Community Cricket

The 2024/25 season was another standout year off the field for the Manly Warringah District Cricket Club, with a series of community and fundraising initiatives that showcased the spirit, generosity, and impact of our players, coaches, and supporters. Some of the key highlights from the Manly for Manly Community Program, that saw us raise over \$26,000 for our charity partners were:

Beach2Beach Fun Run

Our annual pre-season Beach2Beach Fun Run was a tremendous success, with 59 club members hitting the pavement, earning us the title of the largest team in the event. Together, we raised an impressive \$7,362 for *The Burdekin Association*, with an additional \$2,000 bonus donation awarded for our team size, which we proudly directed to *Mike Pawley's Happy Days* charity.



Movember Campaign

This season marked our most successful Movember campaign to date. A group of players and a few coaches grew their moustaches in support of men's health, raising an incredible \$14,225. Notable individual efforts came from Doug McGrath, who raised \$4,850, and Matt Sunshine, who passed the \$2,000 mark for the 2nd year in a row.



Junior Community Coaching Blitz

In February, we delivered 12 junior coaching sessions across the Northern Beaches as part of our Manly for Manly community outreach. The sessions were well received by local clubs and participants, further cementing our commitment to inspiring the next generation of Tahs. We're excited to grow this program even further next season.

NBCF Pink Day

Our women's triple-header in December provided the perfect backdrop for our *National Breast Cancer Foundation Pink Day*. The day featured a community sausage sizzle, bake sale, and a moving breast cancer awareness event in the RATT. Thanks to the support of our community, we raised \$3,239 for the NBCF. More than 40 people attended the session, where we heard from a local breast cancer surgeon, nurse, and survivor, all proud members of the Northern Beaches community.

This relationship continues to grow stronger, with great camaraderie and competition shown across the 6 day tour. The standard of cricket was terrific, with both clubs showcasing the best of their emerging talent, ending in a 2-2 result from the 4 matches. The hospitality and resources offered to our players and staff was outstanding and reaffirmed the values both clubs show in developing people through cricket.

Whangarei is where former MWDC great Craig 'Genie' Little now resides, and he is heavily involved in the City CC community. The Club would like to offer our thanks to Genie and Joey Yovich, who were both instrumental in getting the tour organised and providing an unforgettable experience for our players. Special thanks also to the entire City CC for their tireless work to organise and host the tour, as well as the Northland Cricket Association for providing transport and the use of Cobham Oval. Finally, to Andre Calitz and the Green by Nature staff for their work in getting the ground prepared to excellent conditions for the tour games, despite some adverse weather conditions.

The squad's bond grew massively over the tour, with several memorable experiences and activities put forward for the group. These included a tour of the Waitangi Treaty grounds and the All Blacks Experience tour in Auckland, as well as many of the local establishments in Whangarei.

A massive thank you also goes to David Gainsford for his mammoth effort to organise the tour on our end. Without his efforts, this trip simply couldn't have gone ahead or run with such ease. We look forward to welcoming City CC back to Sydney in the future, to continue to grow this Trans-Tasman bond even further.

The MCA opened on 1 June with Cricket Australia Chairman Mike Baird bowling the first ball to NSW Captain Jack Edwards at the official opening.

The Club has invested heavily in the project, so to help raise some funds towards the centre, we have scheduled an Ashes Luncheon Fundraiser to be held on 21 November, being the first day of the First Test – so mark down that date in your calendars.

I'd like to personally thank Steve Beatty who has made a monumental contribution to this project over the last 12 months – been awesome working with you on this one Stevo!

We are a community club and without tireless volunteers it simply doesn't run. To every one of you who are the life-blood of MWDCC – thank you for the countless hours contributed.

We thank our Patrons Michael Regan, James Griffin and Mike Baird for their support during the season.

Green Options are contracted by Council to prepare and maintain our grounds and their expertise and dedication is vital to our success.

The Club continues to invest in the future of cricket. I am pleased to present the audited financial statements of the Manly Warringah District Cricket Club for the year ended 30th April 2025.

The 2024/25 season marked another strong financial year for the Club, with an operating surplus of \$86,270 – a significant increase on the prior year's surplus of \$55,469. This improvement reflects our prudent financial management and the continued commitment of our sponsors, supporters, and the broader cricket community.

While our total income of \$351,792 was slightly down from \$356,474 in 2024, the Club maintained healthy revenues from sponsorships (\$177,400), grants (\$91,994), and strong fundraising efforts (\$26,136). Our Annual Golf Day was a great success and contributed most of the fundraising revenue.

On the expense side, total costs decreased to \$265,522, down from \$301,005. We saw savings in several areas including clothing purchases, coaching expenses, and players' expenses. However, we made notable investments in playing and training facilities and equipment (reflected in the higher depreciation), coaching, and general operations, ensuring continued support for our players and the development of our facilities.

Our Balance Sheet remains strong, with net assets increasing to \$570,875, up from \$484,605 last year. Cash reserves remain healthy although have

reduced as we continue to invest in long-term assets and infrastructure to

support the future of cricket in the district. Notably, the provision for the purchase of fixed assets was \$72,376, which is our net investment to date in the Indoor Centre, indicating continued investment in the Club's facilities and equipment.

Projects such as the Mike Pawley Oval upgrades, Seaforth Oval development, and the Manly Cricket Academy Indoor Centre are advancing and will provide long-term benefits for our playing community.

I would like to express my sincere gratitude to all our sponsors, particularly Mounties as our major partner, and to Cricket NSW for their continued investment in community cricket. A special thank you to the team at Enspira Financial, and Doug Wood from Foster Raffan, who again provided their professional services on an honorary basis, your generosity is appreciated.

Thank you to all members and supporters for another outstanding year. I look forward to what promises to be an exciting 2025/26 season.

There were several very special individual and team achievements which highlighted season 2024/25 and for which we are very proud. Whilst across the Club we did not achieve the same level of success as the previous two years, the players' response to this gives much optimism moving forward.

The 4th Grade side winning the competition for four consecutive years and in doing so their captain, Adam Parkinson, winning the most Premierships in the Club's history, was simply phenomenal. To also win the Poidevin-Gray competition for the first time in decades was a remarkable triumph and reflects the depth of talent who will be the foundation for the Club's success in the coming years.

The 2nd Grade group were somewhat in a rebuilding phase having lost a significant amount of playing experience from last year. To replace that experience with a very youthful group of players and to finish runners-up, ultimately just a fraction from the title, was an outstanding achievement. The 5th Grade side, consisting predominately of our Pathway players, finished a respectable third, having been dominant throughout the season, unfortunately faltering in the semi-final. The fifth place 3rd Grade side were courageous in their quarter final loss but will regret several missed opportunities throughout the regular season to position themselves higher leading into finals.

