Onto the players. With the inevitability of change almost every week due to unavailability, higher grade rep commitments and injury, there were 36 players who represented the Tahs 4th grade side this season. The following players are those who formed the Premiership winning XI:

**Jayden Kennedy.** Our vice-captain and hard-hitting opening bat, Jayden's destructive power against the new ball sparked fear in opposition bowlers. 501 runs @ 33.4 with many crucial yet entertaining knocks; his first innings efforts in the SF and GF vital in the outcome of both those matches. Jayden is also safe as houses in the cordon, while his calmness and wise counsel was another important source of leadership.

**Lachlan Charles.** We were blessed with the addition of Charlesy for the finals series, his talent with the bat on show with an entertaining 49 in the SF and a patient half-century in the GF. Both classy knocks to help the team into strong positions. Another excellent pair of hands with a number of catches throughout the finals, while his infectious character provided great enjoyment and comradery within the group.

**Josh Cooper.** Now a 3-time 4th Grade Premiership winner, Coops began the season with a number of starts but couldn't break through for a big score, until a classy 66 vs Mosman turned things around. Followed by a match-winning 80\* in the QF, backed up with another crucial half-century in the GF, showcasing Coops' potential. Someone you love to have in your team, Coops' cagey off-spinners also provided another reliable option with the ball.

**Ollie Melville.** With Melv in the team, you know that the team will always come first, and that speaks volumes to his character. A breakthrough year with the bat for the great man, dominating in 5th grade and regularly earning his spot in 4's. A lone hand of 70 against Sydney Uni emphasising his talent and a testament to his consistent hard work. An excellent fielder and another handy option with the ball too.

**Jake Hutchings.** A youngster with an abundance of all-round talent, we only got to see Hutcho for the second half of the season, but that didn't stop him from making his mark. Patience and elegance with the bat, crucial innings against Mosman and Penrith, while his relentless line and length with the ball will be a weapon for the future. Very athletic in the field, it won't be long before we see Hutcho dominating in higher grades.

**Brodie McDowell.** In his debut grade season, Brodie was sensational with the bat and behind the stumps. A crucial member of the middle-order, able to be patient when needed but can also take down bowling attacks, Brodie's 94\* against Wests, battling severe cramp, highlighted his talent, while his unbeaten 52\* in the SF

guided the team home under pressure. Kept very well too, and will be up the grades in a matter of time.

**Adam Parkinson.** Our skipper. Parko's leadership was central to his 4th grade side making it 3 consecutive Premierships, with calmness under pressure and great support and guidance for all squad members. Played multiple match-winning innings to dig the team out of trouble, 48\* vs Bankstown, 51\* vs Wests, and 45 vs Parramatta the standouts. More crucial wickets with his wily leg-spinners, and ever-reliable in the cordon too.

**George Cumming.** The boy from Orange cemented his role as our lead spinner this season, with 20 wickets @ 17.2, and was unlucky not to have more opportunities with the ball due to the consistency and success of our quicks. A second innings 3fa in the SF pivotal in the outcome of that fixture. Reliable lower-order bat, and our nightwatchman, George's patient innings against Parramatta and in the GF reflect his all-round skills and strong work ethic.

**Ryan Bishop-Perrett.** To put it simply, RBP is too good for 4th grade, but with the strength of higher grades, we were blessed with his relentless consistency at times throughout the season and again for finals. His man-of-the-match performance in the GF tearing apart the opposition middle order thanks to his ability to move the ball both ways at pace. Also played a crucial innings in the GF, and provided another senior figure around the group.

**James Waddington.** One member of our dynamic new-ball combination, Waddo had a brilliant season, taking 32 wickets @ 17.6, his quick arm action and ability to swing the new-ball causing all sorts of problems for opposition batters. 5fa against Hawkesbury and 4fa vs Campbelltown were highlights, but arguably his best effort was the 3 absolute jaffers in the QF to change the game. Another great team man, and handy lower-order bat to boot.

**Will Skinner.** The spearhead of our bowling attack, Skins formed the other part of a lethal new-ball combination, taking a remarkable 43 wickets @ 12.5 to mark a phenomenal season. Maiden 5fa against Sydney, 6fa vs Randwick, and incredible consistency across long spells in the finals series to lead the attack. One of the great humans and team players, Skins worked very hard on his batting and fielding too, and is one to watch for the future.