The 1st Grade team's season was greatly compromised by their results in white ball matches. Often in these matches they were on top, or very close, but the full extent of not being at their best for longer periods in games ultimately brought their season unstuck. A young Green Shield side showed early promise but were overpowered in the back half of the season. A number of these players will still be eligible next season so we are confident they will build on their experience for greater success next year. All of this combined to have the Club finish 4th in the Club Championship. Definitely a lot to celebrate and be proud of as a Club. Within this annual report, many of the outstanding player and team performances contributing to the Club's successes will be specifically detailed.

From a coaching perspective, a pleasing outcome highlighted in season reviews, was the feeling from

many players that our level of achievement across the Club was good, but not good enough. There was an expectation of

better performance standards and a genuine desire to work harder from the start of the pre-season to ensure we achieve more. It is encouraging that this desire is already within our playing group and they intrinsically set high personal, team and Club standards.

We are blessed to have a wonderful playing group, filled with players who are driven, connected, hardworking, listen and are a lot of fun to be around. They are shaped and guided by our brilliant team and Club captains who drive our Club's high standards. Jay Lenton, Jordan Daly, Sam Hole, Sam Webber, Adam Parkinson, and Simon Waddington are great leaders who go to great lengths each week to give their players every opportunity to perform at their optimum, enjoy each other's company and be the best version of a Waratah cricketer. They have been complemented by our new Club Captains Ollie Melville and Jacob O'Sullivan, who have excelled in their roles. They model admirably the qualities we want in our players, both on and off the field.

Once again, the coaching, training and support staff consisting of Aidan Baker, Ahillen Beadle, Jackson Bird, Simon Couch, Mickey Edwards, Ryan Farrell, David Gainsford, David Gardiner, Will Gustafson, Will Harding, Andrew Jamieson, Doug McGrath, Chris Melville, Cameron Merchant, Sam Mesite, Mike O'Neill, Paul O'Sullivan, Bobby Rollins, Donny Singe and Ross Trewartha have been instrumental in guiding and developing our playing group to higher levels. You all have a very high cricket IQ but always impart your knowledge and experience with specific individual player need and care. The players have the utmost respect for what you do for them to help them improve and enjoy their cricket. It is a pleasure working with such a cohesive and talented staff and comforting knowing our players are so well instructed and cared for by each of you. In particular, a massive thank you to David Gainsford who does so much for the coaching and playing group at so many levels to ensure we are always trying to be our best and then even better.



To all members of the Board, thank you for the incredible support you provide the playing and coaching group. You are such an effective and progressive group who maximise the Club's chance for success. Thank you for the enormous task of making an indoor centre a reality. Generations of players and coaches will be grateful.

We would like to thank you for the privilege of being able to coach at this wonderful cricket club. We

certainly do not take it for granted and are truly grateful for the impressive people we are fortunate enough to work with. Thank you for all who have contributed to support us. We look forward to working with you all next year where we will continue to work harder and be better.

I want to start off by saying what an honour it is to have been given the opportunity to captain Second grade at Manly. Manly is such a strong Club, full of great leaders and to have been entrusted in this role is humbling. Only with renewed passion and a desire to improve each year can we continue to build on the success that this great Club has enjoyed in recent years.

I'd like to congratulate all other captains and especially the hard-working coaching staff – Men's and Women's – on another strong year. In particular I'd like to thank Roy, Gainsy, Jay and Jamo for their time and patience supporting me in this new role. A huge congratulations also to Adam Parkinson and his 4th Grade team and Aidan Baker and the PG's boys for their historic Premiership wins. To all of our fellow players and followers who supported us through finals and at the GF, thank you. And last, but far from least, a huge thanks to our manager, Will Harding, who has continued to support us week in, week out. The passion he has for Manly and the 2nd Grade team is inspiring and we appreciate everything he does for us.

Season 2024/25 was a season of the highest of highs and the lowest of lows. Certainly the most of any season I've played. Looking back, I couldn't be prouder of every person who took the field with us. I want to thank everyone for the positivity, commitment and openness to learning that they brought, and above all the team-first, selfless cricket that was played throughout the year. This, along with our complete refusal to concede defeat on numerous occasions, led to many unforgettable moments and incredible wins.

Taking the baton from 5's (temporarily I hope), it was 2's this year that had the most number of players (25) take the field across the season. With injuries in the top 3 grades playing a big part in this, particularly after Christmas, we saw a number of players step up and take the opportunities that arose. All in all, we had 6 of our team earn a promotion to 1's – Andrew Boulton, Roop Dhillon, Matt Sunshine, Josh Lawson, Henry Rogers, and Zach Trewartha.

We were a team that knew how to find a way to win. We showed this, with match-winning performances shared around in tight, gritty wins against Gordon (6 balls to spare), North Sydney (taking 6/50 to win by 10 runs), Easts (taking 10/67 to win by 27 runs), St George (1 run), Sydney (taking the final wicket in the 188th over of the match to win with 6 balls to spare). These wins – and the near-reverse-outfighting of Campbelltown in week 1 of finals – reinforced for us a simple fact easily forgotten: if an entire team wants to win a game badly enough and is prepared to go all in together, there are few teams who can stand in their way.

The 3-week finals series itself was an amazing experience. Filled with not just cricketing learnings but also memories I will cherish forever. Together, alongside Willy Harding, we shared two Campbelltown sunsets; a sunrise each at Campbelltown and Waitara; and toiled together in both the wettest and hottest of conditions. As heartbreaking as it was to fight so much bad luck and external factors beyond our control (multiple injuries, weather, away fixtures) and get so close to what would have been a Grand final win for the ages, I cannot fault the character, commitment, resilience and courage that the team showed. Each player went above and beyond. There is nothing more that could have been asked of them.

Brynmor Mendel. What can you even say about the man who now sits just behind Victor Trumper for most sixes hit in a Sydney Grade Cricket innings. Trumper's record of 22 still standing after 120 years would suggest that Brynn's 21 sixes may also remain unmatched. Those there will never forget this innings and the incredible impact of the patience and intelligence that Brynn showed as he completely demolished, demoralised and traumatised the Sydney bowling attack. This, combined with multiple other innings – including as top-scorer in the Grand final – in a season of nearly 700 runs showed that Brynn has begun blending intelligence and maturity along with his trademark power. When Brynn takes these moments to read the game, he is simply unstoppable. His work behind the stumps on some particularly long days was

also admirable while his positivity and humour made him a pleasure to play with.

Henry Rogers. A young UK overseas and unknown quantity initially, the quiet Henry Rogers endeared himself to many during his stay and didn't take long to impress with the bat, scoring two hundreds in his first three games. He would go on to have an incredible season for Manly both in 2nd Grade and in PG's, where he was awarded Player of the Final for a match-winning 80. His bowling exploits saw him earn the moniker 'Golden Arm' due to his uncanny ability to snare a wicket or two when we really needed it. His reserved manner belied a quality sense of humour that emerged more and more. Henry was an integral part of our team both on and off the field this season. An incredibly skillful timer of the ball with the ability to hit boundaries literally anywhere, I can't wait to see where his cricket takes him.

Lachlan Coyte. Lach was in the unenviable position of bouncing between teams again at times this year, one of the somewhat inevitable realities of playing at a strong Club with multiple representative players. His century against Gordon, would-be century at Bankstown (sorry Lach), aggressive 61 in the SF against Sydney Uni and a First grade 50 against Wests all showcased his undeniable talent. Although his own high expectations sometimes lead to disappointment, season 2024/25 (546 runs @ 30.33) is one to be proud of. We hope to see him back again after a Canadian sabbatical.

Isaiah Vumbaca. Isi continued to do what he has done in 2nd grade for many years now, playing clutch innings with bat and ball when the team needs it most. Arguably one of the most versatile all-round players going around, it was again his leadership as much as his statistical contributions that stood out for us this year. An incredible asset to us, and with a hunger to win that is as infectious as it is fierce, no game is over while Isaiah has the bat or ball in hand. Isi was one of a number of senior members of this 2's dynasty whose leadership was invaluable for me this year and was key to our success. Thank you.

Zach Trewartha. It's fair to say that Zach came into his own this year in a way that those closest to him had never doubted. Whether it was with bat, ball or in the field Zach found a way to contribute and throughout the season took the game into his own hands on multiple occasions. Most notably with the ball at Blacktown (at short notice) and in First Grade out at

Matthew Sunshine. Matt had a breakout year for us in 2's, going from strength to strength and earning a well-deserved First grade debut. His hunger to compete and leave nothing on the field was and will continue to be key to his success, while his openness to feedback and working on his game saw him learn the control, discipline and patience that saw him become a force to be reckoned with in both 1st and 2nd Grade. Critical to his success was a perspective shift sometime after a match-winning bowling performance against Easts, where he began seeing value in consistency, skill execution and partnership bowling rather than using wickets as his sole indicator of success. Another of our awfully ill-timed injuries, we missed Matt come finals and can't wait to see him pick up next year where he left off.

Roopmehar Dhillon. Five five-fas. It's as much of a mouthful as Roop was a handful this year in 2nd grade, and for entire spells he was simply unplayable. His bowling this year combined with a PG's Premiership and a First grade debut and it's becoming clear that Roop is really starting to kick into gear with his cricket. It only gets tougher in the upper echelons of representative cricket, but this season has shown that Roop has what it takes and everything is there for him if he wants it. Roop learnt a lot this year including how to work lefties over, bowl long spells and through tricky moments, however the final step to cementing himself at the next level can only come when he's ready to lead in the field and with the bat like he did for us with the ball. Excited to see him take the next step next season.

Joshua Lawson. Josh bowled incredibly well from his first game with us at Grahams and was unlucky that with returning players, an injury, the T20 drubbing at Sydney Uni and some washouts he didn't get another real opportunity until the second T20 against Wests. His flawless opening spell of 1/17 off 4, then a match-winning 6-fa against North Sydney announced that he was ready to seize the openings forming from our injury woes. His PG's success and consistent performances in 3's and 2's meant that he thoroughly deserved the First

grade debut he received before a strong finals campaign with us. One of the most gracious, hardworking and selfless cricketers at Manly, if he continues to learn and hone his craft next season a long First grade career awaits.

Julian Osbourne. Another of our burgeoning fast bowling talents, Julian had a meteoric rise this year following great success in PG's, 3rd grade, 2nd grade and age representative fixtures. Playing a 5th grade GF in April 2024 to then make a 2nd grade debut in December is almost unheard of. With bucketloads of talent, ability to bowl wicket-taking balls and a competitive hunger beyond his years, the next step for Jules will be to continue learning his craft and instilling his bowling with the patience and discipline needed to succeed in 2's and beyond. Exciting years ahead.

Matt Brewster. Brewy was incredible for us, returning from injury to find form at crucial times and bringing his class, experience and a level head to a team that saw injuries force multiple changes leading into finals. Matt continues to grow in both his leadership skills, batting ability and all-round cricketing intelligence. With his now-trademark tenacity, literacy and hunger for runs I look forward to watching his return next season after a strong UK season. Matt is the perfect example of how a person and a cricketer can evolve through sheer hard work and a desire to learn and improve. Matt was one of a number of senior members of this 2's dynasty whose leadership was invaluable for me this year and was key to our success. Thank you.

Josh Wigney. Similar to Brewy, Wigs was incredible for us when we needed him. Despite having a slightly disrupted season and nursing occasional minor tweaks, Josh brought class, experience, humility and selflessness to a team that injuries had forced some late changes to in the lead up to finals. A workhorse and team player who always gives his all, Josh is an asset to any team and whenever available for a full season will always push for higher honours.

Lachlan Trewartha. Lach was the pick of our bowlers from his very first ball this season, and provided great control and consistency in our one-day games all year. With 2-day cricket emerging later into the season, carrying 3 spinners became impractical, however losing him was a huge loss. His energy and leadership in the field, enthusiasm to contribute and ability to stand up at crucial times with the bat – top scoring for us against St George on a spicy deck and single-handedly dragging 3rd grade over the line and into the finals series in

Round 16 – were just two of many achievements that he should be incredibly proud of this year. An entertaining but deceptively kind and thoughtful team player it's safe to say there aren't many tailenders who have improved and scored as many clutch runs as LT has in recent seasons. Wherever he plays next year, his on-field leadership and all-round skills will see him a strong contributor.

Joshua Coyte. Josh came into the side late in the season off the back of an incredible 3rd grade T20 ton and some consistent highly disciplined bowling. His maiden (unbeaten) 2's fifty to dig us out of trouble against North Sydney and then his bowling at Bankstown, dragging us back into the game with sheer consistency and control were two particular highlights. He has great insight into his own game and how to contribute to the team, while his positivity and energy in the field made him a dream to captain. The definition of a team player with a big heart and plenty of skill.

Sam Hole. Club favourite and nominal 3rd grade skipper, Sam played a big role in 2's this year and was unfortunate to not play more games with us. Sam played some stoic knocks, particularly against Blacktown and Bankstown, demonstrating that there is no doubt that he has what it takes to be a 2nd grade opener. With at least one opener not returning, the door is wide open for Sam to make his mark on the 2nd grade competition next season. Sam's experience, leadership and competitiveness has been huge in building the culture of success that has been endemic to 3rd grade and 2nd grade for many years and many, including myself, think he still has plenty to offer.