We also had a number of other players who featured in 5 or more fixtures in 4th grade this season:

**Jack Melchior.** After a phenomenal run of scores in 5's, Choi earned his spot in 4's at various stages, and didn't look out of place with a couple of impressive innings. His gritty 50 vs St George as wickets tumbled around him highlighted his ability to bat long periods.

**Keelan Mendel.** Keelan is a super talented cricketer, and while he didn't quite have the output of runs in 4's that he hoped for, his all-round potential was clear with a match-winning 57 vs Penrith, multiple important wickets, and his incredible ability in the field.

**Oscar Lucius.** Another gifted wicket-keeper batter, Lush didn't quite reach his lofty standards this season, but his gutsy 29\* against Bankstown proved match-defining, to go with two hauls of five catches behind the stumps. One of the all-time great clubmen too.

**Kai Croft.** Joining the Club this season from up north, Croft works hard on his game and is one to watch for the future. Can play multiple roles with the bat, and offers great skills and consistency with both new and old ball. Will continue to get better with experience.

Huge thank you also to all the other players who represented the 4th grade side this season, without whom we could not have achieved this success.

So there you have it. From the first ball of Round 1 on the 30<sup>th</sup> of September 2023, to the match-winning Grand Final wicket on the 31<sup>st</sup> of March 2024, this 4th grade side stuck together as a unit, stayed calm under pressure, and had a phenomenal will to win from any position. And more than anything, it was a whole squad effort, with everyone standing up on different occasions and proving decisive in matches.

Unforgettable season for the Tahs, congratulations again to every team across both the Men's and Women's programs. To everyone who made this season possible, from the playing group, coaching staff, Board and volunteers, to parents and families, and the Tahs community, we thank you, and look forward with anticipation to 2024/25.

What a record breaking season for the Club!

The 5th grade season started well, chasing Sutherland's total down for the loss of just one wicket. Which we did again in Round 3 and similarly in Round 4 where we only lost 2 wickets. Throw in a 7 wicket win against North Sydney in Round 2 and we were off to a flyer. All those games included hundreds to Kai Croft, Brodie McDowell and two to Jack Melchior. We then beat Hawkesbury outright and had two good wins against St George and Fairfield. Undefeated and all was going well. Everyone was contributing and we could do no wrong.

In Round 8 we battled hard on a slow outfield in 40 degree heat with Reiley Dunlop making a gutsy 76 only to have the temperature tip over 42 degrees in the lunch interval, preventing us from getting back out. Heat abandonment and no points. Then we had a massive collapse against Wests on a green top at Grahams to lose 9/21 after being 1/64 chasing 143. It was a poor performance all round and it gave us the wake up call we needed. This put us back into 2<sup>nd</sup> place behind Parramatta who were also travelling along well.

We came back strongly with a dominant win over Campbelltown, with Reuben Kapoor notching up his first ton and Raj Ganeshraj returning to Sydney to bag 6 wickets. We followed that up by knocking over Bankstown for 92 before Jake Hutchings hit 31 off 16 to get us home in 16 overs, as he had a party to go to.

Back home then to Randy-Petes we knocked them over for 76 before Jack Melchior put on another unbeaten hundred to set up the chance of an outright. The bowlers did their job taking another 10 wickets to leave us 14 to win off only 1 over remaining. Jack Melchior hit the first ball for 6 but then got run out. We needed all 6 balls though, as Reiley Dunlop and Jake Hutchings brought us home with some speedy running between the wickets.

We had a strong win over Sydney Uni but our Round 14 clash with Parramatta was looming. We were 5 points behind them and a win would leap frog us into top place and take valuable bragging rights going into the finals.

However, our playing ranks were decimated and Gains went into over-drive trying to find 11 players to play in this vital match, as our pathway players were locked in their finals qualification push as well. A couple of clinical wins in the last two rounds set up the Minor premiership for the second year running.

Our Qualifying final against Sydney Uni and Semi final against Gordon were good all round performances, highlight by Reuben Kapoor's 131 in the QF and Kai Croft taking 8 of Gordon's 20 wickets.

This set us up for a Grand Final with Parramatta who had, like us, dominated the competition all year. The weather was good and the plan was to bat as long as possible. Late changes with Second grade's SF loss and some tough decisions to make. Reiley Dunlop and Myles Kapoor came back into the 11 and both didn't disappoint. Parramatta bowled very well but our batters were up to the task with great discipline to bat Parramatta out of the game with Myles Kapoor notching up his first grade hundred.