Evan Dunnachie. Although starting the season on the fringe of the team, Evan forced his way back into 2's following strong performances with the bat in 3rd grade. Although a combination of circumstance, T20 fixtures and batting order limited his opportunities, further work on strengthening his fielding, understanding his game to improve consistency and preparing to capitalise on every opportunity will no doubt see him return to 2's. Evan's skills and dynamism with the bat and versatility with the ball means that he is always in the mix, while his positivity and maturity make him an excellent teammate and he was a big part of the success of 3's this year.

Michael Counsell. Mick has been one of Manly's most loyal clubmen over many years, however 2024/25 was a tough season. Despite showing glimpses of his best with the ball against Easts and a strong all-round

performance (including co-top scorer) against St George, work and other issues prevented him from reaching his best. We hope to see Mick wind back the clock and channel his success from last season where he made a long-awaited First grade debut.

Ryan Farrell. Ryan “the Barrell” Farrell is just a classy cricketer. A walk-in to any 1st grade team when fit, he brought us a wealth of experience and a great sense of calm, however his work commitments limited his availability. We were lucky to have him for a number of rounds this year, during which time he contributed a patient, textbook hundred against Mosman before finishing with a match-winning, Glenn Maxwell-like batting performance in the second T20 match (where he sustained a hamstring tear that ruled him out for the rest of the season).

Nicholas Toohey. The tantalising prospect of a fit Nick Toohey was once again close this season, however we were devastated to see injury strike again. We feel for you Nick. The resilience you’ve shown to continue through these past few seasons has been an inspiration and you have our full support. We can’t wait to have you back again.

Reuben Kapoor. Reuben filled in for us on a couple of occasions this year and was such an asset. A highly intelligent and insightful cricketer, Reuben showed technical prowess with bat and glovework redolent of a young Sam Webber, and played a key role in the PG’s Premiership. I look forward to seeing him put together the big scores that he is more than capable of.

Brodie McDowell. Brodie also filled in for us as gloveman early in the season, as well as assisting us at crucial moments off the field in our Grand final. A hard-hitting batter who is merciless like no other in the face of bad bowling, Brodie is not far away from turning the corner on his batting. Continued work on maintaining composure at the crease and turning over the strike to avoid the build-up of pressure are the only things standing between him and some very big scores and swift movement up the grades. A great clubman and raw cricketing talent that I look forward to seeing develop further next season.

Oliver Melville. Although Ollie may be disappointed with some parts of his season, he should hold his head high – his selflessness and work ethic both on and off the field has seen him establish himself as a future leader at the Club, and one who thoroughly earned his call-up to 2’s this year. With greater patience and composure at the crease and work on understanding his game, there is no doubt that Ollie can make some big scores and make the case for a spot in the middle order of any 2’s team.

Joel Davies. In a weird quirk of scheduling, Joel was unable to make it out to Dubbo to play 1st grade due to commitments with the Sydney Sixers, so took the field with us against Sydney Uni. Although currently unconfirmed, Joel may be the first male player to be dropped from Big Bash to 2nd grade. I hold Joel personally and solely responsible for this – our biggest loss of the year – against eventual Minor premiers Sydney University. Jokes aside, it was a rare treat having Joel play alongside us and share his insights with me and the team, especially around field settings and other features of the T20 game that we had far less experience with. It was definitely part of the reason we were able to win our next T20.

Andrew Boulton. We only had Boults very briefly this year before higher honours came calling, however he showed his class, top-scoring for us in Round 1. Having seen him play since age 12, Andrew is an immensely talented, genuine all-rounder capable of playing at the highest level. I look forward to seeing him build the big innings he is capable of and winning games for 1st grade.

To every single person who played 2’s with us this year, thank you. Our success belongs to all of you. And to those who fought with us in the toughest times, especially post-Christmas and into finals, thank you for being part of an unforgettable season. Bring on next season.

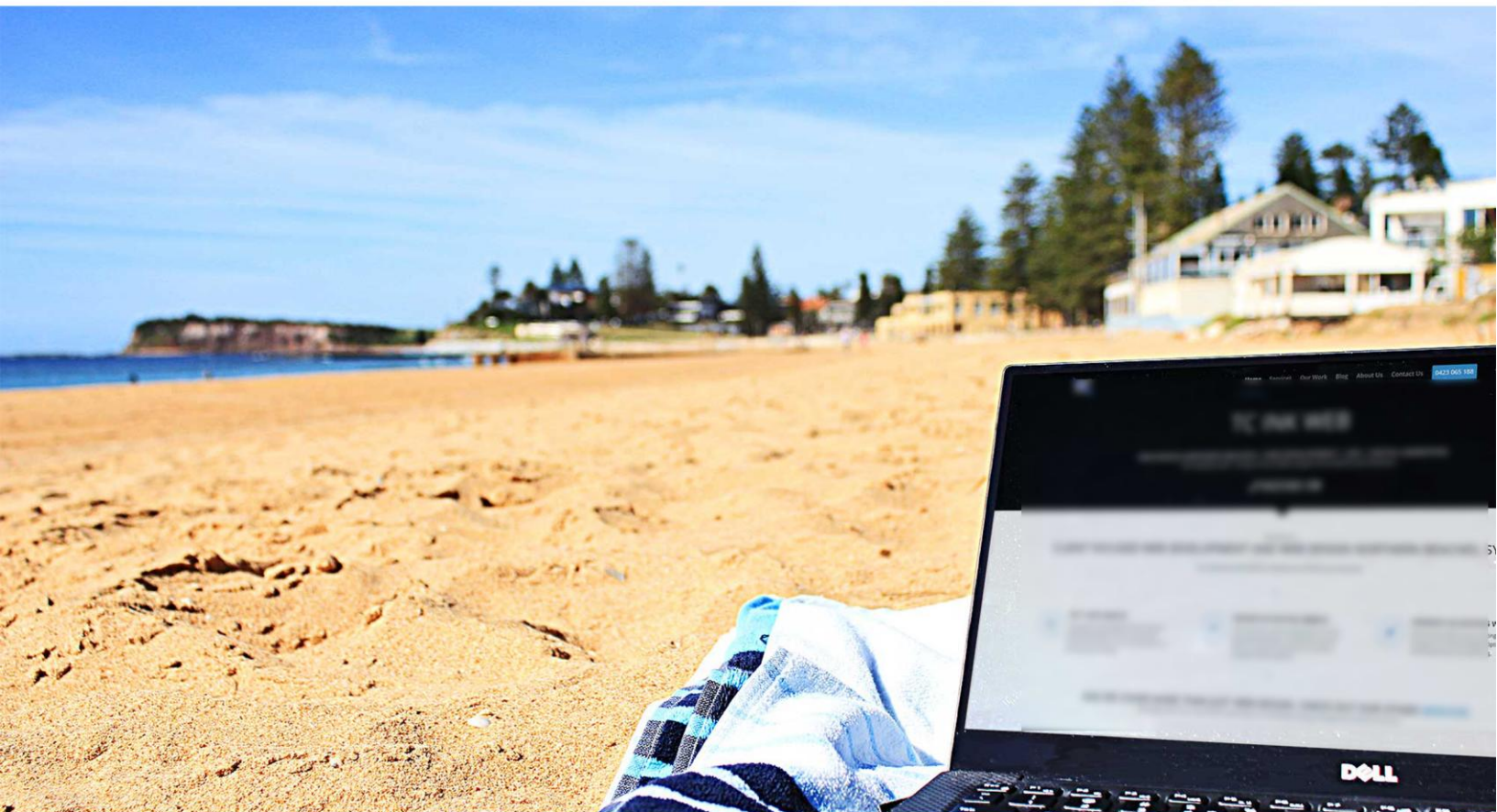

2024/25 was a season marked by big moments, narrow margins, and a side that consistently refused to go away quietly. From the very first round, where Ruben Kapoor's composed 44* and Sam Hole's five-wicket haul set the tone, it was clear this was a group with belief and ambition. And while the script didn't end in silverware, it certainly featured drama, brilliance, and no shortage of memorable cricket.

We proved our mettle against the competition's best – toppling Sydney Uni, Randwick, Gordon and Mosman with disciplined, fearless cricket. These weren't flukes – they were hard-fought wins led by players rising to the occasion. One of the standout performances came in the T20 competition, where Josh Coyte lit up Manly Oval with a jaw-dropping 121* off 57 balls, including 10 sixes. It was one of many incredible efforts that defined our character this season.

There were, of course, games that slipped away. Losses to sides like Blacktown and North Sydney hurt, and a draw against Bankstown where we couldn't quite finish the job, reminded us that clinical execution is what separates contenders from champions.

Injuries, unavailabilities, and some ordinary weather in the middle rounds tested our depth and momentum. Still, we found heroes in key moments. Josh Cooper and Evan Dunnachie clawed back multiple match-saving partnerships, each producing a pivotal century that anchored our season – innings that steadied shaky starts and turned pressure into dominance. Julian Osbourne delivered not one, but two six-wicket hauls. And in a season-defining moment in Round 16, Julian and Lachlan Trewartha combined for a last-wicket, 40-run partnership to steal an unlikely win from Campbelltown and punch our ticket to the finals.

Once we got there – into the Qualifying Finals for the third straight season – we faced a bit of a reality check against a clinical, higher-placed St George outfit, who posted a daunting 400, ultimately ending our season. But it wasn't all doom and gloom. One of the Club's emerging young prospects, Kai Croft, produced a

sensational all-round performance: 4/66 off 26.2 overs with the ball, followed by a sublime 101 off 107 with the bat.

We finished 5th on the ladder with 57 points, and 9 wins from 16 matches – an effort that reflects both the quality and the depth of this squad, but also the room to take the next step as a squad, in being next season's contenders for the title.

It has been a privilege to captain 3's this season, and I want to thank Roy, Jay, and Sammy Hole for their support and trust to do so. 2024/25 will be remembered not just for our place in the Qualifying finals, but for the evolution of a younger squad, a group of players relatively new to the grade, finding their identity and voice. By season's end, the camaraderie and maturity in this team were evident both on and off the field.

Thanks to the 30+ players who contributed this year, whether you played one game or the whole season, thank you for being part of something special. To the coaches, committee and volunteers who give their time every week, and every parent and supporter who makes the Manly spirit what it is, THANK YOU.

A big thank you also to our Chairman of Selectors, Andrew Jamieson, for your tireless efforts behind the scenes throughout the season. Your willingness to step in and lead the side when I was unavailable – especially during one of the toughest weeks for player availability – was a testament to your experience and unwavering commitment. Your leadership remains a vital asset to this group.

To our Grahams Reserve ground manager, Will Gustafson, thank you once again for another season of tireless, selfless volunteering. From running drinks and setting up teas to sweeping change rooms and lifting team morale, your efforts never go unnoticed. It wasn't quite the same without you at the start of the season, and having you back around the group brought a real

lift. Thanks for everything Willy G, and for putting up with all the chaos that comes with 3rd Grade cricket.

To Sam Hole – mate, we’ve played a lot of cricket together over the years, and to be given the opportunity to take the reins of what’s essentially been your side for the past few seasons was genuinely a privilege. Your leadership, whether wearing the captain’s armband or not, is something all of our younger players should aspire to. I’m incredibly grateful for your support – whether it was helping with the big decisions or simply backing me to lead in my own way. At the start of the season, I wasn’t sure how much I’d enjoy the year as a player, but being able to lead from the front, connect with the next wave of talent at the Club, and help shape not just a strong cricketing group but a great bunch of young men – it’s been more rewarding than I could’ve imagined... so thank you.

Josh Cooper. The 3rd Grade Batting Award winner and deservedly so. Josh was the consistent rock of the middle and lower order throughout the season. His ability to steady the ship and rescue our innings time and again (including his magnificent 115* in Round 15) proved invaluable.

Michael Counsell. Our seasoned quick endured a tougher season than expected. Still, there were flashes of his best – most notably against Randwick and during his fiery opening spell in the Qualifying final, where we very nearly ran him into the ground by day's end.

Josh Coyte. Enjoyed a strong all-round season, particularly with the ball, where his improved consistency earned him a well-deserved call-up to 2nd Grade after Christmas. His explosive 121 in the T20 was nothing short of extraordinary – one of the finest innings I’ve witnessed.

Kai Croft. Had a breakout end to the season and is shaping into a real prospect for higher grades. His sublime all-round effort in the final – taking 4 wickets and scoring a hundred – underlined his potential to be a long-term club asset.

George Cumming. Had a breakout season with both bat and ball. Consecutive five-wicket hauls earned him a spot in 3rd Grade, and he made the most of the opportunity. I’m excited to see George continue his form into next year and push for higher grades.

Evan Dunnachie. Another terrific year for Evan, who was instrumental with both bat and ball. His 101 and

multiple game-saving partnerships, kept us in the fight all season. His consistency also earned him several well-deserved appearances in 2nd Grade.

Sam Hole. Last year's skipper stepped away from the captaincy to focus on higher grades and spent most of the year in 2's. A 5fa in Round 1 and meaningful contributions with the bat provided a steady presence around the group. I really appreciated his support and guidance throughout the season.