Our bowling group has been phenomenal all year, and it didn't matter who I gave the ball to, the talent and consistency was always well above 5th grade standard. We had two of the quickest in the comp in Julian Osbourne and Chris Halloran and a plethora of seamers with consistency, swing and seam to build pressure and take wickets in Jordan Brewster, Kai Croft, Luke Watts and Will Matheson as well as many other all-rounders.

I thoroughly enjoyed this season and it was great to see the improvement in all players throughout the year. These improvements are obviously due to the big efforts of the players themselves but also thanks to Roy and our fabulous team of coaches, and a massive thanks to legend Doug McGrath. His contribution and efforts in assisting 5th grade and mentoring these young men has been invaluable. Doug is a massive asset to me at training and on game day.

I was also lucky to have other leaders in the playing group like Reiley Dunlop, Chris Halloran and Jordan Brewster. Special thanks to Reiley who captained the team for a few rounds in my absence.

David Gainsford does a mountain of work for the Club and took on the Chairman of Selectors role when Michael Visser departed. He was a massive help to me in finding players and liaising with Kev Davies and Chris Melville at Warringah Shires when we were short. Our pathway program is the envy of many clubs so thanks to Kev, Gains and Chris to help maintain the smooth transition of players and ensure our new players are all ready for the step up into 5th grade.

The following players enjoyed 5 or more games in 5th grade this season.

**Jack Melchior.** Jack is proof that hard work and patience pays off. He spent the whole of last season hitting balls when ankle and foot injuries prevented him from running and playing matches. His attendance at training was still one of the highest in the club. His three hundreds were all red. Opposition teams just could not get him out. His discipline and patience will see him score runs in higher grades as well. He also took some freakish catches in gully and slips. Great season scoring 471 runs at an average of 94. Amazing.

**Reiley Dunlop.** Reiley scored almost 300 runs in 5's this year and did his job as a bat but offers so much more. With a few good young keepers coming into the club, Reiley selflessly offered to stand aside from keeping duties and applied his usual work ethic to improve his

fielding and general ground speed, and the difference in a few months was really noticeable. Reiley has been one of the leaders in this team for a few years now. He captained the few games I missed and like last year, the team always wins when he is leading. His energy and enthusiasm are the backbone that drove the team forward throughout the year.

**Julian Osbourne.** Jules was one of the new kids on the block and stood up to be noticed. He was our leading wicket taker with 39 wickets. He took wickets in every match including a 7 wicket haul against Fairfield. He was fast and consistent. His fast inswinging yorker was too quick for many 5th graders but his slower ball probably got more wickets and I am struggling to recall a batter who actually picked it.

**Reuben Kapoor.** After completing his HSC, Reuben played a couple of games in Shires before getting an opportunity in 5's which he took with both hands. I wasn't there but I am told his 115 off 108 balls against Campbelltown-Camden was all class and included shots to all parts of the ground. From here he didn't look back, getting a few starts and another hundred in the QF. He also showed his talent with the gloves forcing his way into the keeping spot with tough competition.

**Ollie Melville.** Ollie relished the opportunity to bat higher in the order this year. In 5's, he scored over 30 in 6 of his 8 innings – great discipline and focus to see off the new ball and get through the hard stuff. His next challenge is to convert these into big hundreds. He scored 573 runs across all grades without scoring a ton. This is a great effort and a truly consistent year to build on and a great reward for work done to date.

**Kai Croft.** Kai made an immediate impact when he joined us this year scoring 120\* on debut. While he didn't have any other big scores, he did have a few starts and scored a valuable 49 in the GF. But Kai made great contributions with the ball as well taking 21 wickets at 12.48 in 9 matches including two 5 fa's. He is quicker than batters expect, and his consistent outswinger will help him move up the grades.

**Chris Halloran.** Chris did a mountain of work in the gym to get his body right for this season after a few injuries last season and it gave him an extra yard of pace as well. With this strength and more bowling volume he will quickly get back to what he is capable of. He showed glimpses this year with two 4 fa's. Not many opportunities with the bat but his work ethic will reap rewards soon. A great help with young bowlers as well.



**Jordan Brewster.** Jordy brought a few years of grade experience to our mostly young bowling line up. He seemed a bit rusty in pre-season and I honestly wasn't sure how he would go. But he worked hard and steadily improved throughout the year. He was at his best when he didn't try to bowl too fast and just focused on bowling full and straight. He did that against Bankstown taking 4/23 on a flattish wicket. He wouldn't be happy with his batting scores, but the talent is there. Batting lower than he is used to probably also didn't help, but such was the talent in our top order this year.

**Luke Watts.** Luke is another of our all-rounders of the future. He started the season well with 61\* in Round 1 and 78 in 4's. He showed a great temperament in these innings but wasn't always able to replicate these. It can be hard opening up with the occasional unplayable delivery, but he got out between 10-30 eight times so needs to work hard on getting through that next stage. He is however also a talented bowler. While returning from injury he was limited to small spells but was able to take 4 wickets in the second innings against Randy-Petes to help us to the outright win.

**Will Matheson.** Will didn't start the season as expected. He went wicketless in the first two matches but beat the bat numerous times and had a couple of catches dropped off his bowling. He put a lot of pressure on himself early but he started to relax into his work and by Round 6 was starting to bowl really well. Unfortunately his back started to give him some pain and his season ended prematurely with injury. He has a lot of talent with the bat and can score quickly. His 28 off 18 against Campbelltown was proof of that. Another talented all-rounder who could easily bat higher.

**Lukas Overhoff.** Lukas had a great season scoring over 600 runs in all cricket. This included many consistent starts and Lukas is certainly capable of turning these starts into bigger scores. In Manly 5's he averaged 38 with the bat, so is definitely ready to play this level. Just a shame I couldn't find room for him in our finals team when all first-class players came back, but Lukas is one of our stars of the future. He was so calm under pressure in his Green Shield captaincy to take them to the Premiership.

**Jack Donnan.** Jack had a solid start to the season with three 40s in the first four rounds, but it just shows how tough the competition was for batting spots this year as a form slump in the middle of the season saw him eventually dropped to Shires. He is much better than that though and any other year would have kept his

spot in 5's. Great to see him getting a few more overs with his offies as well. Keep working hard Jack, the results will come.

**Liam Dinan.** Liam had a great pre-season and came into Round 1 in form earning a spot in 3's. Unfortunately, he found ways to get out all year and his preference to play as a bat when others around him were scoring runs meant that I had the hard decision to rest Liam for the finals when players came back. His bowling however is always on the money. If Manly wasn't so strong this year he would have played a leading role in this team.

**Oscar Lucius.** Oscar's scores with the bat this year are not a good reflection on his ability or his attitude nor his contribution to the team. He is a valuable team member in any team and always provides a positive aura. I was lucky to have so many great keepers playing 5's throughout year and Oscar has shown he is much better than 5's in that respect.

There were also players who played less than 5 games in 5th grade this year, but despite only playing a few games they all made a valued contribution to 5th grade this season. 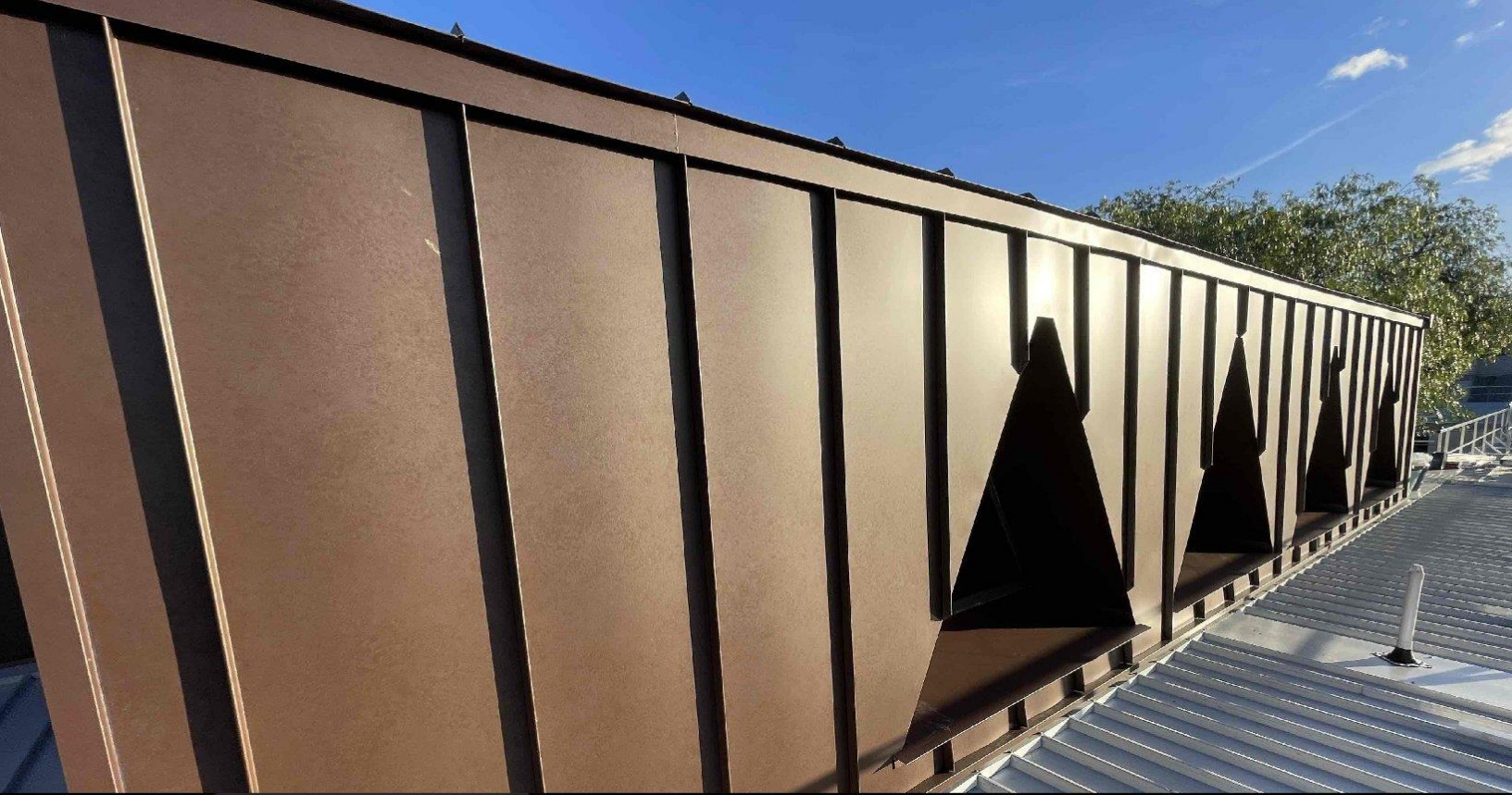