Ruben Kapoor. A great addition to the side this season, sharp with the gloves (his leg-side stumping off Coyte stands out) and composed at the crease. He played several important knocks, including 44 in Rd 1, 60 in Rd 3, and 40 in Rd 13, providing much-needed stability and class at the top of the order. While the season may not have finished quite how he’d hoped, there’s plenty to be excited about heading into next year.

Jack Melchior. A significant season for Jack as he continued to push for a regular opening spot in 3's. He had several standout moments that showed why he’s well suited to the role – most notably his composed 50 in Rd 4. His consistently safe hands in the cordon were a real asset throughout the season, highlighted by four sharp catches in Rd 5 that helped secure a vital win.

Oliver Melville. Ollie was a key on-field leader who brought energy and determination to the group, consistently lifting the team when it was needed most. Played a crucial role with the bat, scoring a vital 64 in Rd 4 and 41 in Rd 5 to help steady the innings. In the field, he applied constant pressure and took five or more catches off Osbourne’s slower ball across the season.

Julian Osbourne. An exciting fast bowling prospect with a lot of potential to make a big impact next season and push up the grades. He claimed two impressive 6-wicket hauls (in Rounds 3 and 16), whilst also contributing to the match-winning 10th-wicket partnership with L. Trewartha for 40 runs, securing our spot in the finals.

Will Skinner. While he showed flashes of brilliance throughout the year (3fa's in Rd 13 & 15), that big performance evaded. Despite the ups and downs, Will’s work ethic, toughness, and character stood out, and I’m excited to see him improve on this season and emerge as a key part of our attack next year.

Lachlan Trewartha. Faced a challenging first half of the year in 2's, without having much of a bowl. He did, however, produce the moment of the season along with Julian Osbourne. Hitting an unforgettable 40-run last wicket partnership to win the game and secure finals cricket. While it wasn't the season he would have hoped for, I know what he's capable of with the ball and fully expect him to bounce back next year.

Josh Wigney. An invaluable presence and leader within the group, always offering guidance to our fast bowlers whenever he played. A fierce competitor, he made key contributions throughout the season, including a five-wicket haul in Rd 2 and hitting the match-winning six in Rd 5, a personal highlight. Always dependable with the ball, he consistently bowled tight, pressure-filled overs and never shied away from the challenge.

Finally, a big congratulations to 4th Grade and Adam Parkinson. Great to see you claim the trophy, and a big thank you for putting up with my ever changing selections on a Thursday! Also to Joel and the PG's boys for bringing the trophy back to Manly after a long hiatus.

Although it wasn't a season crowned with glory, I couldn't be prouder of the playing group. The foundation has been laid – now it's up to us to go one step further next season.

The 5th grade season of 2024/25 started with a wash out. A massive anti-climax in attempting to win back-to-back Premierships. We made a big statement in Round 2, putting on 325 against Blacktown in a one dayer – the biggest 5th grade one day score I have certainly seen.

With more one dayers and the two T20s this year, there was less opportunity to pick up the big bonus points of an outright win. We were 1 wicket (or one umpiring decision to be honest) away from an outright against Penrith and 4 wickets away against Mosman, so at the halfway stage, we were undefeated but still in second position to Parramatta. After our massive battles with them last year, the stage was set for a top of the table clash in Round 9. It was not to be as rain put a massive dampener on proceedings except that it allowed for a challenging game of tape ball cricket in the open air changerooms.

The rest of the season charged on with numerous big wins, but Parramatta always stayed on top of the table until they choked in rounds 13 and 14 to hand us the Minor Premiership. Having gone through the rounds undefeated we were fairly confident heading into the finals. Then we scored 375 batting first in the Qualifying final and that confidence only grew.

It wasn't meant to be, however. St George came out in the Semi final with a point to prove. They were the only team to give us a good contest in the rounds (I am sure the Parramatta match would have been a good one if not for the rain) and they were stronger this time around. Maybe I should have bowled first in the overcast conditions, but the wicket was the same one we scored 375 on the week before. It's all history now however, and we can only look forward to next season.

Apart from the absolute quality of batting and bowling in this team each week, it was the general fielding standard of the team that set us apart from our opposition. Normally in 5th grade there are a couple of talented young athletes coming through who are quick with good arms, but there are always some weak links that I need to hide. This year was quite different. I could comfortably put anyone in almost any position and

know they would take the catch, cut off a run or hit the stumps for a run out. This is a testament to our current coaches and our pathway to have guys so well equipped for grade cricket.

I thoroughly enjoyed this season and it was great to see the improvement in all our players throughout the year. These improvements are obviously due to the big efforts of the players themselves, but also thanks to Roy and our fabulous team of coaches, and a massive thanks to legend Doug McGrath. His contribution and efforts in assisting 5th grade and mentoring these young men has been invaluable. Doug is a massive asset to me at training and on game day. Even a major back operation couldn't keep him away.

I was also lucky to have other leaders in the playing group like Reiley Dunlop, Chris Halloran and Jordan Brewster. Special thanks to Reiley who captained the team for a few rounds in my absence.

Andrew Jamieson did a fantastic job in his debut year as Chairman of Selectors. Amazing restraint not to put on the whites and resist pressure from all involved to fill a spot himself. Our pathway program is the envy of many clubs so thanks to Kev Davies, David Gainsford and Chris Melville to help maintain the smooth transition of players and ensure our new players are all ready for the step up to Manly's 5th grade.

The following players enjoyed 5 or more games in 5th grade this season.

Reiley Dunlop. Compared to previous years, Reiley had a fairly lean season with the bat, but he more than made up for that with his keeping and leadership. Reiley went next level this year with the gloves and showed that he could easily keep in higher grades by topping the 5th grade comp for dismissals and breaking the Club record for good measure. It's just unlucky timing that we have a lot of good keepers who are also scoring a lot of runs in the Club. Reiley also adds great leadership and experience to this team and did a great job leading the team as captain while I was away.

Jordan Brewster. Jordy had a great year with both bat and ball. Always keen to bat and bowl in any situation. A captain's dream. Jordy played some solid innings in the middle order, but had quite limited opportunity given the strength of our batting line up each week. He did even better with the ball, finishing as our leading wicket taker with 27 wickets at 12.89, and he did all this while doing the hard yards bowling uphill or into the wind and sometimes coming on with set batters at the crease when needing a breakthrough. I could tell Jordy enjoyed this season and took more of a leadership role among the group.

Lukas Overhoff. Lukas backed up his big 2023/24 with another mountain of runs for us in 5's. He wasn't able to capitalise on a couple of opportunities in 4's this year, but that will come. He was our leading run scorer and appeared almost contemptuous in the way he dispatched many a 5th grade bowler. I know that's not his nature, but he does look to be doing it so easy sometimes. It is a pleasure to watch. Not many bowling opportunities this year but he is also one of our weapons in the field.