Everyone bought into my enthusiasm and drive, and as a result we got all 4 teams into the Semi finals and 2 teams into Grand finals with one team, the mighty Third grade side, winning a Premiership!

My coaches were amazing, with Dom Wheeler doing a mighty job again with First grade who were defeated in the Semi final by a Sydney side who ultimately went on to win the comp. In the team this year we also had one of our overseas players the very experienced Georgia Adams – an outstanding player with excellent pedigree (her father Chris Adams played for England). She added another level of experience to the team and scored 100 on debut in a remarkable knock. Unfortunately for us, but great for her, Georgia got picked to play for England A in New Zealand so had to leave us and missed out playing our Semi final game. Georgia was picked up by NSW and after some great performances was made

captain of NSW. A fantastic year for her and as a Club we are very proud. Georgia has also just committed to coming back next season!



Second grade was again coached by Mechelle Hare and captained by Renee Hough, who had been our Third grade captain for the last few seasons and deserved her promotion. In the first 7 rounds back from Christmas, the team was undefeated with 6 wins and a washout which put us into 2<sup>nd</sup> place. Round 17 against St George-Sutherland was the top of the table clash with the winner most likely to become Minor premiers. St George batted first and were restricted to 132 in their 50 overs with the wickets shared amongst our bowlers. To their credit, St George bowled some excellent line and lengths, particularly early in their innings which made it difficult for us to find any sort of momentum. It came down to the final 5 overs where we required 15 runs. However, some outstanding fielding and bowling resulted in a win to St George. The following week however, the girls got back on the horse and smashed Campbelltown-Camden to end the regular season in 3<sup>rd</sup> position.

This set up a huge Semi final clash against Sydney at Drummoyne Oval. Sydney was successful on the day but nonetheless, it was a history making season for Manly, as well as the First Grade girls who made the finals for the first time ever in the Club's history.

I look forward to seeing how much improvement there is to come in the First Grade team as well as the Club overall on the Women's side as there is an abundance of talent coming through. I thoroughly enjoyed this season as I got to see how a Club can come together as one and support each other in the good, the bad, and the ugly. Onto bigger and better things next year!

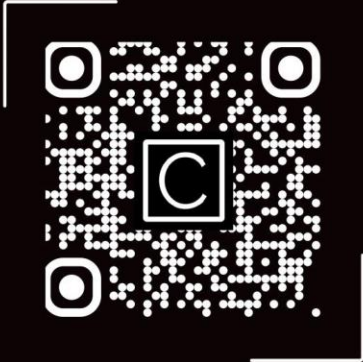