Jack Donnan. Jack had a much improved year with the bat, scoring 400 runs for the season. Opening up the innings isn't the easiest place to bat but he was one of our most consistent performers ensuring we always got off to a good start. I feel if Jack can break through the 60s and 70s to put on a big hundred then many more hundreds will flow. His off spinners continue to impress with limited opportunity. I only managed to bowl him 58 overs but he still managed to take 12 wickets at 11.8. Another one of our great fielders too.

Adam Searle. We welcomed Searley from the UK and I honestly thought he would be moving up the grades quickly. He has some serious talent. As it happened, we managed to enjoy his company longer than expected until his promotion to 4's finally came. I think Searley learned a lot from his first year in Australia and started to adapt quite well to the different conditions. His previous experience showed that he is a very good one-day bowler and it was great to see him adapt as required to bowl more for wickets when required. Big talent with the bat as well. He showed he was capable of hitting some massive bombs back over the bowler's head but also was able to put his head down when needed. Congrats Searley on a great first year and winning the Players Player award.

Bill Martin. Bill started the year as a bat while he was returning from back issues and made a big statement

by scoring a hundred in his 3rd innings. His consistency might have been affected by me moving him around the order so much, but such are his talents that he could play many different roles. As he got back into bowling he troubled a lot of 5th grade batters and will continue to do so. A great all round season from Bill to start off his grade career. I look forward to seeing more.

Keelan Mendel. Keelan has had a taste of higher grades and he is definitely much better than 5th grade. He scored 531 runs for the season across all grades which is a really good season, but it just shows what you need to do to hold onto those higher grade positions. I had so many bowling options and couldn't give Keelan the ball, but I do rate Keelan's bowling as he always attacks the stumps. And also another of our absolute weapons in the field.

Chris Halloran. Chris definitely put on a yard of pace compared to last year, which is a tribute to the work he has done. It is interesting though that some of his best bowling spells were when he backed off a touch and just tried to bowl good areas. Can't wait to see what next year brings. Like last year, not many opportunities with the bat but his checked drive 6 is still probably being talked about. It is a real asset to have Chris at mid-off or mid-on helping our young fast bowlers through their spells and putting a good polish on the ball.

Luke Watts. Luke is another talented Manly player who fell victim to circumstances outside his control. He is a much better batter than his season total suggests. It is interesting though, that apart from a couple of run outs, bowlers were only able to get him out 6 times in 16 innings. It seemed that the match situations were generally such that every time Luke got a start, the innings ended and he was left not out. Luke had some injury issues with his bowling so was never able to get the volume in to achieve his normal consistency. Stay patient Luke. I know with your work ethic, the big scores and wickets will come.

Liam Dinan. Liam had a breakthrough season with the bat and finally put together a couple of big scores of which we knew he was capable. He can play every shot in the book and he has the temperament to bat time. Now he has worked out how to pace an innings and tick the scoreboard over when needed. It is sometimes the most difficult thing to find the right gear, or to be able to go up and down the gears through an innings when needed. Looking forward to seeing Liam score many more hundreds. Adding Liam to the already strong slips cordon also paid dividends.

Zach Buchanan. Zac was probably our most economical bowler. Ever reliable. Opening opposition bats were unable to score from his relentless pressure and they eventually nicked off or got out up the other end. Congrats on a solid first season of grade cricket. It was unfortunate that a knee injury meant his season finished a few games early. Zac was only required to bat twice this year but his 9* in a last wicket partnership of 34 against St George was crucial in setting up a total for our win in a rain affected game.

Toby Seward. Toby was a great asset to the team. I felt like a big score was always not far away. He brought such a positive attitude and energy to the team and to the field every week. Another great fielder to have in our team, but I am sure he will be happy to put this season behind him with respect to runs scored. He is definitely capable of succeeding at this level.

Nathan Pryke. Pryke had a solid start to his grade career after making the big move to the city. A great team player who always helped out whenever work needed doing. In his first few games, he was bowling higher grade lengths and became frustrated by the constant plays and misses but when he started bowling fuller the lower grade wickets started coming. Bowls good shape at a good pace and was too good for most 5th grade bats. Very talented striker with the bat as well.

Thomas Walker. Tom joined us mid-season after he had finished terrorizing the Green Shield opposition batters. He very quickly showed us he had the heart of a lion and could bowl fast and straight. He made an immediate impact and despite some setbacks with some minor niggles, he ended up our second leading

wicket taker. Looking forward to watching his progression next season.

Will Matheson. Will started the season in 4's but came back down to 5's in round 3 and then bowled some of the best spells I have ever seen him bowl. He took 13 wickets in 4 games and was on fire. But as fate would have it, he had a recurrence of a back injury that put an unfortunate end to his season.

There were also players who played less than 5 games in 5th grade this year, but despite only playing a few games they all made a valued contribution to us this season. I can't believe we only had 22 players play 5's this year. That number is usually in the 30s or 40s. These players are: **Axel Karlsson-Lacy, Robbie Tipton, Harry Kershler, Matthew Melville, Alfie Gatehouse, Josh Seward.**

The energy and spirit of the team throughout the year made it a pleasure to be captain and I am very grateful for the effort, support and enthusiasm of the players, coaches, sponsors and supporters.

Special thanks to Frase, Steve, Gains and the whole Board. The Club's success is largely thanks to your huge efforts behind the scenes.

Congratulations to all the other captains on a successful year with special mention to Parko and Joel Davies and their teams for their Premierships in 4's and PG's and also to everyone involved for a great 2024/25 season.

A season of so close, yet so far, for the Women's Second grade this year. We had over 25 players take the field with us this season, and I'd like to thank each and every one of them for contributing to what has been such an enjoyable year. We've got an incredibly talented and young side, with our average age most weeks sitting below 18, which bodes extremely well for the future.

A huge thank you to our coach Mechelle for the countless hours she gives up, and for being a great sounding board to me throughout the season. I'd like to thank the Board, Dunc, Ross, all our other Coaches and Physios for all their effort and dedication to the Club. To our manager, Cameille, and to all the parents who helped set up, score, and drive their daughters around, thank you. This Club wouldn't thrive without you, and we're so grateful for your continued support.

We started the season with two T20s, bowling first in both games and restricting the opposition to chaseable scores, but we just couldn't build enough partnerships to achieve the wins. Our first 50-over game against North Sydney saw us bat first for the first time in the season, with regular wickets falling we finished with a sub-par score of 150. Despite the opposition achieving our runs in the 44th over, this would be a turning point for our season, as we demonstrated our resilience and talent in the field to take the game that deep.

Our first win came in Round 4 against Penrith. Batting first we scored a very respectable 252 runs from our 50 overs, with 7 of our players scoring over 20 during the innings. 53 runs from Mia N, 42 from Ari, and 4 wickets for Lara Hughes were the highlights. Back then to T20s, where we had a convincing win against Greater Hunter thanks to a 5fa from Kaya, and then bowled out North Sydney for 67 the following week.

More One-Day games followed, as we scored 205/7 against St George before bowling them out for 78, with Sally claiming 4 wickets and Ari scoring 56*. Another win against Parramatta saw Lizzie scoring a sensational 88, as we bowled them out for 97 with Lara taking 4fa.

Another T20 versus Bankstown saw them bowled out for 61, with Lara claiming yet another 5 wickets, before

it was back to a One-Day game once again, as we bowled Sydney University out for 139, followed by a record breaking 141-run partnership between Gabby and Charlotte Croll to win in just the 19th over. Another dominant T20 display against Penrith saw us sitting in 2nd place in the league by the Christmas break.

Our first game back after Christmas saw us face first-placed Sydney in a T20 at Drummoyne Oval, where we scored a fairly weak 92/9. Despite Ari taking a wicket from the first ball of the innings, Sydney were off to a great start and looked likely to chase down our target with time to spare. Some amazing death bowling though, including 4 overs for 7 runs from Mia N, saw us take the game to a Super over. With smart fielding and excellent bowling, we restricted Sydney to 2/2 in the Super over and knocked off the runs in just two balls!

One-Day wins over Campbelltown, with another 4 wickets to Mia N, Gordon with 59 runs to Steph Hughes and 4 wickets for Eve Burke, had us moving between 2nd and 3rd on the very congested table. A tight loss against Greater Hunter in Round 15 however, followed by another loss the week after to Bankstown, meant that despite our 11 game winning streak, our next two games were must wins in order to qualify for finals.

Sydney then beat us on the last ball at Manly Oval, despite our best bowling performance of the season, we just unfortunately let ourselves down with the bat. A convincing win in our last round game against Northern District wasn't enough though, and we ended the season in fifth place, ever so narrowly missing out on the finals.

As the season went on though, it became clear just how much the girls had developed, not only with their skills, but with their resilience as well. Plus, a growing understanding that at Manly, we're not just playing for ourselves, but for our team first & foremost. Exciting times ahead for this wonderful group of girls!

Charley Camburn. Charley anchored the innings at the top of the order, providing consistency and calmness under pressure. She was quick between the wickets and formed the backbone of many innings for us. In the

field, she was exceptional on the boundary, taking several game-changing catches.

Steph Hughes. Steph batted in the top order and played with increasing confidence and intent this season. 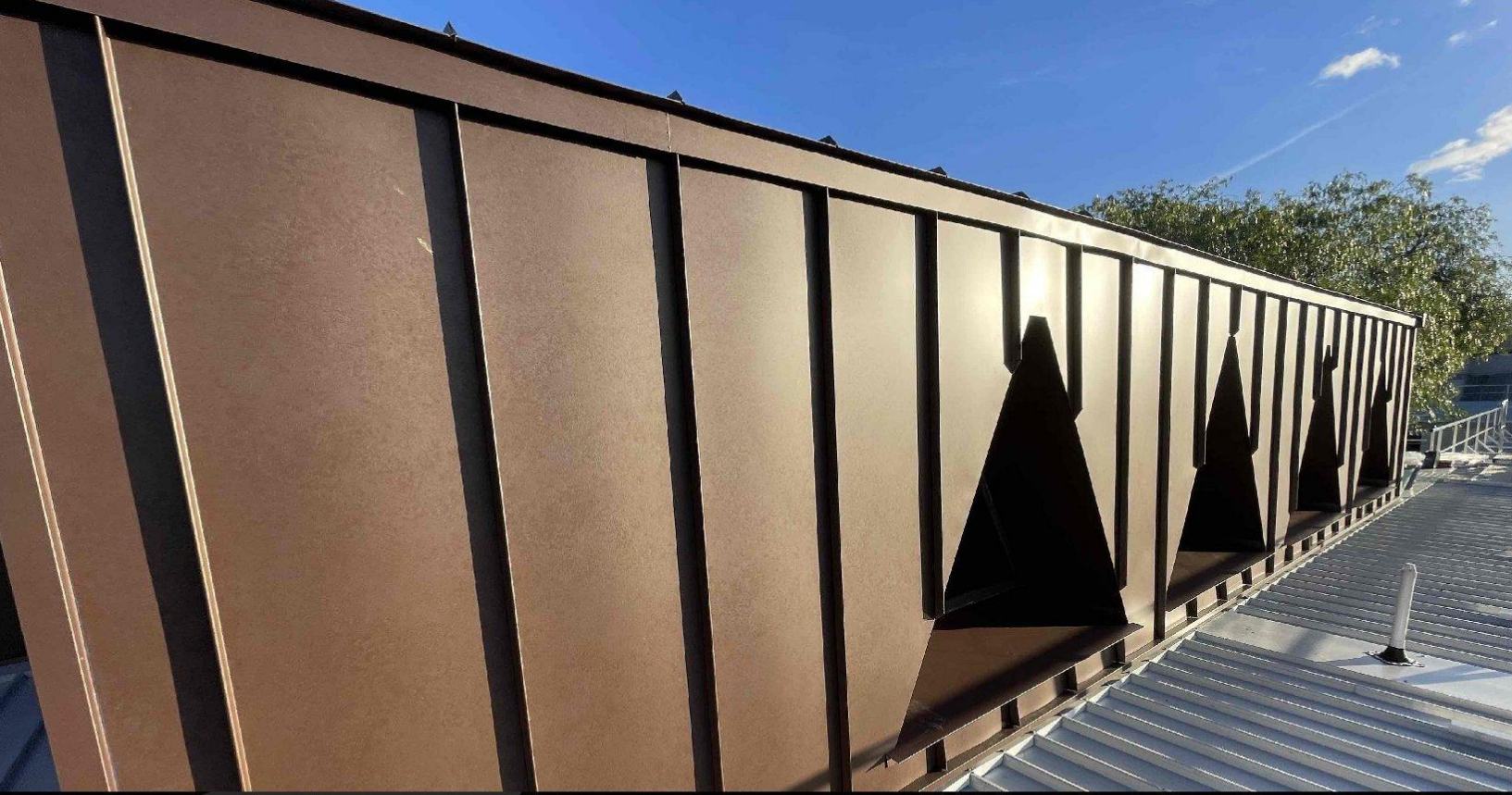

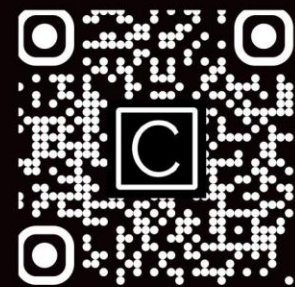
